The school district must certify to the State Board of Education that 23 24 the certificate holder has successfully completed the required coursework. If exceptional circumstances exist, the 25 State Superintendent of Education may grant an additional 26 period of time to fulfill the renewal requirements for one 27 2-year period, as long as the maximum amount of time a 28 certificate is held is 8 years. Eligibility and application 29 for the additional period of time shall be determined in 30 31 accordance with rules established by the State Board of Education, in consultation with the State Teacher 32 Certification Board. Each school district that employs a 33 34 holder of a transitional bilingual certificate is encouraged

to provide mentoring by an experienced teacher during the first 2 years that the holder's certificate is valid.

3 An individual who completes 4 years of teaching after 4 receiving a transitional bilingual certificate issued and renewed pursuant to this Section qualifies for a Standard 5 Teaching Certificate, provided that the individual satisfies 6 7 the requirements for a Standard Certificate established under subsection (c) of Section 21-2 of this Code, including 8 9 successful completion of the Standard Teaching Certificate Examination beginning July 1, 2003. An individual who so 10 11 qualifies for a Standard Teaching Certificate without receipt 12 of an Initial Teaching Certificate must successfully complete the Initial Teaching Certification examination established 13 under subsection (b) of Section 21-2 of this Code. A 14 15 transitional bilingual certificate may not be renewed after the 4th year of teaching unless the certificate holder 16 satisfactorily passes the test of basic skills established 17 under Section 21-la of this Code before application for a 18 second renewal. Qualification of teachers. No one may be 4 Sec. 21-1. 5 certified to teach or supervise in the public schools of this State who is not of good character, good health, a citizen of 6 the United States or legally present and authorized for 7 8 employment, and at least 19 years of age. If the holder of a certificate under this Section is not a citizen of the United 9 10 States 6 years after the date of the issuance of the original certificate, any certificate held by such person on that date 11 shall be cancelled by the board of education and no other 12 certificate to teach shall be issued to such person until 13 such person is a citizen of the United States. However, the 14 15 State Superintendent of Education may extend this 6-year time limit for a period of 2 years if the person certifies his or 16 17 her intention to become a United States citizen and furnishes proof that he or she has filed an application for United 18 States citizenship. Upon the expiration of this extension 19 period, the State Superintendent of Education may grant an 20 21 additional extension of 2 years upon proof that the person's 22 application for citizenship is pending. If the person is not 23 a United States citizen by the end of this additional 24 extension period, any certificate held by that person at the 25 end of this period shall be cancelled by the board of education and no other certificate may be issued until the 26 person furnishes proof that he or she is a United States 2.7 28 citizen.

Citizenship is not required for the issuance of a temporary part-time certificate to participants in approved training programs for exchange students as described in Section 21-10.2. A certificate issued under this plan shall expire on June 30 following the date of issue. One renewal

- 2 official participant in an approved exchange program.
- 3 In determining good character under this Section, any
- 4 felony conviction of the applicant may be taken into
- 5 consideration, but such a conviction shall not operate as a

- No person may be granted or continue to hold a teaching
- 16 certificate who has knowingly altered or misrepresented his

- No one may teach or supervise in the public schools nor
