April 8, 1986

Speaker Madigan: "The House shall come to order. The Members shall be in their chairs. We shall be led in prayer today by Father Charles Mulcrone, Pastor of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield. Father Mulcrone is a guest of Representative Michael Curran. Would the guests in the gallery please rise to join us in the invocation? Father Mulcrone."

Father Mulcrone: "Let us pray, Heavenly Father, Eternal Law Giver, we take a moment to place ourselves in Your presence to acknowledge that You are our God and we are Your people. We are grateful for this beautiful day and season of the year. We are grateful for the rich resources of our Nation and of our state. We are grateful that we are in a country where we do have rights, to have Representatives who will speak in our behalf. We are grateful, Heavenly Father, for the women and the men who assume the challenges of government. We are grateful that they employ their extensive talents in our behalf. We thank them for the sacrifices their hard work entails. Be for them a continuing inspiration that they be sensitive to the needs of the powerless, open to the sincere ideas and projects of others, magnanimous in their creative vision of our state's enormous potential, not only now, but on into the next century. And may their good work in this chamber today be of lasting value to inspire others, especially the young, to a similar dedication of their gifts. We ask this in His name. Amen."

Speaker Madigan: "We shall be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Ropp."

Ropp - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice

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for all."

Speaker Madigan: "Roll Call for Attendance. Mr. Greiman, are there any excused absences?"

Greiman: "No."

Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Piel."

Piel: "Yes, Mr. Speaker. Would the record show that Representative William Peterson is excused today?"

Speaker Madigan: "Let the record reflect that excused absence. Mr. Clerk, take the record. Let the record show that Representative DeJaegher is excused. Mr. Clerk, take the record. There will be 114 Members responding to the Attendance Roll Call, there is a quorum present. Mr. Clerk. The Chair recognizes the Gentleman from Cook, Mr. Steczo."

Steczko: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise for the purposes of an announcement. The Cities and Villages Committee which was..."

Speaker Madigan: "Ladies and Gentlemen, if you would give your attention to Mr. Steczo for the purpose of an announcement."

Steczko: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The Cities and Villages Committee which was supposed to have met this afternoon in Room 118 at 2:00 has now been moved across the street to Room C-1. So, the Cities and Villages Committee will meet this afternoon, 2:00 in Room C-1 across the street."

Speaker Madigan: "Ladies and Gentlemen, if I could have your attention, please, and would the Members please be in their chairs? Would the Members please be in their chairs? Would they please take their chairs? And could we have your attention? Mr. DeLeo, could you please sit down? We have with us today a new Member replacing former Representative Juan Soliz. Clerk O'Brien: "House Joint Resolution 165, offered by Representative McAuliffe. House Resolution 1126, McAuliffe; 1127, Keane; 1128, Keane; 1130, Matijevich - Peterson - et al; 1131, Matijevich - et al; 1132, Parcels."

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Also, Senate Joint Resolution 122, offered by Representative Ropp."

Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Giorgi."

Giorgi: "I move for the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions and Senate Joint Resolution, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker Madigan: "You have all heard the Motion. Presuming that you understood the Motion, those in favor say 'aye', those opposed say 'no'. The 'ayes' have it. The Resolutions are adopted. Resolved, by the Senate of the 84th General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the House of Representatives concurring herein, that there shall be

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submitted to the electors of this state for adoption or rejection, at the general election next occurring at least six months after the adoption of this Resolution, a proposition to amend Section 9 of Article I of the Constitution to read as follows: Section 9. Bail and Habeas Corpus. All persons shall be bailable by sufficient securities, except for the following offenses where the proof is evident or the presumption great: capital offenses; offenses for which a sentence of life imprisonment may be imposed as a consequence of conviction; and felony offenses for which a sentence of imprisonment, without conditional or revocable release, shall be imposed by law as a consequence of conviction when the court, after a hearing, determines that release of the offender would pose a real and present threat to the physical safety of any person. The privilege of the writ of habeas corpus shall not be suspended except in cases of rebellion or invasion when the public safety may require it. If the approval by the voters of this state, this Amendment shall take effect one day following the proclamation of the results of the votes on this referendum.
