TRANSCRIPTION DEBATE

124th Legislative Day

June 5, 1990

Speaker McPike: "The House will come to order. The Chaplain for today is Pastor Dave Dolan of the New Life Tabernacle Church in Sullivan, Illinois. Pastor Dolan is the guest of Representative Noland. The guests in the balcony may wish to rise and join us for the invocation."

Pastor Dolan: "Father we thank You today, we come to...from Jesus. Lord you exorted us to pray for those that are in authority and those with great responsibility. We would ask You today to strenghten each Representative that's here, encourage them, let them walk with courage and faith and those things that You have implanted in their hearts. Let them walk in the power of the calling that You have placed upon them. Help them to be faithful stewarts of all that they have and all that You have placed in their hands. We would ask You today by the power of Your spirit that you would inspire and strenghten, that You would direct and cause us to walk in the paths that You desire for us this day. We would ask today Lord that You would call us, each Representative, to make this state the prosperous successful state that it has been. Order this state's steps Lord, and today we give You all of the glory, all of the honor, and all of the praise in the mighty name of Jesus. Amen."

Speaker McPike: "We will be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Ropp."

Ropp - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker McPike: "Roll Call for Attendance. Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, let the record reflect the excused

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absence of Representative Farley, who is recuperating and doing fine after surgery. Representative Bowman do to illness in the family and Representative Homer do to the death of his father."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Piel."

Piel: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. No excused absences today."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Take the record, Mr. Clerk. 115 Members answering a Roll Call a quorum is present. Representative Matijevich asks leave to allow the Public T.V. to film on the House Floor. Any objections? Leave is granted. Committee Report."

Clerk O'Brien: "Representative Curran, Chairman from the Committee on Economic Development, to which the following Bills were referred, action taken June 5, 1990 reported the same back with the following recommendation: 'Do pass Short Debate Status' Senate Bill 1484."

Speaker McPike: "Can the Chair have the attention of the Members, please. We have two guests from Wisconsin, they're both Members of the Legislature in Wisconsin and we would like to welcome them and they would like to say a few words. First is State Representative Peter 'Barka' and State Representative Richard 'Robschmidt'. Welcome to Springfield, Illinois."

Barka: "Well, thank you, very much for this kind opportunity. I represent the Kenosha area which borders Winthrop Harbor and Zion and sometimes it's been said, that more people read Chicago Tribune and root for the Chicago Cubs than they do the Milwaukee or the Wisconsin Teams. And in the Kenosha area though people do follow what happens in Illinois very closely. We're just in for a couple of days and we hope to be able to talk to of all the Committee issues that involve border communities whether it be air quality or...we're hoping someday to have a rampant transit

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system between Milwaukee and Chicago. And...overall through we just appreciate the opportunity to be here. I Chair the Audit Committee and I'm hoping to talk to people about that as well. So, thank you."

Robschmidt: "Well, good afternoon. My name is Rick Robschmidt and I represent the suburbs in the south of Milwaukee, the City of Milwaukee and if the Speaker of the State Assembly to Wisconsin could only see me now. I serve as the Chairman of the State Public Pension Committee and also as the Vice Chairman of the Assembly Education Committee. And...I feel that if Gorbachev and Bush can get together and settle the differences between those two countries, it's about time the people of Wisconsin and the people of Illinois get together and share ideas because we all have a common goal and that is to improve the quality of life of our constituents. Thank you, again. It's a pleasure to be here and hope...hopefully we can learn from each other over the next couple of days. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Ryder in the Chair."

Ryder: "Ladies and Gentlemen of the House, with me this morning are twenty-nine members of the Berea Ag Club, a 4-H Club from Morgan County Illinois. These young people this morning had a very unusual experiment. On the north side of the Centennial Building, you'll find a new flower garden that has been planted by the members of this club. The unusual quality of this...flower garden is that the seeds are literally from outer space. The club planted seeds that were taken on a shuttle mission, traveled ten days in a shuttle mission around the earth and the seeds that are planted in this special flower garden are a comparison from seeds that stayed on earth from the very same lot. They...the members of this 4-H club arranged for obtaining those seeds and have since...started to grow them in a

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horticultural division of the University of Illinois and then after the plants were started, this morning planted those flowers, including...Senator Dirkson's favorite marigolds. Planted those flowers just north of the Centennial Building. There is a plaque that...indicates the accomplishment of these people, I would ask all of you to join with me in honoring the members, parents and leaders of the Berea Ag 4-H Club from Morgan County Illinois. Please."

Hannel: "Hello, I'm Kevin Hannel, president of Berea Ag 4-H Club and I would like to thank everyone responsible, especially Tom Ryder and everyone that helped us have this special visit here today. And all our 4-H leaders and everyone responsible and I would like to invite everyone over in front of the Centennial Building to see our flowers. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Monroe Flinn."

