So. hadias and Gentlemen. on page 12 on your Calendar, under the Order of Speaker's Table, appears Kouse Resolution 1139. Representative AcGannan

vou. Madam Speaker and Members of the Assembly. If I could have your attention for just a few moments. is a very important Resolution. It's a Resolution to try and help and take care of some of our forgotten ones in this state. This House Resolution 1139 creates 13 Hember House Committee on Developmental Care to evaluate quality of care being provided through various state facilities for the developmentally disabled. t o specific violations of health and safety standards that have been cited by the Illinois Department of Public Health and the Health Care Financing Administration of the Health and Human Department of The special Committee must report by the end of the year. Tae Speaker and the Minority Leader of the House appoint six Members. In addition, the Speaker will appoint the Chairman. The Committee will conduct public hearings and consult with various federal, state and local and agencies regarding the quality of state services for the developmentally disabled. First, I would like to emphasize that this should not be a partisan issue. In fact. I would encourage any and all Members to join as Cosponsors. Ţ believe that it's the time the General Assembly to conduct intensive review of state services for the developmentally disabled. He need to ensure the highest quality of care possible for such needy children Second, I believe that this study will ultimately prove beneficial for the Department of Mental Health and

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Disabilities. General Assembly oversight in Developmental this case is intended to ensure that appropriate programs . and resources are developed to improve care. By anyone's determination, this will not detract from current efforts and should assure the highest possible priority for the DMHDD program. Finally, this study is important to the state budget. Now. please listen to this, please, my fellow colleagues. Redicaid reimbursement for TDP Department o f Mental Health and Development Disabilities total more than 90 million dollars. A substantial is attributed to the care for the developmentally disabled. These funds have been put in repeated jeopardy. recently, the Health Care Financing Adminstration has cited several Illinois developmental several. centers with violations of Redicaid standards. This has occurred despite repeated. repeated plunges and budgetary initiatives of the DMHDD to improve services and achieve full Hedicaid certification of all its The Federal Health Care Financing Administration that Medicaid certification for recommended Но₩е Center be terminated in August of 1983. The Development Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities withdrew their facility from participation on voluntarily October... on August the 23rd of 1935 and has been 28.000 dollars a day in federal Medicaid funds ever since. Six other developmental centers have been cited, including Haukegan, Shapiro, Kankakee, Lincoln, Jacksonville and The Elizabeth 'Ludemann' Developmental Center in Anna. Park Forest was scheduled for termination on April the 12th, 1986, but is pending based upon implementation plans of correction that have recently been submitted by the Department. I believe that these matters and the fact that these are recurring problems warrants immediate and

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special investigation by the General Assembly, especially considering the substantial sums of money that we have been asked to appropriate in the past, and for this year, to correct such problems. I believe we must be more fully about the quality of existing programs and the success or failure to correct deficiencies. In this point. I would like to further comment that the new Citizens* Council on Mental Health and Development Disabilities is in the process of being organized to conduct some oversight of state programs relating to the mentally ill. and priorities for this year have not been established. am not confident that the purpose of the study proposed by this House Resolution could be immediatelv carried out bv that group. T must also say that the Sponsors of House Resolution 1139 are keenly interested this subject. They expect to be active Members of this special plan... that special panel. I believe that their work would be complimentary to the activities of the new Citizens* Council. I should add that the goals this are supported by key community service associations, the Illinois Association for Retarded Citizens. Illinois Association of Rehabilitation Facilities and "Ada S. McKinnely* and other advocates for the developmentally who have also expressed concern that loss of certification and ill-advised reforms o٤ developmental training in Fiscal .86 Year are symptomatic of more serious problems to state programs. They have expressed strong, strong concern about the loss of federal funds in plans to divert and the plans that divert these state funds to Medicald compliance This will reduce critical resources for projects. maintain and improve these most essential community services. And as I have stated, let's think about

