April 4, 1990

Speaker McPike: "House will come to order. The Chaplain for today is Father Kevin Vann, from Blessed Sacrament Parish, here in Springfield. Father Vann is a guest of Representative Curran. The guests in the balcony may wish to rise and join us for the invocation."

Father Kevin Vann: "Psalm 105 tells us the Lord remembers His covenant forever. Let us look to the Lord in His strength, seek to serve Him constantly, recall the wonderous deeds that He has wrought. Help us remember Oh God, Your promise and work in our lives, as we seek to be faithful to our commitments and promises to our people. Keep us mindful of Your presence in our daily lives and Your truth and Your justice and Your mercy always. Amen."

Speaker McPike: "We will be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Ropp."

Ropp - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker McPike: "Roll Call for Attendance. Mr. Clerk, put Representative Edley...it looks like your on now, Mr. Edley. Mr. Piel."

Piel: "No excused absences today, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you, Mr. Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Yes, let the record show the excused absence of Lou Jones, due to illness."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Mr. Clerk, would you take...Mr. Clerk would you take Representative Lou Jones off the Roll. Take the record. 115 Members answering the Roll Call a quorum is present. Mr. Clerk for an announcement."

Clerk Leone: "Yes, the Clerk has advised me that the wooden frame, the same frame we used last year for the Members

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photograph is going to cost \$105, the metal one that is on the picture displayed up here is \$95 and in either case the picture costs \$30."

Speaker McPike: "In addition?"

Clerk Leone: "In addition."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Committee Reports. Yes, Mr. Clerk for an announcement, a clarification on these pictures and the frames. Tony Leone framing gallery."

Clerk Leone: "Up at the well, we have a form for ordering the pictures and also ordering the framing of the pictures if you wish. We would prefer to have two separate checks, in fact, we need two separate checks, one made out to the framing company, one made out to Panoramic Photographs. Speaker McPike: "Committee Reports."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Olson."

Olson, M.: "Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I just wish to remind the Republican Members that we will be going to Conference at either 2:30 or immediately following the Session, 2:30 in 118 for Republican Members for a Conference."

Speaker McPike: "Agreed Resolutions."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Matijevich."

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Matijevec: "Mr. Speaker, these are all congratulatory resolutions, I move the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Matijevec moves the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions, all those in favor say 'aye', opposed 'no', the 'ayes' have it, and the Agreed Resolutions are adopted. Representative Edley on a Motion."

Edley: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Edley, please."

Edley: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the General Assembly, last Session we passed a Taxpayers Bill of Rights Legislation through this body, the Governor signed it in August and it became effective January, 1990. A keystone of that legislation was the taxpayers' ombudsman to be appointed by the Governor. We've got less than two weeks to go until the April 15th filing deadline and we still do not have a taxpayers' ombudsman. I would like for you to join with me in respectfully requesting that the Governor appoint this ombudsman as soon as possible."

Speaker McPike: "Are there any objections to the Gentleman's Motion? Hearing none, the attendance Roll Call is used and the Motion carries. Now, Representative Edley on the Resolution. Your Motion was to bypass Committee and place House Resolution 59 on the Speakers Table for immediate consideration. That Motion passed the..."

Edley: "Alright, well, we'll go back through it again, this is just a...a support resolution to request that the Governor appoint a taxpayers' ombudsman. For those of you that may not know exactly what that is, it's a taxpayers', sort of like a taxpayers' advocate. It was the keystone of our Taxpayers Rights Bill legislation which was a bipartisan effort. I ask for your support on this legislation."

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Speaker McPike: "Is there any discussion? Representative McCracken."

McCracken: "Why are all the Democrats of this resolution...are all the Sponsors Democrats? Are there any Republican who asked to Sponsor this?"

Edley: "I have Representative Countryman, and Representative Weller, and Representative Frederick on this. We're actually trying to get it through before we adjourn today, so that possibly he can appoint this ombudsman before he leaves for Japan."

