Speaker Braun: "House will come to order. Members will be in their chairs. We will be led in prayer today by the Reverend Robert Sneider, pastor of the Auburn United Methodist Church. Reverend Sneider is a guest of Representative Josephine Oblinger. Will the guests in the gallery please rise for the invocation?"

Speaker McPike: "Representative Giorgi, on the Agreed Resolutions."

Giorgi: "Mr. Speaker, House Resolution 197, by Kubik, lauds the Lithuanian Independence Day. 198, by McNamara, commends Charles... Anderson, Jr. Didrickson's 199 congratulates Johnny Beans of Oak Forrest. 200, by Matijevich, recommends... commends Raymond D. Curran and Williamson's 201 recognized Elmer Conti upon his retirement, a former House Member. I move for the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions."

Speaker McPike: "Gentleman has moved for the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions. All those in favor signify by saying 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it and the Agreed Resolutions are adopted. House Joint Resolution 31. Mr. Clerk, read the Resolution."

Clerk O'Brien: "House Joint Resolution #31, resolved by the House of Representatives of the 84th General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the Senate concurring herein, that when both Houses adjourn on Friday, April 12, 1985, they stand

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adjourned until Tuesday, April 16th, 1985, at 12:00 noon."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Greiman moves the adoption of House Joint Resolution 31. All those in favor signify by saying 'aye', opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it and the Resolution is adopted. Representative Homer."

Homer: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. If it would be in order, I would ask leave of the House to table House Bill 1414."

Speaker McPike: "Are you the Chief Sponsor?"

Homer: "I'm the sole Sponsor, yes."

Speaker McPike: "Yes, the Gentleman has moved to table House Bill 1414. All those in favor signify by saying 'aye', opposed 'no'. House Bill 1414 is tabled... Day of the Calendar, Speaker's Table, Senate Joint Resolution 3. Mr. Clerk."

Clerk O'Brien: "Senate Joint Resolution 3 creates a Joint Committee on Public Utility Regulation. Rules Committee recommends 'be adopted'."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Mr. Speaker and Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, Senate Joint Resolution 3 legitimatizes the Joint Committee on Public Utility Regulation which is right about now concluding its work. So, I would move the adoption... this is agreed. Speaker Daniels... Speaker Madigan and Minority Leader Daniels are Co-sponsors. I would move the adoption and use of the Attendance Roll Call for that purpose."

Speaker McPike: "Gentleman moves for the adoption of Senate Joint Resolution #3 and asks for permission to use the Attendance Roll Call. Are there any objections? Hearing no objections, the Attendance Roll Call will be used. Senate Joint Resolution 3 is adopted. If the Chair could have your attention for a moment, we are prepared to adjourn. If the Chair could have your attention in regards to introduction of Bills. The House will be in Perfunctory

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Session this afternoon until 4:00 p. m. for the introduction of Bills. We will be in Session... Perfunctory Session tomorrow from 10:00 a. m. until 5:00 p. m. for the introduction of Bills. However, we will remain open until the LRB delivers the last Bill to us tomorrow night so that the Members should make arrangements with their staff or with their secretaries to have the Bills picked up tomorrow evening from LRB if they are available so that they can be introduced. Representative Vinson."

Vinson: "Mr. Speaker, on the same point, as I read Rule 29(b)1..."

Speaker McPike: "Would you state your question again?"

Vinson: "On the same point, as I read Rule 29(b)1, it provides that any Bill requested from LRB by March 15th or filed by April 12th can be considered in the Session without extraordinary dispensation required. And I would just like the Chair to authoritatively state that for the purpose of the new Members."

Speaker McPike: "You are absolutely correct. Further discussion? Representative Dwight Friedrich."

Friedrich: "Mr. Speaker, I would like to ask for a Republican conference in Room 118 immediately after adjournment."

Speaker McPike: "The Gentleman asks for a Republican caucus in Room 118 immediately upon adjournment. Are there any announcements? Representative Greiman, on the adjournment."

Greiman: "Yes, I move that the House now stand adjourned in accordance with the Adjournment Resolution."

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chief executive officer as provided by law. He shall have those duties and powers as provided by law and those provided by county ordinance. The President of the Cook County Board shall be elected from the county at large and shall be chief executive officer of the county. If authorized by ordinance, the person seeking election as President of the Cook County Board may also seek election as member of the Board. Each county shall elect a sheriff, a county clerk, recorder, auditor and treasurer and may elect or appoint an assessor and such other officers as provided by law or by ordinance. Each county with a population of fewer than one million inhabitants shall elect a coroner. Except as changed pursuant to this Section, elected county officers shall be elected for terms of four years at the general election as provided by law. Any office may be created or eliminated in the terms of the office and the manner of selection changed by county-wide referendum. Officers other than sheriff, county clerk, treasurer may be eliminated and the terms of office and manner of selection changed by the law. Officers other than sheriff, county clerk, treasurer, coroner, recorder, assessor and auditor may be eliminated and the terms of office and manner of selection changed by county ordinance. The county officers shall have those duties powers and functions provided by law and those provided by county ordinance. County officers shall have the duties, powers or functions derived from common law or historical precedent unless altered by law or county ordinance. The county treasurer, or the person designated to perform his function may act as treasurer of any unit of local government and any school district of his county when requested by any such unit or school district and shall know... and shall so act when required to do so by law.

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Schedule: This Amendment for Section 4 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution takes effect upon the approval by the electors of this state and the county officers affected by this Amendment shall be elected at the next regularly scheduled election of county officers.