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- forgotten ones today and I ask you to pass this Resolution, iointly, from both sides of this House. Thank you,
- Speaker Breslin: "The Gentleman has moved for the adoption of House Resolution 1139. And on that question, the Gentleman from Morgan, Representative Ryder."
- Ryder: "Thank you, Madam Chairman. Would the Sponsor yield?"
- Speaker Breslin: "He will."
- Ryder: "Representative, I'm assuming that you're aware of the
 Citizens' Assembly on Mental Health and Developmental
 Disabilities?"
- McGann: "That is correct, Representative Ryder. I mentioned it in my comments."
- Ryder: "And since you're aware of that Citizens' Assembly, are
 you not duplicating the functions of that Citizens'
 Assembly by creating this special organization?"
- McGann: "Absolutely not. First of all, your Council has... I believe was approved in July 1, 1985, and to this date, is not in its activity. Further, that it's just becoming organized. I don't think there will be any dup... here. I think what we're going to do is do like we're supposed to be doing as Representatives of our people in the state, is to go out and get the facts and then hopefully be able to rectify the different problems that exist."
- Ryder: "I think that you're somewhat mistaken into the abilities of the organization, since they were especially set up for exactly the kinds of problems that you discussed. I would think that you may want to reconsider your current position on this Bill."
- McGann: "I don't believe that I can reconsider my position on this Resolution, especially when we're losing 2d,000 dollars a day, federal monies, Title 19 monies that we should have coming in to help our programs. And I was told also by the Department of Mental Health that they may

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done that bу design. In other words, by design to lose 28,000 dollars a day. Then they stated, back if I would. and they 11 try and work out the problems. Then further they stated. blane i t the OΠ Director. He's the guy that caused it all. previous Ыe got a new Director now. I think this General should take this task at hand and do its job. A few years ago. when I first came to this Assembly, that problem was to our little infants, our high risk infants, in remarks and we created a special Committee such as this. the state. cost the State of Illinois very little dollars, and we came up with a lauislative now in the Act that is taking care of those high risk infants. Something we can be proud of. And this i s the same attitude and design we should have here.

Speaker Breslin: "Representative Ryder, on the issue,"

"I stand in opposition to the Resolution for many reasons. Ryder: first and foremost is the fact that it duplicates the Citizens* Assembly on Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities. It duplicates an organization that combines not only the very best from this legislative Body and from the Senate, but the very best that can be provided from the sector. As a consequence, we are in the ... we are beginning again the process of duplication of effort. the process of commissions that onerous verv word that describes past problems within this legislative riody. He beginning again that kind of are a problem. As. consequence, we should not be in support of this Bill. The Representative indicated that there were problems various state facilities. Indeed, there were. One of them occurred in Jacksonville. But we found that by bringing the matter to the attention of the Director Department of Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities,

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that we received the quickest and utmost cooperation. And, today, I can proudly tell you that the problems in Jacksonville have been solved. Cooperation, Citizens, Assembly are the way to address his issues, not by creating another legislative bounday.

Breslin: "The Gentleman from Lee, Representative Olson." Olson: "Thank you. Madam Speaker and Ladies and Sentlemen of the I address this Resolution as Cochairman of the Citizens Assembly on Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities. Senator Kelly and I were appointed respective leaderships in both Houses to do specifically what we're being sought in this Resolution. The Speaker of the House. Mike Madigan, has appointed one οf hic outstanding members. Steve Stalcup, to be OUT Executive Director. Ыe have a budget. We have a program. the agency that should address this issue and we will. a consequence, I would suggest that we do not support House Resolution 1139 but, rather, leave it to the group which, by concensus, this General Assembly has put in place."

Speaker Breslin: "The Lady from Cook, Representative Didrickson."

Didrickson: "Yes, thank you, Madam Speaker. Will the Gentleman yield for a question?"

Speaker Breslin: "He indicates he will."

Didrickson: "Representative AcGann, you know I talked to you last week about this issue. I happen to have Howe Developmental Disabled Center within my own district. Since I spoke with you, I also met with the Director there and with the parents group. So, my question to you is did this Resolution come from the parents of the client community?"

AcGann: "This Resolution came about when we start looking into the complaints that I had received from many people in my district and other Legislators had received in their districts about the total care and the programs and the

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fact that we were losing 28,000 dollars a day in federal dollars. And we felt as though that we should move on the creation of this special Committee in order to get the facts and hopefully, as I stated before, to rectify it in this very, very short term investigation.