McCracken: "Well, is this a Motion to bypass Committee, Mr. Speaker?"

Speaker McPike: "No, that was already adopted."

McCracken: "Well, than I'm too late, why are you letting me talk on this?"

Speaker McPike: "Well, I asked if there were any objections? I thought you would object."

McCracken: "I have the horses to stop it now..."

Speaker McPike: "Not now."

McCracken: "I rise in opposition to the resolution, the Governor's Office has not acted, because the salary for this office has not yet been set by the Compensation Review Board, and it has no desire to put the cart before the horse, and frankly, even if it did desire to do that, no self respecting private sector person would take a job without knowing the salary. So I'm sure your well intentioned, Representative Edley, but there are reasons over which the Governor has no control that prompt him not to have made that appointment, and I think it would be imprudent for us to ask that that appointment be made, irrespective of the decision on how much the position would pay. I rise in opposition and ask my colleagues to join me."

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Speaker McPike: "Further discussion? Mr. Edley to close."

Edley: "The Compensation Review Board, I'm sure, will respond to the Governors...request, after all, we've got a Gambling Board that's been put together for which the legislation was signed months after this Taxpayers Rights Bill so I think it's still proper for this body to request the Governor pursue appointing the taxpayers' ombudsman. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Question is 'Shall House Resolution 1500, be adopted?' All those in favor vote 'aye', all opposed vote 'no'. Have all voted? Have all voted who wish? Clerk will take the record. On this Motion there are 75 'ayes', 30...77 'ayes', 33 'nos', none voting 'present' House Resolution 1500 is adopted. Agreed Resolutions."

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Clerk, the Clerk is going to be recognized to read a Res...a Death Resolution of a former Member, would all Members rise."

Clerk O'Brien: "House Resolution 1357, offered by Representative McPike, WHEREAS, The House has learned with sorrow of the death of Leland J. Kennedy of Alton; and WHEREAS, He was born in Alton to Joseph and Louise (Herwick) Kennedy; and WHEREAS, Leland Kennedy married Eileen Cain on May 7, 1949, in Springfield; and WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy served as Democrat precinct committeeman in the early 1940's, was elected to the Illinois House of Representatives in 1946, and served in Springfield for three terms, until his defeat by Paul Simon; and WHEREAS, after a ten year hiatus, Mr. Kennedy again ran for office and won a seat in the Illinois House in 1962, where he served with distinction until his retirement in 1974; and WHEREAS, Mr. Kennedy also worked as an operating engineer with Shell Oil Company in Wood River for 38 years, and served in the U.S. Army in World War II; and WHEREAS, He was a member of the Fourth degree Knights of Columbus and the VFW Post in Alton; and WHEREAS, Leland J. Kennedy leaves to cherish his memory: his wife, Eileen; daughter, Maureen; his son, Patrick Kennedy; four grandchildren; and a brother, Homer Kennedy; sister, Margaret Burnett, preceded him in death; and WHEREAS, Leland Kennedy served his state and country with distinction, and an enduring concern for the rights of others; therefore, be it Resolved, by the House of Representatives of the Eight-Sixth General Assembly of the State of Illinois, that we express our deep sorrow at the death of our former colleague in the Illinois House of Representatives, Leland J. Kennedy; that we offer our heartfelt sympathy to his family; and that we join his many friends in honoring his memory; and be it further,



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Resolved, that a suitable copy of this preamble and resolution be presented to Mrs. Eileen Kennedy with our sincere condolences."

Speaker Breslin: "The Gentleman from Madison, Representative McPike."

