A bill passed under this subdivision (e)(2) shall not be subject to actions by the Governor under subsection (d) or (e) of Section 9 of Article IV of this Constitution but shall be subject to actions under subsection (a), (b) or (c) of that Section, For the purposes of this subsection (e), "unit of local government" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in Article VII, Section 1 of this Constitution.
