### HOUSE RESOLUTIONS

WHEREAS, Safety is the highest priority for the streets and highways of our State; and

WHEREAS, The great State of Illinois is proud to be a national leader in motorcycle safety, education, and awareness; and

WHEREAS, Motorcycles are a common and economical means of transportation that reduces fuel consumption and road wear, and contributes in a significant way to the relief of traffic and parking congestion; and

WHEREAS, According to the Illinois Secretary of State's office, there are nearly 356,000 licensed motorcyclists in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, It is especially meaningful that the citizens of our State be aware of motorcycles on the roadways and recognize the importance of motorcycle safety; and

WHEREAS, The members of A Brotherhood Aimed Toward Education (A.B.A.T.E.) of Illinois, Inc. have promoted motorcycle safety, education, and awareness in high school drivers' education programs and to the general public in our State for more than 29 years; the group has provided motorcycle awareness presentations to more than 138,000 participants in Illinois over the past 7 years; and

WHEREAS, All motorcyclists should proudly and actively promote the safe operation of motorcycles, as well as promote motorcycle safety, education, and awareness; and

WHEREAS, The motorcyclists of Illinois have contributed extensive volunteerism and money to national and community charitable organizations; and

WHEREAS, During the month of May, all roadway users should unite in the safe sharing of roadways within and throughout the great State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that, in recognition of over 355,000 registered motorcycles statewide, over 29 years of A.B.A.T.E. of Illinois, Inc., and in recognition of the continued role Illinois serves as a leader in motorcycle safety, education, and awareness, we designate the month of May of 2016 as Motorcycle Awareness Month in the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to A.B.A.T.E. of Illinois as a symbol of our esteem and respect.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 1205

Offered by Representative Bryant:

WHEREAS, In 1984, President Ronald Reagan signed Proclamation 5187, creating "National Correctional Officers' Week"; and

WHEREAS, Each year, the first full week in May is recognized as National Correctional Officers and Employees Week, commemorating the contributions of correctional officers and personnel who work in jails, prisons, and community corrections across the country; and

WHEREAS, National Correctional Officers' Week provides a platform allowing the community to recognize correctional officers, both past and present, for the critical and difficult service they provide to the communities they serve; and

WHEREAS, The correctional system is intended to protect the public by separating violent offenders from the community, deterring others from offending, and rehabilitating offenders for reintegration into the community upon release; and

WHEREAS, Preparing offenders for their return to their communities is critical to protecting public safety; and

WHEREAS, Working in correctional facilities is demanding as personnel must maintain a constant state of heightened vigilance and adhere to strict security protocols; and

WHEREAS, Corrections staff must perform their duties within harsh physical environments and with the threat of repeated exposure to violent events; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the first full week in May as being National Correctional Officers' Week to honor the efforts of correctional officers across the State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Correctional Association as a symbol of our respect and esteem.

#### HOUSE RESOLUTION 1206

Offered by Representative Bryant:

WHEREAS, John A. Logan was born in Jackson County in what is now the City of Murphysboro on February 9, 1826; and

WHEREAS, During the course of John Logan's lifetime, he served in the Illinois General Assembly, the United States House of Representatives, and in the United States Senate; and

WHEREAS, John Logan gave a speech in Marion on August 19, 1861, after which General, and later President, Ulysses S. Grant declared that John Logan "saved Southern Illinois for the Union"; and

WHEREAS, John Logan raised the 31st Illinois Volunteer Infantry and, as Colonel, commanded it at the battles of Belmont and Fort Donelson, during which he was seriously wounded; and

WHEREAS, John Logan rose to the rank of Major General and commanded General Sherman's 15th Corps; and

WHEREAS, After the death of General McPherson, John Logan led the Army of the Tennessee to victory at the Battle of Atlanta on July 22, 1864; and

WHEREAS, John Logan's role in the victory at the Battle of Atlanta is honored by both the Atlanta Cyclorama and a grand equestrian statue in Grant Park in Chicago; and

WHEREAS, John Logan is considered by many historians to be the best of the Union's volunteer generals in the Civil War; and

WHEREAS, The General John A. Logan Museum honors one of the most noteworthy 19th century Americans, whose legacy includes modern veterans benefits, and being an early advocate of equal rights for African Americans and women - well ahead of his time; and

WHEREAS, John Logan is named, along with President Abraham Lincoln and President Ulysses S. Grant in the state song "Illinois"; and

WHEREAS, On May 5, 1868, as Commander-in-Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, John Logan issued General Order No.11, which established Memorial Day as a national holiday; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the United States Postal Service to commemorate the life of John Logan with a postage stamp to be issued in time for the 150th anniversary of Memorial Day becoming a national holiday in 2018; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to United States Postmaster General, Megan Brennan.
