1 Speaker Madigan: "The House shall come to order. The Members
2 shall be in their chairs. We ask the Members and the
3 guests in the gallery to turn off their laptop computers,
4 their cell phones and their pagers. And we ask the guests
5 in the gallery to rise and join us for the invocation and
6 the Pledge of Allegiance. We shall be led in prayer today
7 by Pastor Ron Henwood of the First Christian Church in
8 Herrin, Illinois. Pastor Henwood is the guest of
9 Representative John Bradley."

10 Pastor Henwood: "Let's pray. Father, these men and women have
11 gathered here today to be at the will of the people but I
12 pray especially, Lord, that You will give them the courage
13 to... to see not by political expediency or by party lines,
14 but to look at these Bills for what is right. And I thank
15 You, Lord, for these opportunities. So, I pray for their
16 courage. I pray for their honesty. And I pray that they
17 will pray in accordance to Your will and not by the
18 pressure. In Jesus name, I pray. Amen."

19 Speaker Madigan: "We shall be led in the Pledge of Allegiance
20 by Representative Hassert."

21 Hassert - et al: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United
22 States of America and to the Republic for which it stands,
23 one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice
24 for all."

25 Speaker Madigan: "Roll Call for Attendance. Mr. Hannig."

26 Hannig: "Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. Would the record reflect
27 that Representative Currie is excused today."

28 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Bost."

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1 Bost: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Let the record reflect that all
2 Republicans are present."

3 Speaker Madigan: "The Clerk shall take the record. There being
4 117 Members responding to the Attendance Roll Call, there
5 is a quorum present. Mr. Clerk."

6 Clerk Mahoney: "Referred to Committee on Rules. House
7 Resolution 711, by Representative Kurtz. House Resolution
8 713, offered by Representative Flowers. House Resolution
9 715, offered by Representative Fritchey. House Resolution
10 716, offered by Representative Kosel. House Resolution
11 719, offered by Representative Rose. House Resolution 721,
12 offered by Representative Rose. House Joint Resolution 70,
13 offered by Representative Grunloh."

14 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Hannig. Mr. Hannig. Mr. Clerk, I
15 believe you have a Resolution to be read."

16 Clerk Mahoney: "House Resolution 716.

17 WHEREAS, Music in the schools of Illinois is designed to bring
18 about recognition of the vital place of music in the
19 education process; and

20

21 WHEREAS, Music is a powerful and aesthetic force that gives
22 our young people a sense of civilization because it
23 dignifies the realm of feeling by merging intellect and
24 emotion in the search for a humane way of life; and

25

26 WHEREAS, Music is a basic influence in the lives of millions
27 of people who participate in creating, performing, and

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1 listening experiences developed through music in the
2 schools; and

3

4 WHEREAS, Music in our schools is a special opportunity for
5 citizens to understand and support the ongoing process of
6 music education; therefore, be it

7

8 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD
9 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we
10 recognize the importance of music in the schools of the
11 State of Illinois, and we thank music teachers and staff
12 throughout the State for their dedication to music
13 education."

14 Speaker Madigan: "On the Resolution, the Chair recognizes
15 Representative Munson. Mr. Hannig in the Chair."

16 Munson: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. March has traditionally been
17 the month that we celebrate music educators. And I am
18 delighted to introduce today from Elgin, the Larkin High
19 School Madrigals, in the Speaker's gallery along with their
20 Director Suzanne Smentowski, and from Larkin High School
21 Tom Flanigan, and Dr. Jean Bowen, and the Staff of the
22 Illinois Music Education Association Randy and Linda Kummer
23 and Don Davis."

24 Speaker Hannig: "Welcome to Springfield. Thank you. You've
25 all heard the Resolution. Is there any discussion? Then
26 all in favor of the Resolution say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'.
27 The 'ayes' have it. And the Resolution is adopted.

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1 Representative Munson, would you like to advise us of the..
2 the plan for the musical group today?"

3 Munson: "I believe they'll be providing two... programs for us
4 and look forward to hearing them. Go ahead and start."

