House will stand at ease. ... Reading of Constitutional 48  
Amendments. Senate Joint Resolution Constitutional 49  
Amendment 11. Resolved, by the Senate of the 84th 49  
General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the House of 50  
Representatives concurring herein, that there shall be 51  
submitted to the electors of the state for adoption or 52  
rejection at the general election next occurring at least 53  
six months after the adoption of this Resolution, a 54  
Proposition to amend Section 6 of Article IX of the  
Constitution to read as follows: Article IX, Section 6, 55  
Exemptions from Property Taxation. The General Assembly by 56  
law may exempt from taxation only the property of the 57  
state, units of local government and school districts and  
property used exclusively for veterans' organizations, 58  
agricultural and horticultural societies, and for school, 59  
religious, cemetery and charitable purposes. The General 60  
Assembly by law may grant homestead exemptions or rent  
credits. The loss in revenue incurred by a unit of local 61  
government as a result of the exemption from taxation of 62  
property used exclusively for veterans' organizations shall 63  
be reimbursed by the state to the unit of local government. 64  
Schedule. This Constitutional Amendment shall take effect  
upon its adoption by the electors of this state. Second 65  
Reading of the Constitutional Amendment as amended and held 66  
on Second Reading. No further business, the House now 67  
stands adjourned."
