- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act
- is amended by adding Sections 65.65, 65.66, and 65.67 as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (110 ILCS 947/65.65 new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 65.65. Mathematics or science teacher scholarships.</u>
- 9 <u>(a) Each year, the Commission shall receive and consider</u>
- 10 applications for scholarship assistance under this Section
- 11 and award scholarships to eligible applicants. The
- 12 <u>Commission may adopt any rules necessary to implement and</u>
- 13 <u>administer this Section.</u>
- 14 <u>An applicant is eligible for a scholarship under this</u>
- 15 <u>Section if the applicant (i) is a resident of this State and</u>
- 16 <u>a citizen or a lawful permanent resident alien of the United</u>
- 17 <u>States and (ii) is pursuing full-time undergraduate studies</u>
- 18 at an institution of higher learning that will prepare him or
- 19 <u>her to teach mathematics or science at the elementary or</u>
- 20 <u>secondary school level, with a major in mathematics, physics,</u>
- 21 <u>chemistry, biology, zoology, astronomy, engineering, computer</u>
- 22 <u>science</u>, or any other mathematics or science discipline as
- 23 <u>determined by the Commission.</u>
- 24 <u>All applications for scholarship assistance under this</u>
- 25 <u>Section shall be made to the Commission in a form as set</u>
- 26 <u>forth by the Commission. The form of application and the</u>
- 27 <u>information required to be set forth in the application shall</u>
- 28 <u>be determined by the Commission. The Commission shall</u>
- 29 <u>require applicants for scholarship assistance under this</u>
- 30 <u>Section to submit with their applications any supporting</u>
- 31 <u>documents that the Commission deems necessary.</u>

1 (b) Prior to receiving scholarship assistance under this 2 Section, the recipient of a scholarship awarded under this Section shall be required by the Commission to sign an 3 4 agreement under which the recipient pledges that immediately following completion of the studies for which the recipient 5 was awarded a scholarship under this Section, the recipient 6 shall teach mathematics or science at the elementary or 7 secondary school level for at least 5 years in a school 8 9 district in this State that is financially or academically 10 troubled, as designated by the State Superintendent of Education. Each year, the State Superintendent of Education 11 shall compile a list of school districts that are financially 12 or academically troubled, which shall be provided to the 13 Commission. As long as a school district is on this list 14 when the recipient accepts employment with the school 15 district, the recipient may fulfill his or her teaching 16 17 obligation with that school district even though the school district is no longer on this list. The Commission, with the 18 cooperation of the State Board of Education, shall assist 19 scholarship recipients in finding employment with financially 20 21 or academically troubled school districts in order to fulfill the teaching obligation. The recipient shall, upon request 22 of the Commission, provide the Commission with evidence that 23 he or she is fulfilling or has fulfilled the terms of the 24 teaching agreement. 25 (c) A scholarship awarded under this Section shall be 26 good for a period of 4 years while the recipient is enrolled 27 for credit at an institution of higher learning. The 28 scholarship shall cover in-state tuition and fees for the 4 29 years of study and a stipend of \$200 per month during the 30 31 third and fourth years of study. However, in calculating scholarship assistance under this Section for recipients 32 33 attending private colleges or universities, tuition and fees 34 for students at private colleges and universities shall not exceed the average tuition and fees for students at 4-year
public universities in this State for the academic year in
which the scholarship is made.

4 (d) If a recipient of a scholarship awarded under this Section fails to maintain a cumulative grade point average of 5 at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the end of any term during 6 the first or second year of study, the recipient may not 7 receive any additional scholarship assistance under this 8 9 Section. If a recipient of a scholarship awarded under this Section (i) fails to maintain a cumulative grade point 10 average of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the end of any 11 term during the third or fourth year of study or (ii) fails 12 to complete the studies for which the recipient was awarded a 13 scholarship under this Section the recipient may not receive 14 15 any additional scholarship assistance under this Section and the Commission shall require the recipient to repay the 16 scholarship assistance he or she has received under this 17 Section, plus interest at a rate no greater than the highest 18 rate applicable for educational loans made pursuant to Title 19 IV, Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, 2.0 and, if applicable, reasonable collection fees. If the 2.1 22 recipient of a scholarship awarded under this Section fails 23 to fulfill the teaching obligation agreed to under subsection (b) of this Section, the Commission shall require the 24 25 recipient to repay the scholarship assistance he or she has received under this Section, prorated according to the 26 fraction of the teaching obligation not completed, plus 2.7 interest at a rate no greater than the highest rate 28 applicable for educational loans made pursuant to Title IV, 29 30 Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and, if applicable, reasonable collection fees. The Commission is 31 authorized to establish rules relating to its collection 32 activities for repayment of scholarship assistance under this 33 34 Section.