5 Larkin Madrigal Chorus: (Star Spangled Banner)

6 Speaker Hannig: "Representative Charles Morrow, for what reason
7 do you rise?"

8 Morrow: "Yes, Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I thought last week I..
9 I'd made an announcement that I want to table House Bill
10 5043. I found out that I'm still being recorded as having
11 that Bill in Rules. So, I'd like to make a Motion to Table
12 House Bill 5043."

13 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that House Bill 5043 be
14 tabled. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
15 have it. And the Bill is tabled. Representative
16 Feigenholtz, for what reason do you rise?"

17 Feigenholtz: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise on a point of
18 personal privilege."

19 Speaker Hannig: "State your point."

20 Feigenholtz: "Ju... Just like the choir in the gallery today
21 singing glory halleluiaah, I too am singing glory halleluiaah
22 because the young Representative who I share a Senate
23 district with is finally turning 40 today. Representative
24 John Fritchey, turning 40. Glory halleluiaah. And we would
25 like everybody to join us in a piece of cake and enjoy.
26 Happy birthday, John."

27 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from McHenry, Representative
28 Franks, for what reason do you rise?"

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1 Franks: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to make a Motion to
2 Table House Bill 3900."

3 Speaker Hannig: "Okay, the Gentleman moves to table House Bill
4 3900. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
5 have it. And the Bill is tabled. The Gentleman from Cook,
6 Representative McKeon, for what reason do you rise?"

7 McKeon: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to... I have House
8 Bill 4031 on the Order of Postponed Consideration. I'd
9 like to move that back to Second for the purposes of an
10 Amendment."

11 Speaker Hannig: "Mr. Clerk, would you move that Bill to the
12 Order of Second Reading at the request of the Sponsor.
13 Cou... Representative, could you repeat the number for the
14 Clerk?"

15 McKeon: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, it's House Bill 4031."

16 Speaker Hannig: "Thank you, Representative. The Gentleman from
17 Cook, Representative Acevedo, for what reason do you rise?"

18 Acevedo: "Mr. Speaker, I move to table House Bill 5127."

19 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that we table House Bill
20 5127. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
21 have it. And the Bill is tabled. Representative...
22 Representative Boland, for what reason do you rise?"

23 Boland: "Purpose of an announcement, Mr. Speaker. The House
24 Elections and Campaign Reform Committee for today, is
25 canceled."

26 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from Cook, Representative
27 Osterman, for what reason do you rise?"

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1 Osterman: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to move to table
2 House Bill 6849. The Gentleman moves that we table House
3 Bill 6849. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The
4 'ayes' have it. And the Bill is tabled. The Gentleman
5 from Cook, Representative Davis, for what reason do you
6 rise?"

7 Davis, W.: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to make a Motion
8 to Table House Bill 3958, please."

9 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that we table House Bill
10 3958. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
11 have it. The Bill is tabled. Representative McGuire, for
12 what reason do you rise?"

13 McGuire: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Would you please table House
14 Bill 6917, 6917, House Bill? Thank you."

15 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that we table House Bill
16 6917. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
17 have it. The Bill is tabled. The Lady from Lake,
18 Representative Ryg, for what reason do you rise?"

19 Ryg: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to table House Bill
20 4615."

21 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady's moved that we table House Bill
22 4615. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
23 have it. And the Bill is tabled. The Gentleman from Cook,
24 Representative Delgado. Representative Delgado, for what
25 reason do you rise?"

26 Delgado: "Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. I need to ask for a
27 suspension of Rules on..."

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1 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from McLean, Representative
2 Brady, for what reason do you rise?"

3 Brady: "Point of Personal Privilege, Mr. Speaker."

4 Speaker Hannig: "State your point."

5 Brady: "Thank you very much. I'd just like all of our
6 colleagues to give a nice round of applause and thank
7 Representative Joe Lyons and Harrington's corned beef for
8 providing our pre-St. Patrick's Day lunch today. Thank
9 you, Representative Lyons."

10 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from Lake, Representative
11 Beaubien."

12 Beaubien: "Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to request
13 the tabling of House Bill 4128."

14 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that we table House Bill
15 4128. On House Bill 4128, Representative Beaubien moves
16 that we table this Bill. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed
17 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. The Bill is tabled. The
18 Gentleman from Macon, Representative Flider, for what
19 reason do you rise?"

