'Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the 91st General Assembly of the State of Illinois, the Senate concurring herein, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least six months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 9 to Article 8 of the Illinois Constitution as follows: Article 8, General Provisions; Section 9, Insurance Commissioner. There is created the Office of Insurance Commissioner. The Insurance Commissioner shall regulate the insurance industry in Illinois. The Insurance Commissioner shall have such powers and duties as provided by law. The Insurance Commissioner shall be elected by the electors of the State. The General Assembly shall provide by law for the qualifications, term of office, and manner of election of the Insurance Commissioner. Schedule of this Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution.' First Reading of this Constitutional Amendment.