Didrickson: "Well then, I would just like to share with you Members of this Body with rewards to the feedback that I received last Friday when I was there - rather. excuse Monday, with the parent group, the president of the parent groups and the Director of the facility at which has been decertified. Progress is being made there. The parent community, from the feedback that I did not question what we are doing down here in the General Assembly with regards to specifics with this Resolution. And I asked them to respond to that. The feedback that received from them was that they felt very comfortable and, in fact, sent many okays to the current Director there with regard to the progress that they're making and where they're moving to. Their main concern deals really with and that's their effort and the client technician ratio what they're working towards. I would just like to that with you."

Speaker Breslin: "The Gentleman from DeWitt, Representative

Vinson."

Vinson: "Thank you, Madam Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen o f the Assembly. I speak on this issue not in any party capacity. I speak as the representative of one of the developmentally disabled institutions in our state Lincoln Developmental Center has been in my district since I became a Legislator. It is a fine institution and it i s institution to which I've a great deal of devoted legislative attention. T think that dealing with the problems of the disabled in state institutions and ensuring

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that state institutions are properly run is most important. I think proper funding is necessary and I think that it's critical that agencies are responsible, and that does not just the Department of Mental Health, but also include Public Health, address these problems appropriately. I°ve at length in a bipartisan fashion with Members on both sides of the aisle on this matter. Representative Mautino and I. for years, have periodically sponsored jointly sponsored Amendments to raise the funding levels mental health institutions in order to make various sure that there was adequate resources there to do the job. I rise against this particular Resolution. therefore. dontt think there should be verv thorough legislative oversight of the problem, but because think the right place to do it is not Committee, but in the Appropriations Committee. Pardon me. Representative Bowman, Representative Hastert are committed to the problems of the mentally ill and the developmentally disabled. There's no Committee that will diligent in dealing with that be more issue than Committee chaired by those two Gantleman. ī helieva that work at it very thoroughly. And I know that I've personally made input several times in the past vear on particular problem with Mr. Hastert. I don't see any reason why there should be any sense of partisanship this matter. And for that reason and because I think we appropriately through the Appropriations can do it verv Committee and through the various other oversight groups that this Legislature created, I oppose this Resolution. sav to vou. Mr. McGann, that that does not. in anv mean that I oppose the need for very thorough oversight of this problem. No concern should be more important to us as a General Assembly than the proper care for peoble WOO 110th Legislative Day

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cannot care for themselves and to make sure that we ve got the resources necessary to do that, job and agencies just tripping themselves up. I would like to join vou making SHEE that the Appropriations Committee in thoroughly addresses that problem and that this Assembly does everything necessary to put the resources sense of organization into solving that problem. think this Resolution is necessary to do that. I think it would duplicative n f that. and Ŧ think the ha Appropriations Committee should be the appropriate for that study and for ensuring that there's compliance. And I would simply say to vou one concern. When you have the kind οf study Committee that you're suggesting, that there's alwavs the question in the bureaucrats mind whether it has any clout. When you're dealing with the Appropriations Committee, when you're dealing with the people who can make sure that you don't even have toilet paper in the executive washroom. then you know you can get cooperation. And that's why I think the Appropriations Committee is the right place to deal with it. I oppose the Resolution."

Speaker Breslin: "The Lady from Cook, Representative Currie." Speaker and Hembers of the House. Currie: "Thank you, Madam Ŧ rise in support of the Gentleman's Resolution. me that although we do indeed have the appropriations process to deal with ongoing issues of funding state agencies, we do have a Citizens' Assembly, newly created, to help us take long term looks at problems facing women, children, the developmentally disabled and the mentally ill in the State of Illinois. This Resolution was in response to a clear cut crisis, a crisis in which we are losing money day after day because our facilities are not in compliance with federal Medicaid requirements. ไก 110th Legislative Day

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the loss may well be expanded, because other facilities are under investigation by the Federal Financing Administration. This crisis is one that it is appropriate for our Assembly to respond to by creating a bipartisan 12 Member Committee of the Members of this House so that we can address the issue with focus, a focus that is no t available through the ongoing appropriations nor through the ongoing Citizens* process. Assembly As Co-chair of that new organization, I still process. support this Resolution, for I think that it offers us focus to target our attention to a crisis financial for the taxpavers of the State of Illinois and a crisis of care for developmentally disabled of our state.
