BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Section 3 of Article VIII the Illinois Constitution as follows: SECTION 3. STATE AUDIT AND AUDITOR GENERAL (a) The General Assembly provide by law for the audit of the obligation, receipt and use of all funds administered by State government, whether directly or indirectly, by the legislative, executive or iudicial branch of the State or by any instrumentality of any branch, whether appropriated or not and regardless of source, but not funds administered by units of local government or school districts, except as established by the General Assembly by law. public-funds-of-the-State- The General Assembly, by a vote of three-fifths of the members elected to each house, shall appoint an Auditor General and may remove him for cause by a similar vote. The Auditor General shall. serve for a term of ten vears.