20 Flider: "Point of Personal Privilege."

21 Speaker Hannig: "State your point."

22 Flider: "Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd just like to
23 announce to the Body with pride that last weekend, last
24 Saturday that the St. Teresa girls, the Lady Bulldogs team
25 won the State Class A Championship and also would like to
26 recognize them. We'll be recognizing them later. But also
27 to announce that St. Teresa is also the alma mater of our
28 colleague Representative Bill Mitchell. So, would like you

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1 all to congratulate St. Teresa on a great season, 33 and
2 0."

3 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady from Cook, Representative Howard, for
4 what reason do you rise?"

5 Howard: "Yes, I'd like to be able to table House Bill 4675."

6 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady moves that we table House Bill 4675.
7 Is there any discussion? There being none, then all in
8 favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. And
9 the Bill is tabled. The Gentleman from Madison,
10 Representative Steve Davis, for what reason do you rise?"

11 Davis, S.: "For an announcement, Mr. Speaker."

12 Speaker Hannig: "Yes, make your announcement."

13 Davis, S.: "The Public Utilities Committee scheduled for 2:00
14 o'clock this afternoon has been canceled."

15 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from Cook, Representative Rita,
16 for what reason do you rise?"

17 Rita: "Yes, Mr. Speaker, I'd like to table 4919."

18 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves that we table House Bill
19 4919. Is there any discussion? Then all in favor say
20 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. And the Bill is
21 tabled. The Lady from Kankakee, Representative Dugan, for
22 what reason do you rise?"

23 Representative Dugan: "Thank you, Speaker. I would like to
24 table House Bill 7046."

25 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady moves that we table House Bill 7046.
26 Is there any discussion? Then all in favor say 'aye';
27 opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. And the Bill is

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1 tabled. The Lady from Cook, Representative Munson, for
2 what reason do you rise?"

3 Munson: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I ask to table House Bill
4 4886."

5 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady moves to table House Bill 4886. Is
6 there any discussion? There being none, then the question
7 is, 'Shall the Bill be tabled?' All in favor say 'aye';
8 opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. The Bill is tabled.
9 Mr. Clerk, what is the status of House Bill 4462, on page 6
10 of the Calendar?"

11 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 4462, a Bill for an Act concerning
12 employment. Third Reading of this House Bill."

13 Speaker Hannig: "Mr. Clerk, would you move that Bill back to
14 the Order of Second Reading at the request of the Sponsor.
15 On page 2 of the Calendar, on the Order of Second Readings,
16 House Bill 393. Representative Mautino. Representative
17 Mautino. Representative Mautino, would you like to move
18 this to Third Reading, 393? Out of the record.
19 Representative McKeon. Representative McKeon.
20 Representative Coulson, on House Bill 3922. Would you like
21 to move that to Third Reading? Mr. Clerk, would you read
22 the Bill?"

23 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 3922, a Bill for an Act in relation

6 Speaker Hannig: "Okay, so just to clarify, you want 3922 to go
7 back to Second?"
8 Coulson: "Yes, please."
9 Speaker Hannig: "Okay, so, Mr. Clerk, would you..."
10 Coulson: "Sorry."
11 Speaker Hannig: "...move 3922, back to the Order of Second

8 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 5069, a Bill for an Act concerning
9 criminal law. Second Reading of this House Bill. No
10 Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
11 filed."

12 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Washington, on
13 House Bill 5105, from Second to Third. Mr. Clerk, read the
14 Bill."

15 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 5105, a Bill for an Act concerning
16 transportation. Second Reading of this House Bill. No
17 Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
18 filed."

19 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Washington,
20 excuse me, the Chair was in error. There's been a note
21 request on House Bill 5105. So, you'll have to file those
22 notes before we can move the Bill to Third. It doesn't
23 reflect on the Calendar because it was a recent request
24 that came to the well. You can check with the Clerk and
25 he'll tell you what you need to do. But the Bill has to
26 remain on the Order of Second Reading for the time being.
27 So, Mr. Clerk, return that Bill to the Order of Second

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1 Reading. House Bill 5889, Representative Osterman. Mr.
2 Clerk, read the Bill."

