- 1 AN ACT concerning open burning.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Fire Protection District Act is amended
- 5 by adding Section 8.20 as follows:
- 6 (70 ILCS 705/8.20 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 8.20. Open burning.</u>
- 8 (a) The board of trustees of any fire protection district
- 9 <u>incorporated under this Act may, by ordinance, regulate open</u>
- 10 <u>burning within the district for the purpose of preventing and</u>
- 11 <u>controlling unreasonable fire risk. The ordinance must</u>
- 12 require that the district be notified of open burning before
- 13 <u>it takes place, but shall not require that a permit for open</u>
- 14 <u>burning be obtained from the district. The district may not</u>
- 15 <u>enforce an ordinance adopted under this Section within the</u>
- 16 corporate limits of a municipality with a population of
- 17 <u>1,000,000 or more.</u>
- 18 (b) The fire department of a fire protection district may
- 19 <u>extinguish</u> any open burn that presents a clear, present, and
- 20 <u>unreasonable danger to persons or adjacent property or that</u>
- 21 presents an unreasonable risk because of wind, weather, or
- 22 <u>the types of combustibles. The unreasonable risk may include</u>
- 23 <u>the height of flames, windblown embers, the creation of</u>
- 24 <u>hazardous fumes, or an unattended fire.</u> Fire departments may
- 25 <u>not unreasonably interfere with permitted and legal open</u>
- 26 <u>burning</u>.
- 27 (c) The fire protection district may provide that persons
- 28 <u>setting open burns on any agricultural land with an area of</u>
- 29 <u>50 acres or more may voluntarily comply with the provisions</u>
- of an ordinance adopted under this Section.
