Speaker Hartke: "The House will come to order. Members will please be at their seats. We will be led in prayer today by Lee Crawford, who is the Assistant Pastor of the Victory Temple Church in Springfield. Our guests in the gallery may wish to rise and join us for the invocation. Pastor Crawford."

Lee Crawford: "Let us pray. As we elevate our hearts as well as our minds, all mighty and eternal God, who has created us in Thine own glorious image, we stand this moment in humble gratitude for all Thy tender mercies, that You have ordained to rest upon us.