McPike: "Thank you Madam Speaker, and Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I know most of you don't remember Leland Kennedy, he left here in 1974, but there are still some on the House Floor that do. I'm sure Gene Hoffman, and John Matijevich, Zeke Giorgi, and others that have been here for a long time remember Lee, and I would say that if you did know Lee you would just like him as a Gentleman. He was probably one of the sweetest men that you could meet. He would never want to offend anyone. He was very proud to have been a Member of this Body, and he'd like to say that the only person that ever beat him was United States Senator Paul Simon. He was proud to be a Member of this Body, and he would want to be remembered, I think, as simply a Member of the General Assembly, and a Gentleman and someone that cared about his family and his area and about the Legislature and I would ask that all Members be added to this Resolution. I'm sure his family and his friends in Alton will miss him very much."

Speaker Breslin: "The Gentleman from St. Clair, Representative Flinn."

Flinn: "Thank you, Madam Speaker. I lived in Granite City many years ago, and Lee Kennedy was my Representative, he was the first Member of this body, I ever got acquainted with. He was a very honorable man. He was what we call a hand shake person. When he shook your hand you could bet you had his word and he would do it. He is sort of a disappearing breed of people today. He is a guy, that we were all proud to have him as our Representative, and I

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knew him to have no enemies, to my knowledge he had no enemies. If he was opposed to something you were for, he would tell you right up front. This guy will be sorely missed and I express my sympathy to his family."

Breslin: "The Gentleman from Madison, Representative Wolf."

Wolf: "Thank you, Madam Speaker. I didn't have the privilege of serving in the House at the time that Leland Kennedy served his some twenty odd years as an Assembly Man, but I did get to know him when I was breaking into the political arena, and I can assure you that he was a good Legislator. He was also a very aggressive campaigner. Some of the campaigns that he and former Representative Horace Calv, who is now a Supreme Court Justice, some of the campaigns that they raised were something to behold, all of which were, of course, held during the period of the single shot, the bullet, or hit me for three. He was a very pleasant man as Representative McPike indicated, he was an honorable man and he was a family man. He will be missed and I join all of you in extending condolences to his family."

Speaker Breslin: "The Gentleman from Lake, Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Madam Speaker, Ladies and Gentleman of the House. As Jim McPike said those of you who don't know or didn't know Leland J. Kennedy, it's just another Irish name. But those who served with him we have some happy memories, I was not aware of his passing until I got a call from Mike McClain. Mike was his seatmate and Mike's father, Elmo "Mac" McClain, who served before Mike, was a close friend of Leland and mine, and we had some good times. Leland had a strut to himself. He wore a hearing aid, and he was one of those guys, that if you shouted at him, and he didn't want to hear you, he didn't hear you. But if you whispered and he wanted to hear you he heard everything you said.

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And he was one that had a political analysis of every Bill. He was a political animal, and really enjoyed it even after he left here. From the Alton area, he'd call me home at...at home and like to keep in touch. I remember I'd go by, he'd always be here early in the floor, because he wanted to talk to you and he'd always start in saying 'well, what do you think John?' That was his way of starting to get to the politics of everything. He was a practical joker too. I use to go have dinner with Leland and Elmo and Joe Finize, I was the odd man out, I was the only one that wasn't Irish. But Elmo would kick Joe and myself under the table, and he'd make some story up about Leland. He'd say, 'Leland, now why did you miss that vote today?', and tell him what he missed. He didn't miss anything. And Leland would say, 'What? What?' and he'd get all excited about it. He was just a pleasant man to be with. Deeply, deeply religious, he was much like Elmo. Elmo would leave us sometime when we were having dinner and go out and pray for his family. That is the way Leland was, very deeply religious, committed to his family, and someone that I will miss and I want to give my condolences to his wife and his family."

Speaker Breslin: "There has been leave requested for all Members to be added as Co-Sponsors. Is leave granted? Hearing no objection, leave is granted. And allowing time for Perfunctory Session for first reading. With the adoption of this Motion, the House will stand adjourned. All those in favor say 'aye', all those opposed say 'no', in the opinion of the Chair the 'ayes' have it, and this House stands adjourned in honor of this Member. Allowing perfunctory time for first readings. The House is adjourned until April 17th, Tuesday, April 17th, meanwhile everyone should have a Happy Easter."