3 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 5889, a Bill for an Act concerning
4 public aid. Second Reading of this House Bill. No
5 Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
6 filed."

7 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Jakobsson, on
8 House Bill 6574, from Second to Third. Mr. Clerk, read the
9 Bill."

10 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 6574, a Bill for an Act concerning
11 freedom of information. Second Reading of this House Bill.
12 Amendment #1 was adopted in committee. No Floor
13 Amendments. No Motions filed."

14 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. On House Bill 6706,
15 Representative Mathias. Mr. Clerk, read the Bill."

16 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 6706, a Bill for an Act in relation
17 to aging. Second Reading of this House Bill. Amendment #1
18 was adopted in committee. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
19 filed."

20 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Bailey, on
21 House Bill 6811. Out of the record. Representative
22 Brosnahan, on House Bill 6813. Mr. Clerk, read the Bill."

23 Clerk Mahoney: "Hou... House Bill 6813, a Bill for an Act
24 concerning education. Second Reading of this House Bill.
25 Amendments #1 and 2 were adopted in committee. No Floor
26 Amendments. No Motions filed."

27 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Hoffman, on
28 House Bill 6846. Representative Hoffman. Okay. Out of

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1 the record. Representative Rose, on House Bill 7043. Mr.
2 Clerk, read the Bill."

3 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 7043, a Bill for an Act concerning
4 minors. Second Reading of this House Bill. No Committee
5 Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions filed."

6 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Bradley, Rich
7 Bradley, on House Bill 7057. Mr. Clerk, read the Bill."

8 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 7057, a Bill for an Act concerning
9 criminal law. Second Reading of this House Bill. No
10 Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
11 filed."

12 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading. Representative Mautino, for
13 what reason do you rise? Representative Mautino.
14 Representative Mautino, oh, excuse me, Representative
15 Molaro. Representative Molaro."

16 Molaro: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. We have a problem. I was
17 gonna table a Bill but I forgot the number of the Bill I
18 was gonna table. So, if we could come back to that order
19 later in the day."

20 Speaker Hannig: "Okay, we're come back to that."

21 Molaro: "All right, thank you."

22 Speaker Hannig: "Representative Steve Davis, for what reason do
23 you rise? Representative Davis."

24 Davis, S.: "At the request of the Speaker, I... I move to table
25 House Bill 4768."

26 Speaker Hannig: "4768, is that correct? Representative, 4768?
27 Okay. The Gentleman moves to table House Bill 4768. All
28 in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it.

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1 And the Bill is tabled. Representative Eileen Lyons, for
2 what reason do you rise."

3 Lyons, E.: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to table House
4 Bill 6703."

5 Speaker Hannig: "The Lady moves to table House Bill 6703. Is
6 there any discussion? Then all in favor say 'aye'; opposed
7 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. And the Bill is tabled.
8 Representative Mautino, for what reason do you rise?"

9 Mautino: "Sir, I'd move to table House Bill 4549, House Bill
10 4471, House Bill 5074."

11 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves to table House Bills 4549,
12 4471, and 5074. Is there any discussion? Then all in
13 favor of the Motion say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes'
14 have it. And the Bills are tabled. Representative
15 Molaro."

16 Molaro: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move to table House Bill
17 6570. That's House Bill 6570."

18 Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman moves to table House Bill 6570.
19 Is there any discussion? Then all in favor of tabling the
20 Bill say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. And
21 the Bill is tabled. The Gentleman from Fayette,
22 Representative Stephens, for what reason do you rise?"

23 Stephens: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move to table House Bill
24 4172."

25 Speaker Hannig: "4172, is that correct?"

26 Stephens: "Yes, 6680."

27 Speaker Hannig: "6680."

28 Stephens: "6796."

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1 Speaker Hannig: "6796."

2 Stephens: "And on behalf of Representative Steve Davis, 6877."

3 Speaker Hannig: "And 6877?"

4 Stephens: "Yeah."

5 Speaker Hannig: "Mr. Clerk, would you read House Bill 6846?"

6 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 6846, a Bill for an Act concerning
7 civil procedure. Second Reading of this House Bill. No
8 Committee Amendments. No Floor Amendments. No Motions
9 filed."

