Eleventh Special Session House Resolution #2.

RESOLVED, that the Clerk inform the Senate that a majority of the House of Representatives has assembled, pursuant to the proclamation of the Governor, convening the Eleventh Special Session of the General Assembly, and are now ready for the transaction of business."

Speaker Madigan: "Representative Currie."

Currie: "Thank you, Speaker. I move adoption of the Eleventh Special Session House Resolutions 1 and 2."

Speaker Madigan: "You've all heard the Lady's Motion. Is there leave? Leave is granted. Mr. Hannig in the Chair."

Speaker Hannig: "The Gentleman from Cook, Speaker Madigan."

Madigan: "Mr. Speaker, my plan is to do as I have done in the past, which is to offer a Motion that this Special Session adjourn into the already established Perfunctory Session for the Regular Session. Once again, the Governor has issued a call for a Special Session where there is mothing that could be brought before the House relative to that Special Session. And as you can see from the chart in the front of the chamber, the cost of all these Special

Sessions has now risen to over \$200 thousand. explained this before, there was no need for the call for Special Sessions. There was no need for this expenditure of over \$200 thousand. We have been working cooperatively with the Governor's Office and with both chambers to try and resolve the issues remaining in the budget impasse. And everything could've been handled in the context of the Regular Session, but the Governor has chosen to take the path that he has followed, consequently we have spent over \$200 thousand needlessly. It did not have to be spent. And people are being called to Springfield, taken away from their constituents, taken down here to the Capitol Building where they could've been at listening to their constituents, asking their constituents do you think the State of Illinois should continue to borrow and spend money that it doesn't have and do you think that the state should continue to adopt budgets which provide for the expenditure of more money than the state would take in in a fiscal year? Governor has chosen to preclude the ability of the Members to take in that type of information from their constituents, rather he wants us here in the Capitol Building where the only source of information would be lobbyist, special interests and agency liaisons. unfortunately, we stand here now with yet another Special Session and I have in front of me the Governor's Proclamation for a Special Session for tomorrow, which was called at 12 noon. But relative to the Special Session

which is before us today, I now move that it stand adjourned to the already established Perfunctory Session schedule for the Regular Session."

Speaker Hannig: "You've heard the Gentleman's Motion. Is there any discussion? The... there being none, then Speaker Madigan moves that the House adjourn to the Regular Perfunctory Session schedule that has already been distributed to the Members. All in favor say 'aye'; opposed 'nay'. The 'ayes' have it. The Motion is adopted. And the Special Session of the House stands adjourned."
