94th Legislative Day

April 1, 1986

Speaker McPike: "... come to order. The House will come to order. The Members will be in their seats. The Chaplain for today will be Father Joseph Carlose, Pastor of St. Francis Catholic Church of Teutopolis, Illinois. Father Carlose is a guest of State Representative Chuck Hartke. Will the guests in the balcony please rise and join us in the invocation?"

Father Carlose: "Almighty God, we stand before You and thank You for the blessings You have bestowed upon the people of the State of Illinois. We thank You for the people gathered here. The Representatives in this chamber are here, not because of their good looks or their personalities, they are here because You have given them talents and abilities the people in their districts recognize. Lord, You know now noble and difficult their task is. Give them good physical health so they can endure their many meetings and hearings and also be visible in their districts. Give them a share in Your wisdom so they can vote for legislation that is beneficial and just to all Your people in the state, the poor and the rich, the sick and the healthy, the elderly and the youth. Lord, You are very patient with all Your children. Give these people a share in Your patience as they deal with their constituents, the constituents who not only see the whole picture as these people do. And, finally, Lord, strengthen their principles of honesty and integrity as they deal with overzealous lobbyists. These Representatives form an elite group of men and women who have high standards of principles and, at times, probably face temptations. Strengthen them to do Your work today and always. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen."

Speaker McPike: "Be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Ropp."

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Ropp - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker McPike: "Roll Call for Attendance. 113 Members answering the Roll Call, a quorum is present. Representative Piel."

Piel: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, would the record show that Representative Stange and Representative Hoffman are excused today?"

Speaker McPike: "Representative Stange and..."

Piel: "Representative Hoffman."

Speaker McPike: "Yes, thank you. Representative Greiman."

Greiman: "Mr. Speaker, would the record reflect that Representative Nash as an excused absence this morning?"

Speaker McPike: "The Lady from Lake, Representative Frederick."

Frederick: "Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, on behalf of the Township Highway Commissioners and the County Superintendents of Highways, I am asked to remind you all there is a reception this evening at 6:00 at the Hilton in the Plaza Room. We hope you'll all be there. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Clerk, read the Resolutions. Yeah. Representative Hartke in the Chair."

Speaker Hartke: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. It is indeed an honor for me today to introduce to the General Assembly some very special young people. In Teutopolis, Illinois this year for the first time in the history of the State of Illinois, and we believe in the Nation, one small school has had three state champions in one school. I present you the Teutopolis Junior High Elementary Champions, the Class A High School Girls' Champions and the Class A Boys' High School Champions. Could we please give them a hand? At this time I'd like to introduce the coaches for the team. Coach Ken Crawford from the boys'.... the boys' coach. Ken

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would like to introduce his team."

Crawford: "I would like to thank the Members of the House for having us over today. I'll introduce my boys' team very quickly. From my left, 'Keven Rulehall, Theo Hemmin, Todd Burrow, Christi Westjohn, manager, Tony Meyer, Rob Fisher, Brad Koester, Andy Meyer, Rich Hartke, assistant coach, Larry Johnson, Craig Powells, Todd Westjohn, Tim Smith, Ted Weasing, Jeff Hartick, Todd Kreger, Dennis Rulehall, Dean Hilly, Mike Donaldson and Bob Zurusny.' Thank you."

Speaker Hartke: "Coach Dennis Koester, with the girls' team, one of the best coaches and one of the biggest coaches in the State of Illinois."

Koester: "Thank you, Chuck. I also would like to thank the House of Representatives for inviting us here today. Believe me, it is an opportunity that these kids will never forget. I would like to introduce my squad members. Okay. 'Sandy Brown, Lisa Schumacher, Doris Carey, Angie Rulehall, Lynn Schumacher, Cindy Westendorf, Connie Rulehall, Kim Blummer, Lori Krome, Mary Wortman, Lori Hommin, Donna Neveri, Cindy Taily, Beth Neveri, Jenny Beckman and my two assistant coaches, Janet Leighty and Terri... or Terri Wortman'."

Speaker Hartke: "Thank you, Dennis. And now the Elementary High Coach, Scott Thomas, will introduce his squad."

Thomas: "Thank you very much. My squad includes 'Vicky Klinger, Jennifer Hoteback, Kim Baters, Donna Rulehall; Valeri Campbell - I can't see all of them, so I'm just going to have to start reading a few names. Kim Ashley, Beth Drase, Lisa Drase, Kayla Funnaman, Michelle Grunlow, Trisha Hartke, Diane Meyer, Karla Protts, Tammy Wallace, Shelly Renfrow, Amy Daters, Tanya Burrow and Angie Lutkin'. Thank you."

Speaker Hartke: "Those are the three squads. Mr. Clerk, would you read the Resolutions?"

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Clerk O'Brien: "House Joint Resolution 155, offered by Representative Hartke and O'Daniel. Whereas, the Illinois General Assembly, in a continuing effort to recognize the excellence in youth athletes throughout the state, wishes to congratulate the Teutopolis Junior High School Girls' Basketball Team for capturing the Elementary School Girls' Basketball Championship; and whereas, led and aspired by Head Coach Scott Thomas, the Lady Booties ended the season with an impressive 21 to nothing record; and whereas, on December 7 through 11, 1985... '86, the Lady Booties participated in the State Tournament at Tampico and defeated Farmington, Chicago Niles Gemini, Normal Epiphany and Canton Ingersoll. Therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the 84th General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the Senate concurring herein, that we congratulate the Teutopolis Junior Girls' Basketball Team for capturing the Illinois Elementary School Association Girls' Basketball Championship, that we commend the coaches and players for their hard work and dedication and that we express our wishes to the Lady Booties for much continued success. House Joint Resolution 156, offered by Representative Hartke. Whereas, the Wooden Shoes of Teutopolis brought home the Class A Boys' State Championship Tournament after obliterating Ohio in the title contest 82 to 45 at the Assembly Hall in Champaign on Saturday, March 8, 1986; and whereas, Coach Ken Crawford's Wooden Shoes' squad completed its trek to state by defeating Venice 75 to 73 on Tuesday, March 4 in super-sectional play at Charleston; and whereas, the Wooden Shoes have also won all of the following titles: Charleston Holiday Tournament, National Trail Tournament, National Trail Conference, Flora Class A Regional, Newton Class A Sectional, Charleston Class A Super Sectional, IHSA Class A

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State Tournament Championship, Fan and Player Participation Trophy at the 1985 Charleston Holiday Tournament. Therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the 84th General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the Senate concurring herein, that we heartily congratulate the Teutopolis Wooden Shoes Boys' Basketball Team upon winning the Class A State Basketball Championship, that we commend Coach Ken Crawford upon his inspiration and leadership and that we wish the team members equal success in all their future endeavors. Speaker McPike: "Representative Van Duyne."

Van Duyne: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We went through all the

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other procedures that are necessary to hear House Bill 2877 in Rules this afternoon except getting leave of the House. So, at this time, I'd like to suspend the appropriate rule so that House Bill 2877 can be heard in Rules this afternoon."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Van Duyne, the Chair is not aware of the Motion. Have you discussed this with the Republican side of the aisle?"

Van Duyne: "Mr. Speaker, all I want to do is have the perfunctory language said now. If there's a problem... If there's a problem, we won't hear it."