10 Speaker Hannig: "Third Reading."

11 Speaker Madigan: "Speaker Madigan in the Chair. Ladies and
12 Gentlemen, we need your attention, please. We've been in
13 the process of determining which Bills will be released by
14 the Rules Committee today for hearing before committees
15 this afternoon and tomorrow morning. And we're preparing a
16 list of Bills where the posting requirements will be
17 suspended. And we're prepared to go to the Rules Committee
18 with that list of Bills. But we have to know that we're
19 finished with requests. We've taken several requests today
20 and as soon as I finish this announcement we're gonna close
21 down the requests. Now this would relate to matters where
22 people still want Bills released by the Rules Committee.
23 Or they need to have the posting requirements suspended to
24 hear the Bill this afternoon or tomorrow morning. Again,
25 if you have a request for a Bill to be released from the
26 Rules Committee or for the posting requirements to be
27 suspended, we need to have it within one or two minutes
28 because we're ready to go to the Rules Committee and then

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1 we're gonna shut down the requests. We will do this
2 process again tomorrow for committees that meet tomorrow
3 afternoon and Thursday morning. Mr. Myers."

4 Myers: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I move to table House Bill
5 5153 and House Bill 6711."

6 Speaker Madigan: "Gentleman has moved to table House Bill 5153
7 and House Bill 6711. You've all heard the Motion. Is
8 there leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted and
9 the Bill is tabled. Mr. Mathias."

10 Mathias: "I'm not sure if this is the way that you would like
11 this handled. I have House Bill 7026, which is out of
12 Rules and assigned to committee and I'd like to waive the
13 posting notice for today's hearing."

14 Speaker Madigan: "Why don't you come up here."

15 Mathias: "Okay, thank you."

16 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Sacia."

17 Sacia: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. A request to bring House Bill
18 4458 and 4007 out of Rules."

19 Speaker Madigan: "The Chair recognizes Mr. Moffitt. Moffitt,
20 what is the Bill number? Mr. Moffitt, Mr. Clerk."

21 Moffitt: "House Bill 4779."

22 Speaker Madigan: "House 4779."

23 Moffitt: "I'd like..."

24 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Clerk... Mr. Clerk, what is the status of
25 the Bill? 4779."

26 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 4779 has been tabled."

27 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Clerk, where was the Bill assigned before
28 the Bill was tabled?"

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1 Clerk Mahoney: "House Bill 4779 was assigned to Local
2 Government."

3 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Moffitt moves to take the Bill from the
4 table. Those in favor say 'aye'; those opposed say 'no'.
5 The 'ayes' have it. The Motion is adopted. The Bill is
6 taken from the table and the Bill is currently assigned to
7 the Committee on Local Government, Mr. Clerk? The Chair
8 recognizes Mr. Giles."

9 Giles: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I offer a Motion to Table
10 House Bill 4482."

11 Speaker Madigan: "You've all heard the Gentleman's Motion. Is
12 there leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted and
13 the Bill is tabled. All right, Ladies and Gentlemen, we've
14 taken the last application. It will now take about 20
15 minutes to put together the Motion to suspend the posting
16 requirements. Representative Osmond."

17 Osmond: "Yes, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to ask permission to table
18 House Bill 4219?"

19 Speaker Madigan: "Could you hold just for a minute?
20 Representative Osmond, the number again?"

21 Osmond: "House Bill 4219."

22 Speaker Madigan: "The Lady moves to table the Bill. Is there
23 leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted and the
24 Bill is tabled. Mr. Black. Black."

25 Black: "Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. The... inquiry of the
26 Chair."

27 Speaker Madigan: "State your inquiry."

28 Black: "Did you say you'd cut off requests?"

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1 Speaker Madigan: "For today."

2 Black: "Could you just hold on, my administrative aid just
3 called and said we ran out of paper and I... I needed about
4 six more sheets printed off. Would that be all right?"

5 Speaker Madigan: "Good luck."

6 Black: "Thank you."

7 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Phelps. Is Mr. Phelps in the chamber?

8 Brandon Phelps. Mr. Phelps, did you wish to call House
9 Bill 3989? We thought we'd like to hear from you on this
10 today. The Chair recognizes Representative Monique Davis."

