30th Legislative Day

March 24, 1993

Speaker McPike: "Come to order. The Chaplain for today is Reverend William Cissna of the Peoples Church of God in Decatur, Illinois. Reverend Cissna is the guest of Representative Noland. The guests in the balcony may wish to rise and join us for the invocation."

Reverend William Cissna: "Will you join your hearts with mine in prayer? Heavenly Father, before You stand the men and women who lead us. They are leaders of our community and our state. The people look to them for direction. Yet they are men and women of great need. They need wisdom as they wrestle with the confusing mass of issues. They need courage as they make choices of right over expediency, and they need compassion as they choose between the problems of today and those of tomorrow. They need hope as they patiently wait for progress to come and most of all, Lord, they need assurance that each one of them can make a difference. So I ask You to fill them with Your character. Lead them this day and, in leading them, You will lead our people. Amen."

Speaker McPike: "We will be led in the Pledge of Allegiance by Representative Phelan."

Phelan: "et al- I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Speaker McPike: "Roll Call for Attendance. Mr. Kubik."

Kubik: "Yes. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Let the record reflect that Representative Bernard Pedersen is excused due to illness."

Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Representative Currie."

Currie: "Thank you, Speaker. Representative Bob LeFlore is excused because of illness."

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Speaker McPike: "Thank you. Mr. Granberg, would you turn Representative LeFlore off, please? Thank you. Mr. Clerk, take the record. One hundred-sixteen Members answering the roll call a quorum is present. Representative Black."

Black: "Yes. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I don't want to interrupt the hectic pace of activity here on the floor today, but we're...we're joined by a former Representative, now a Senate (sic-Senator), who has come back to see where things really happen. Senator Petka is with us today."

Speaker McPike: "And he certainly received a...a warm round of applause, didn't he? Committee Reports."

Speaker McPike: "All right, the record will so reflect."

Gash: "Thank you."

Speaker McPike: "Local Government, Second Reading, appears House Bill 105, Mr. Homer. Mr. Lang, on 168. Mr. Capparelli, on House Bill 175. Mr. Brunsvold, on 343. Representative Cowlshaw. Representative Giorgi, on 395. (House Bill) 395. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 395, a Bill for an Act to amend the Sanitary District Act of 1936. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Mr. Lang, on 548, 550. Mr. Saltsman, 609. Mr. Saltsman, 609. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

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Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 609, a Bill for an Act to amend the Illinois Municipal Budget Law. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment 1 adopted in committee. No Motions filed. No Floor Amendments."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 1364, a Bill for an Act amending the Public Off...Officer Prohib...Prohibited Activities Act. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. House Bill 1097, Representative Capparelli. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 1097, a Bill for an Act amending the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Act. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Education, Second Reading, Mr. Lang, on House Bill 78. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 78, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment 1 adopted in committee. No Motions filed. Floor Amendment 2, offered by Representative Lang."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Lang, Amendment 2."

Lang: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I want to point out that the board, is wrong. It's not about a fire protection district, but the Clerk was right, the way he read it. At

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any rate, Amendment 2 is a clarifying Amendment agreed to between proponents of the State Board of Education. It's not controversial."

Speaker McPike: "The question is, 'Shall Amendment 2 be adopted?' All in favor say 'aye'; opposed, 'no'. The 'ayes' have it. The Amendment is adopted. Further Amendments."

Clerk Rossi: "No further Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Representative Giglio, 392. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 392, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment 1 adopted in committee. No Motions filed. No Floor Amendments."

Speaker McPike: "Third Reading. Mr. Balanoff, on 521. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 521, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. No Committee Amendments. Floor Amendment 1, offered by Representative Balanoff."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Balanoff."

Balanoff: "Floor Amendment 1 would become the Bill, and it would basically put in the results of a task force on phys...on school physical examinations...that met, and it would require tuberculosis testing as part of the regular health examination...for children in kindergarten, fifth grade and ninth grade, in certain areas where the Department of Public Health, say, have a high incidence of tuberculosis. It would also provide for...screening...dental screening and, again, the rules and regulations would be set up by the Department of Public Health. I know of no opposition. The Department of Public Health, with this Amendment, is in favor of the Bill."

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Speaker McPike: "Representative Black, on the Amendment."

Black: "Yeah. Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman (sic-Speaker).
A...an inquiry of the Chair,...or Mr. Speaker, an inquiry
of the Chair. Has this Floor Amendment been printed and
distributed?"

Speaker McPike: "Yes."

Black: "...Could you bear with us, so we could at least get a
copy? We don't have one."

Speaker McPike: "Yes. Would somebody give Mr. Black a copy?"

Black: "I appreciate the indulgence of the Chair. We've...looked
at the Amendment. ...I certainly will not rise in
opposition to the Amendment; however, I think there
are...various impact notes that we will or have filed on
this Bill, and would like to get those cost figures before
it goes to Third."

Speaker McPike: "Mr. Black. Are you prepared now?"

Black: "Yeah. Thank you now for your patience, Mr. Speaker. We
certainly will not rise in opposition to the Amendment;
however, we do think there are various fiscal and/or
mandate implications, and we have filed the appropriate
notes."

Speaker McPike: "That's correct. The question is, 'Shall
Amendment 1 be adopted?' All in favor say 'aye'; opposed,
'no'. The 'ayes' have it, and the Amendment is adopted.
The Bill stays on Second Reading, Mr. Balanoff, until the
correct notes are filed. Mr. Brunsvold, on 525. Read the
Bill, Mr.

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 525, a Bill for an Act to amend the
School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment 1
adopted in committee. No Motions filed. No Floor
Amendments. A fiscal note has been requested."

Speaker McPike: "Third...Third Reading. Pardon? Has the fiscal

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note been filed? All right, a fiscal note has not been filed. This Bill will be returned to Second Reading and left on Second Reading. Representative Schoenberg, 822. Mr. Hoffman, on 1165. Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk. Out of the record. (House Bill) 1195, John Dunn. Mr. Dunn? Read the Bill, Mr. Clerk."

Clerk Rossi: "House Bill 1195, a Bill for an Act to amend the School Code. Second Reading of the Bill. Amendment 1 adopted in committee. No Motions filed. No Floor Amendments."

Brenne spent more than 50 years of his life in public service to his county, the State of Illinois and his local community; and WHEREAS, Mr. Brenne served as an Air Force radar officer during World War II in the Pacific theater, participating in the Saipan, Iwo Jima and Okinawa campaigns; and WHEREAS, Mr. Brenne enjoyed a 30-year executive career in freight handling and cargo handling with United Airlines after holding traffic management positions with the Greyhound Corporation; and WHEREAS, Mr. Brenne was elected to the Illinois House of Representatives
