- 9 <u>(a) Persons convicted of financial exploitation, abuse,</u>

- 12 of that elderly person, whether as heir, legatee,
- 13 beneficiary, survivor, appointee, or in any other capacity
- 14 and whether the property, benefit, or other interest passes
- 15 pursuant to any form of title registration, testamentary or
- 16 <u>nontestamentary instrument, intestacy, renunciation, or any</u>
- 17 <u>other circumstance. The property, benefit, or other interest</u>
- 18 <u>shall pass as if the person convicted of the financial</u>

- 20 provided that with respect to joint tenancy property the