Flinn: "Mr. Speaker, I'd like to move the waiving of the posting requirements for Senate Bill 1488. The Bill didn't get out of rules until last Friday and I've not checked with the other side but my Minority Spokesman of Financial Institutions is the Sponsor of it and that's Representative Piel. But I suppose he'll support me."

Speaker McPike: "Alright, the Gentleman's Motion is to suspend the posting requirements for Senate Bill 1488, and Representative Piel is the Sponsor of the so I presume there are no objections. Hearing none. The Attendance Roll Call is used and the Motion carries. Representative Matijevich."

Matijevich: "Mr. Speaker, I would ask leave of the House to use the Attendance Roll Call for the purpose of the...Rules Committee meeting immediately in the Speaker's Conference Room. There are three Bills that...will be heard and we

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will meet immediately in the Speaker's Conference Room. Also, Representative Bugielski has a birthday and there's a cake at his desk. I'm not sure if both those were in order of importance but, I would ask leave."

Speaker McPike: "Alright, the Gentleman asks leave to suspend the appropriate rule so that Rules Committee can meet immediately. And Representative Matijevich, did you request to waive the posting requir...?"

Matijevich: "We don't have to."

Speaker McPike: "Oh, I'm sorry, the Committee is in recess. So, the Gentleman asks to waive the posting requirements so the Committee can meet while we're in Session. Hearing no objections leave is granted, Attendance Roll Call is used and the Motion carries. Representative Munizzi."

Munizzi: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker and Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. Today is Representative Bob Bugielski's birthday. The paper says he's forty-three, I think he's lying. But please come over and have a piece of cake for his birthday, it's adorable it's got his self portrait on top of it. Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Page 6 of the Calendar, Consent Calendar, Second Reading, Second Day. Read the Bills, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk O'Brien: "Consent Calendar, Second Reading, Second Day. Senate Bill 1504, a Bill for an Act to amend the Counties Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Senate Bill 1578, a Bill for an Act to amend the Illinois Insurance Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Senate Bill 1660, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Senate Bill 1676, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Senate Bill 1843, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Senate Bill 1850, a Bill for an Act to amend the Illinois Public Aid Code. Second Reading of

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the Bill. And Senate Bill 1985, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Committee Report. Representative Monroe Flinn."

Flinn: "Mr. Speaker, I would move that we waive the posting rules for Senate Bill 1882 and this time I have checked with the Minority side. Minority Spokesman..."

Speaker McPike: "Is that the same Bill as earlier?"

Flinn: "No, a different Bill."

Speaker McPike: "This a different Bill, alright, thank you. Is for your committee?"

Flinn: "My committee."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Clerk, Committee Report."

Clerk O'Brien: "The Committee on Rules has met pursuant to Rule 29(c)3, the following Bills have been ruled exempt on June 5, 1990. Senate Bills 1571, 1882 and 2127. Signed, John Matijeovich, Chairman."

Speaker McPike: "Alright, Representative Matijeovich has moved to waive the posting requirements for the three Bills that just came out of Rules Committee. The posting requirement for Senate Bill 1882 for Executive Committee. Senate Bill 2127 for Executive Committee. Senate Bill 1571 for Revenue Committee. Are there any objections to waiving the posting requirements for these three? Hearing none, the Attendance Roll Call is used and the Motion carries. Representative Matijeovich also moves to waive the posting requirements for Senate Bill 1700, that was originally posted but was deleted from the posting notice. Any objections to that? The...Representative the Bill was originally posted and then it was accidentally deleted by the Committee Clerk and this is to clarify the error on Senate Bill 1700. Are there any objections? Hearing none, the Attendance Roll Call is used and the Motion carries. Any announcements?"

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Representative Mautino."

Mautino: "Thank you very much. Mr. Speaker, the Insurance Committee will not meet at 2:00 P.M. today. There's only one Bill and we are therefore, canceling the Insurance Committee meeting."

Speaker McPike: "Insurance Committee has been cancelled. Any other announcements? Agreed Amendments. I'm sorry, Agreed Resolutions. Sorry, Zeke. Agreed Resolutions."

Clerk O'Brien: "House Resolution 1816, offered by Representative DeJaegher. 1817, DeJaegher. 1818, DeJaegher. 1819, DeJaegher. 1820, DeJaegher. 1821, Weller. 1853, Pedersen, et al. 1854, Leitch. 1855, Terzich. 1856, Morrow. 1857, Morrow. 1858, Morrow. 1859, Morrow. 1860, Morrow. 1861, Capparelli. 1862, Klemm, and 1863, Weaver. Plus, 1864, Frederick. Delete...Resolution 1864."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Matijevich."

