Signed by Rod R. Blagojevich, Governor."

Clerk Mahoney: "Sixth Special House Session Resolution #1 and Sixth Special Session House Resolution #2 are introduced."

Speaker Madigan: "Representative Currie."

Currie: "Thank you, Speaker. I move for the suspension of the rules so that we can immediately consider the adoption of House Resolutions 1 and 2 of the Sixth Special Session."

Speaker Madigan: "You've all heard the Lady's Motion. Is there leave? Leave is granted. The Motion is adopted. Representative Currie."

Currie: "Would the Clerk please read Resolutions 1 and 2 of the Sixth Special Session?"

created a special committee for the question of fee-forservice. There are 20 Members appointed to that committee. The committee has been meeting for several weeks. has been a great deal of activity, meetings, discussions among the Members of that committee and Representatives and of the Governor's Office and the Department of Human Services. There are currently in draft form five or six memorandums of understanding between the committee and the Department of Human Services, the Office of the Budget and the Governor's Office. So, my point is that Legislature, and in particular the House, in Session has been addressing this issue for a great deal of time, with a great deal of energy and activity. And in my judgment, in light of all of that, there was no need for a Special Session called on this day for that purpose which will cost the taxpayers of the State of Illinois \$16 thousand that was not needed. So, my plan is to do as I've done in the past, adjourn this Special Session into the regular Perfunctory Session schedule, which has been adopted and made available to all of you. I do have some good news for almost all of you, because as I left the Governor's Office just this morning, he told me that he did not plan to call Special Sessions for Saturday, Sunday or Monday. But that he did call... he did plan to call Special Session for Tuesday. So, I think you can reasonably expect that you could leave today, return for a Tuesday Session. And so, Mr. Speaker, my Motion is that we adjourn this
