- Speaker Hannig: "Representative Hoffman, it's your turn to say the Pledge."
- Hoffman et all: "I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
- Speaker Hannig: "Roll Call for Attendance. Your own switch only. Okay. Let the record reflect that Representative Currie and Representative Hamos are excused on the Democratic side. Representative Brauer, do you have any reports from your side?"
- Brauer: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. It's Representative Poe and myself and Jerry Mitchell would be here but he locked his keys in a gas station in a vehicle. So, he'll be a little bit late, but everybody else is excused."

- Clerk Mahoney: "WHEREAS, the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) began operation in 1947 and became the sole operator of Chicago transit in 1952 when it purchased the Chicago Motor Coach System; and
 - WHEREAS, the CTA is the region's largest transit operator, providing 154 bus routes and 8 rapid transit routes; and
 - WHEREAS, the CTA operates the nation's second largest transportation system, serving 1.6 million riders each weekday; and
 - WHEREAS, the CTA expects its ridership levels to increase by a compound annual growth rate of 1.5 % from 2005 through 2009; and
 - WHEREAS, the CTA spent \$403 million on capital programs in 2005, and the CTA is expected to spend more than \$1 billion on capital projects in 2006 and 2007; and
 - WHEREAS, the CTA has significant outstanding capital needs and reports that reaching a State of Good repair will require \$5.8 billion; and
 - WHEREAS, the President of the CTA has publicly stated that unless the CTA receives additional funding by September 16, 2007, the CTA will be required to layoff employees and increase fares;
 - THEREFORE, pursuant to Article IV, Section 5 (b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby call and convene the 95th General Assembly in a special session to commence on August 13, 2007, at 2:15 p.m., to consider funding for the CTA.