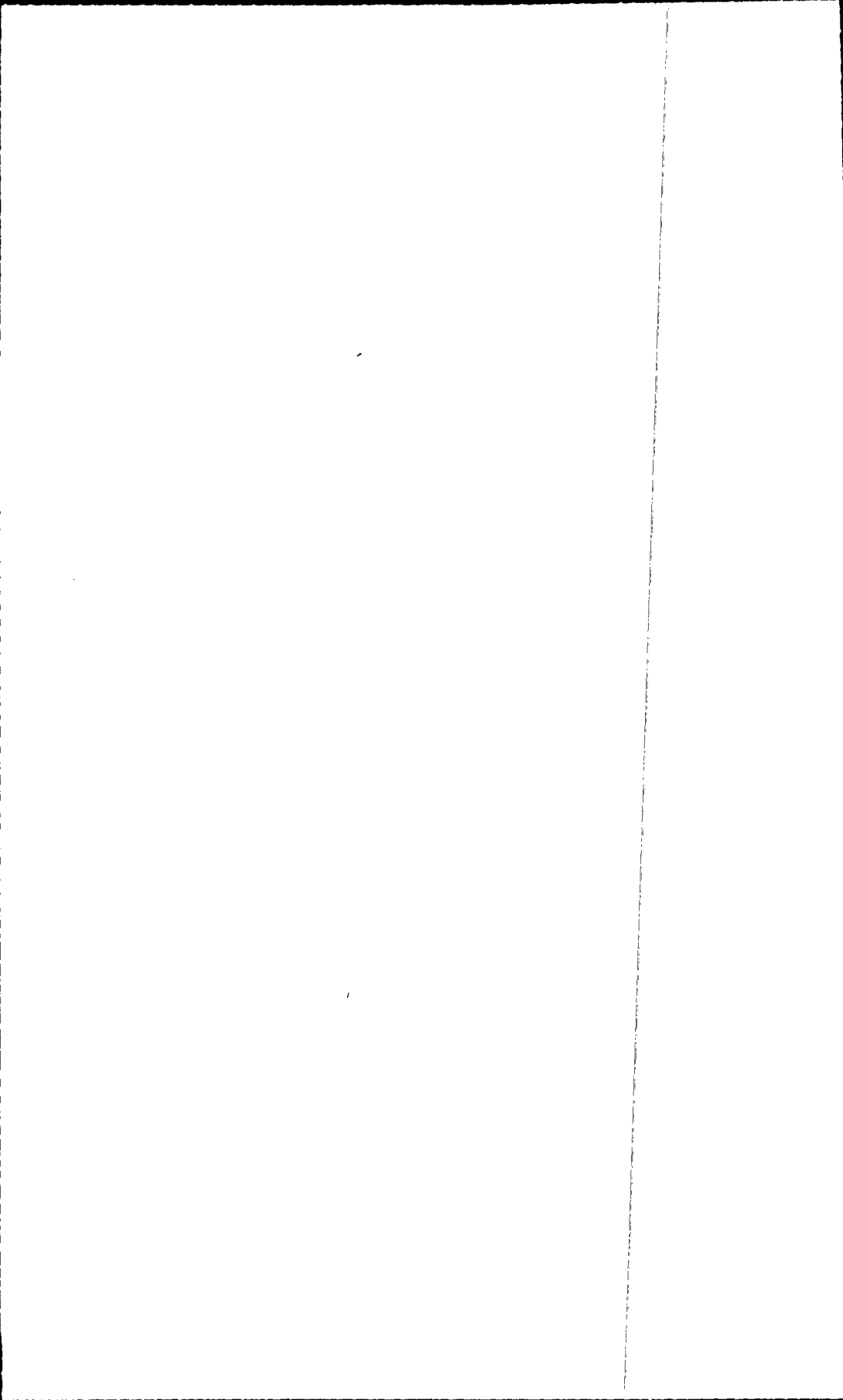
Matijevich: "Mr Speaker, we have examined the Resolutions, they're all congratulatory. I move the adoption of the Agreed Resolutions."

Clerk O'Brien: "House Resolutions 1864, offered Representative Frederick - Matijevich - Ryder."

Speaker McPike: "Committee on Assignment. Any announcements? Representative Dunn. John Dunn."

Dunn: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. On behalf of Senator Ralph Dunn, Senator Tom Dunn and myself, I wish to announce that House Judiciary I Committee will convene at 9:30 in the morning instead of 9:00 A.M., 9:30 A.M., and there will be a short briefing for Democrat Members immediately after adjournment in the Speaker's



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Conference Room."

Speaker McPike: "There being no further business...Representative Matijeovich."

Matijeovich: "Mr. Speaker, Ladies and Gentlemen of the House. I would like to introduce Gary LaPailles father who's standing right over here. I've met him before but...the Chairman in Lake...the Illinois Democratic Party, I'm sure he's proud of Gary and we are. Could you raise your hand, Mr. LaPaille. Mr. LaPaille. There he is."

Speaker McPike: "Representative Matijeovich now moves that the House stands adjourned until tomorrow at the hour of 12:00 noon. All those in favor say 'aye', all opposed 'no'. The 'ayes' have it, the House stands adjourned. Stand adjourned until tomorrow at the hour of 1:00 p.m. All those in favor say 'aye', opposed 'no', the 'ayes' have it. The House stands adjourned until tomorrow at the hour of 1:00 p.m."

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