11 Davis, M.: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to table House
12 Bill 4073."

13 Speaker Madigan: "You've all heard the Lady's Motion. Is there
14 a leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted and the
15 Bill is tabled."

16 Davis, M.: "Thank you."

17 Clerk Mahoney: "The House Rules Committee will meet immediately
18 in the Speaker's Conference Room."

19 Speaker Madigan: "Ladies and Gentlemen, we need your attention
20 and we need the Members to be in their seats. And we need
21 quiet. The Rules Committee has reported a list of Bills
22 where the posting requirements will be suspended today for
23 Bills to be heard this afternoon and tomorrow morning. And
24 then tomorrow the posting requirements will be suspended
25 again for Bills to be heard tomorrow afternoon and Thursday
26 morning. Now the first thing we're gonna do is read the
27 Bill numbers for every Bill approved by the Rules Committee
28 for either today, tomorrow or Thursday. That's the first

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1 list. And so, we need you to listen closely to make sure
2 that your Bill number is on the list. Again, these are all
3 the Bills approved by the Rules Committee to be heard
4 today, Wednesday, Thursday. Mr. Clerk, read the numbers."

22 morning. Mr. Clerk, read the numbers."

23 Clerk Mahoney: "Assigned to the Labor Committee House Bill
24 4363, House Bill 4447 and House Bill 6869."

25 Speaker Madigan: "I believe the last Bill number is a change
26 from the first time you read it into the record. And... and
27 my record indicates 6869. All right, you've all heard
28 those numbers and Representative Hannig moves to suspend

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1 the posting requirements to permit the hearing of those
2 Bills in those committees this afternoon and tomorrow
3 morning. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Excuse me,
4 Representative Howard."

5 Howard: "I didn't hear my Bill number, Mr. Speaker."

6 Speaker Madigan: "The Bill number was?"

7 Howard: "4677."

8 Speaker Madigan: "4677?"

9 Howard: "Judiciary II - Criminal Law."

10 Speaker Madigan: "That's one of the Bills where we will suspend
11 the posting requirements tomorrow."

12 Howard: "Thank you."

13 Speaker Madigan: "Mr. Acevedo."

14 Acevedo: "Speaker, I also didn't hear my Bill number. House
15 Bill 4591."

16 Speaker Madigan: "Which committee?"

17 Acevedo: "Revenue."

18 Speaker Madigan: "Again, we'll make that Motion tomorrow. Any
19 other questions? The question is, 'Shall Mr. Hannig's
20 Motion to suspend the posting requirements be adopted?' Is
21 there leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted.
22 And the posting requirements are suspended for all of the
23 Bills read into the record by the Clerk. The Chair is
24 prepared to adjourn. Please be advised that the 2:00
25 o'clock committees will begin at 3:00 o'clock. And the
26 4:00 o'clock committees will begin at 5:00 o'clock. And we
27 will convene tomorrow at 1:00 p.m. Representative Hannig
28 moves that the House stand adjourn until Wednesday, March

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1 3, 1:00 p.m., providing perfunctory time for the Clerk.
2 Those in favor say 'aye'; those opposed say 'no'. The
3 'ayes' have it. The House stands adjourned until March 3,
4 1:00 p.m., providing perfunctory time for the Clerk.
5 Again, 2:00 o'clock committees at 3:00, 4:00 o'clock
6 committees at 5:00."

7 Clerk Mahoney: "House Perfunctory Session will come to order.
8 House Joint Resolution 59, offered by Representative
9 McGuire, is referred to the House Committee on Rules.
10 Introduction of Resolutions. House Joint Resolution 46,
11 offered by Representative Myers. House Joint Resolution
12 55, offered by Representative Poe. House Joint Resolution

14 Resolution 57, offered by Representative Bellock. House
15 Joint Resolution 58, offered by Representative Phelps.
16 House Joint Resolution 59, offered by Representative
17 McGuire. Introduction of First Reading of House Bills.
18 House Bill 7275, introduced by Representative Hannig, a
19 Bill for an Act concerning appropriations. There being no
20 further business, the House Perfunctory Session will stand
21 adjourned."
