Speaker Redmond: "The House will come to order. Members please be in their seats. We will be led in prayer this morning by the Reverend Krueger, the House Chaplain."

Reverend Krueger: "In the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost, Amen. Alfred Lord Tennyson said, 'He who's all fault, hath no fault at all.' Let us pray. Almighty God, the Father of life of whom cometh every good and perfect gift, send down, we beseech Thee, upon Thy good servants, the Members of this House of Representatives, prudence, fortitude, temperance and justice; that a like and framing policy, and in debate, they may be guided by eternal truth and right. This we ask in the name of Thy Son, Jesus Christ, Our Lord. Amen."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Shea."

Shea: "Mr. Speaker, I move that the House now stand in recess until the hour of one o'clock this day."

Speaker Redmond: "You've heard the motion. All in favor indicate by saying 'aye'....'aye'... Opposed 'no'. Stand in recess until one o'clock.....Come back and address the Chamber at one o'clock, Representative Macdonald?.....Until one. Oh! I don't know."

Clerk O'Brien: ".....Those who intend to go to the swearing in should be at the Second Street entrance of the Armory between ten and ten-thirty. Dorothy Hittmeier will be there with badges. Second Street Entrance, between ten and ten-thirty. Representatives that intend to go to the inauguration should go to the Second Street entrance of the Armory between ten and ten-thirty. Dorothy Hittmeier is there with the badges. At ten-thirty. Dorothy Hittmeier has badges. That's the Second Street entrance. The time is now ten-thirty. All Representatives that are going to the inauguration should go to the Second Street entrance of the State Armory."

WASHBURN IN CHAIR.....

Speaker Washburn: The House will be in order. The Members will



be in their seats, please. We have Messages from the Governor. Which Governor?

Clerk O'Brien: "To the Honorable Members of the 79th General Assembly. Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9 (b) of the Constitution of 1970, I hereby veto and return House Bill 4010, entitled; 'an Act to amend Section 3 of the Capital Development Bond Act of 1972'. Approved July 1, 1972 as amended. I have today approved Senate Bill 2044 which also amends Section 3 of the Capital Development Bond Act of 1972. Because House Bill 4010 makes an Amendment to the same Section, which are inconsistent with those which I have approved with Senate Bill 2044, I am hereby returning House Bill 4010 to prevent inconsistent Legislation. Sincerely, Daniel Walker. Speaker Washburn: "We all knew there would be some changes with the new administration that was sworn in at eleven o'clock. If this is an indication of the drastic change, whether it's for better or for worse, the person that's in the Chair right now....remains to be seen. But we are going to move things along a little faster than they've been moved under the former administration and before Joe Lucco makes a motion to recess until two-thirty, I want to ask all of the Republicans to come down in this corner when we recess,



until two-thirty, if you might. Mr. Lucco....moves that the House stand in recess until two-thirty this afternoon. All in favor say 'aye'. Opposed 'no'. We're in recess.

Speaker Redmond: "Order.....Members please be in their seats."

Clerk O'Brien: "....Resolution 1116. Redmond, Shea....et al., respects the memory of the Mother of Representative James M. Houlihan."

Speaker Redmond: "Representative Shea."

Shea: "Mr. Speaker, I would ask that all Members of the Housetheir names be added to the Resolution....so I would move for the adoption of the Resolution."

Speaker Redmond: "Is there any objection?Adding all the names of all the Members. Hearing none, the names will be added. You've heard the Gentleman's Motion. The question is on the Gentleman's Motion for the adoption of the Resolution. All those in favor say 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have and the Resolution is adopted. Representative Shea."

Shea: "Mr. Speaker, I move that the House do now stand adjourned until Monday....er....until Wednesday, January 12, at the hour of 10 a.m."

Speaker Redmond: "Is there any discussion? Hearing none, the question is on the Gentleman's Motion. All those in favor say 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it. The Motion carries....The House is adjourned until Wednesday, the 12th at 10 a.m."
