### **HOUSE RESOLUTIONS**

WHEREAS, In 1997, nine area entrepreneurs came together to create the Route 66 Raceway, a state-of-the-art facility featuring a one-quarter mile drag strip and a one-half mile oval track along the historic roadway; and

WHEREAS, In 2001, due to its international popularity with fans and race enthusiasts, Route 66 Raceway was transformed to include Chicagoland Speedway, featuring a one and one-half mile, D-shaped tri-oval speedway, with the combined entities now forming the largest sports and entertainment complex in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Chicagoland Speedway and Route 66 Raceway host and execute a broad array of programming encompassing well over 100 events annually, including major motorsports entertainment, endurance events, musical concerts and festivals, industry trade shows, and corporate training seminars which combined generate an average economic impact in excess of \$150 million annually throughout the Chicagoland area; and

WHEREAS, Chicagoland Speedway is celebrating its 15th year of racing; in the last 15 years, the raceway has played host to major United States racing events, including all three NASCAR National Series and the Indy Racing League; and

WHEREAS, Chicagoland Speedway is owned by International Speedway Corporation, a major promoter of motorsports activities and entertainment programming who owns 13 of the nation's major racing venues; and

WHEREAS, Since 2011, Chicagoland Speedway has hosted the first race in the Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup, which is akin to the playoffs in the world of motorsports; and

WHEREAS, On September 15-18, 2016, Chicagoland Speedway will celebrate its 15th anniversary with a special celebration and an extended four-day race weekend for this year's Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate September 11-18, 2016 as "Chase Week" in the State of Illinois in recognition of Chicagoland Speedway's 15th season of racing; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Chicagoland Speedway and the International Speedway Corporation as a symbol of our esteem and respect and in recognition of their service to the community.

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate June 14, 2016 as "Wm. #### HOUSE RESOLUTION 1319

Offered by Representative Ford:

WHEREAS, Federal law, 28 U.S.C. 2255, provides in part that a prisoner in custody under sentence of a court established by an Act of Congress claiming the right to be released upon the ground that the sentence was imposed in violation of the Constitution or laws of the United States, or that the court was without jurisdiction to impose the sentence, or that the sentence was in excess of the maximum authorized by law or is otherwise subject to collateral attack, may move the court which imposed the sentence to vacate, set aside or correct the sentence; and

WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court held in Brady v. Maryland, 373 U.S. 83 (1963) that suppression by the prosecution of evidence favorable to an accused who has requested it violates due process if the evidence is material either to guilt or to punishment, irrespective of the good faith or bad faith of the prosecution; and

WHEREAS, Rule 16(a)(1)(E)(i) of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure provides that upon a defendant's request, the government must permit the defendant to inspect and to copy or photograph books,

papers, documents, data, photographs, tangible objects, buildings or places, or copies or portions of any of these items, if the item is within the government's possession, custody, or control and the item is material to preparing the defense or the government intends to use the item at trial; and

WHEREAS, Prosecutors continue to be found to have withheld exculpatory evidence favorable to the accused; and

WHEREAS, This results in convictions giving persons a criminal record and making it difficult for them to find a job and reconstruct a life after prison; and

WHEREAS, This abuse exists both in the federal and state criminal justice systems; and

WHEREAS, Federal post-conviction relief under 28 U.S.C. 2255 only applies to persons currently in custody; and

WHEREAS, It may be many years after a person is released from federal custody that the person discovers that the prosecutor of the case that resulted in his or her conviction withheld exculpatory evidence; and

WHEREAS, Federal post-conviction relief should be extended to a person sentenced to probation or already released from custody if the prosecutor of the case that resulted in his or her conviction withheld exculpatory evidence; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress to amend 28 U.S.C. 2255 to provide that relief is available in cases when exculpatory evidence has been withheld from a person and either the person was convicted and sentenced to probation or the person has been released from federal incarceration; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President pro tempore of the United States Senate, the Majority and Minority leaders of the United States Senate and House of Representatives, and to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 156

Offered by Representative Bennett:

WHEREAS, Ronald Wilson Reagan "Dutch" (1911-2004), the 40th President of the United States, is the only U.S. President born, raised, and educated in the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan was born on February 6, 1911 in Tampico; his family lived for a time in Chicago, Galesburg, and Monmouth, before settling in Dixon; he earned his degree in economics and sociology from Eureka College in Central Illinois in 1932; after college, he started as a radio sports announcer in the Quad Cities; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan moved to Hollywood and achieved success as a film and television actor, union president for the Screen Actors Guild, and as corporate spokesman for General Electric; he moved into politics and spent two terms as Governor of California (1967-1975) and two terms as President of the United States (1981-1989); and

WHEREAS, President Reagan returned to his home State throughout every stage of his life; he visited his birthplace, his hometown, and his alma mater, Eureka College; he never forgot his Illinois and Midwestern roots; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's connection to Illinois is celebrated all over the State; Eureka College is home to "Reagan Forward" and the Ronald W. Reagan Society, whose national membership helps fund scholarships for Reagan Fellows, a museum, a peace garden, a speaker series, a Run with Reagan 5k, and the Mark R. Shenkman Reagan Research Center, housing every book on the 40th President; Dixon is home to the Reagan Boyhood Home and the Dixon Historic Center, a riverfront statue of him on a horse, the First Christian Church where he was baptized, an annual festival, and the beach at Lowell Park where he was a lifeguard; Tampico operates a museum and historic site where visitors can stand in the apartment flat where he was born and see a statue of him as a boy; a section of Interstate 88 is named in his honor, and The Reagan Trail is a designated tourism corridor connecting key points of his Illinois experience; and

WHEREAS, President Reagan is remembered as one of the most consequential world leaders of the 20th century; his commitment to peace through strength helped in the defeat of the Soviet Union, thus ending the Cold War and bringing greater freedom to millions of people; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we recognize and honor the impact President Ronald Reagan had on the State, the country, and the world; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we request that the Architect of the Capitol place a statue of President Reagan in the Illinois State Capitol Building or on the surrounding grounds; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the statue shall be funded with private donations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Architect of the Capitol.

WHEREAS, Eugene Moore was the loving father of three children, Dowanna, Natalie, and Eric; therefore, be it
