- 7 <u>Sec. 28.6. Legislative findings and declarations.</u>
- 8 (1) The General Assembly finds and declares that air pollution from fossil fuel-fired electric generating 9 plants creates a significant risk to human health and the 10 environment, that older plants have significantly higher 11 12 emissions because they are not required to comply with the requirements of the Clean Air Act imposed on new 13 plants, and that these risks can be significantly reduced 14 15 by requiring the plants to reduce their emissions to the more stringent levels required of new electric generating 16 plants. New fossil fuel-fired electric generating plants 17 can generate electricity at emission levels under 3 18 19 pounds of sulfur dioxide per megawatt hour, 1.5 pounds of nitrogen oxides per megawatt hour, and with substantially 20 21 reduced mercury emissions.
  - (2) The Board shall, on it own motion, in order to protect and preserve the environment while safeguarding health, propose rules to ensure that each fossil fuel-fired electric generating unit minimizes pollution to levels that are technologically feasible through modernization and application of pollution controls.
  - (3) By December 31, 2002, consistent with the best available control technology, the Board shall promulgate a final rule that establishes a schedule of limits on the quantity of sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides, and mercury

2	shall be permitted to emit per megawatt hour in each year
3	beginning in the calendar year 2007.

(4) By December 31, 2002, consistent with the best available control technology, the Board shall promulgate a final rule that establishes a cap on aggregate emissions of sulfur dioxide, nitrogen oxides, mercury, and carbon dioxide that all fossil fuel-fired electric generating facilities in the State shall be permitted to emit each calendar year.