1 (e) A recipient of a scholarship awarded under this 2 Section shall not be in violation of the teaching agreement 3 entered into under subsection (b) of this Section if the 4 recipient (i) enrolls on a full-time basis as a graduate student in a course of study related to the field of teaching 5 at an institution of higher learning, (ii) is serving as a 6 7 member of the armed services of the United States, (iii) is 8 temporarily totally disabled, as established by sworn affidavit of a qualified physician, or (iv) is seeking and 9 10 unable to find full-time employment as a mathematics or 11 science teacher with a school district that is financially or academically troubled and is able to provide evidence of that 12 fact. Any such extension of the period during which the 13 teaching obligation under subsection (b) of this Section must 14 15 be fulfilled shall be subject to limitations of duration as 16 established by the Commission.

18 <u>Sec. 65.66. The Excellence Around Teaching Scholarship</u>
19 <u>Program and Quality Bonus.</u>

(a) Each year, the Commission shall receive and consider applications for scholarship assistance under this Section and award scholarships, to be known as Excellence Around Teaching Scholarships, to eligible applicants. The Commission may adopt any rules necessary to implement and

administer this Section.

An applicant is eligible for a scholarship under this 26 Section if the applicant is a resident of this State and a 27 citizen or a lawful permanent resident alien of the United 28 States and (i) is pursuing full-time undergraduate studies at 29 an institution of higher learning that will prepare him or 30 her to teach in the public schools of this State and shows 31 outstanding promise for success as a teacher, as determined 32 by the Commission, or (ii) is pursuing full-time graduate 33

- 1 studies at an institution of higher learning that will
- 2 prepare him or her to administer or supervise in the public
- 3 schools of this State and shows outstanding promise for
- 4 <u>success</u> as a <u>principal or superintendent</u>, as determined by
- 5 <u>the Commission</u>.
- 6 All applications for scholarship assistance under this
- 7 Section shall be made to the Commission in a form as set
- 8 forth by the Commission. The form of application and the
- 9 <u>information required to be set forth in the application shall</u>
- 10 <u>be determined by the Commission. The Commission shall</u>
- 11 require applicants for scholarship assistance under this
- 12 <u>Section to submit with their applications any supporting</u>
- documents that the Commission deems necessary.
- 14 (b) Before receiving scholarship assistance under this

- 31 <u>calculating scholarship assistance under this Section for</u>
- 32 <u>recipients attending private colleges or universities,</u>

- 34 and universities shall not exceed the average tuition and

fees for students at 4-year public universities in this State 2 for the academic year in which the scholarship is made. The 3 maximum number of academic terms for which a recipient may 4 receive scholarship assistance under this Section is (i) 8 semesters or 12 quarters of undergraduate study or (ii) 5 whatever number of semesters or quarters of graduate study 6 that the Commission determines is proper, whichever is 7 8 applicable. 9 (d) If a recipient of a scholarship awarded under this 10 Section (i) fails to maintain a cumulative grade point 11 average of at least a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale at the end of any academic term for which the recipient is receiving 12 scholarship assistance or (ii) fails to complete the studies 13 for which the recipient was awarded a scholarship under this 14 Section, the recipient may not receive any additional 15 16 scholarship assistance under this Section and the Commission 17 shall require the recipient to repay the scholarship assistance he or she has received under this Section, plus 18 interest at a rate no greater than the highest rate 19 applicable for educational loans made pursuant to Title IV, 20 Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and, 2.1 22 if applicable, reasonable collection fees. If the recipient of a scholarship awarded under this Section fails to fulfill 23 the obligation agreed to under subsection (b) of this 24 25 Section, the Commission shall require the recipient to repay the scholarship assistance he or she has received under this 26 27 Section, prorated according to the fraction of the teaching obligation not completed, plus interest at a rate no greater 28 than the highest rate applicable for educational loans made 29 30 pursuant to Title IV, Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended, and, if applicable, reasonable collection 31 fees. The Commission is authorized to establish rules 32 relating to its collection activities for repayment of 33 scholarship assistance under this Section. 34

- 1 (e) A recipient of a scholarship awarded under this 2 Section shall not be in violation of the agreement entered into under subsection (b) of this Section if the recipient 3 4 (i) enrolls on a full-time basis as a graduate student in a course of study related to the field of teaching at an 5 institution of higher learning, (ii) is serving as a member 6 of the armed services of the United States, or (iii) is 7 temporarily totally disabled, as established by sworn 8 9 affidavit of a qualified physician. Any such extension of the period during which the obligation under subsection (b) 10 of this Section must be fulfilled shall be subject to 11 limitations of duration as established by the Commission. 12 (f) If a school district offers a bonus to a recipient 13 of a scholarship awarded under this Section who successfully 14 works in a high-need area for 3 years, the State, through a 15 Excellence Around Teaching Quality Bonus, shall match the 16 amount of the school district bonus. A "high-need area" 17 means an under-served subject or location or a low-achieving 18 school, as determined by the State Superintendent of 19 20 Education.

- 24 (a) Each year, the Commission shall receive and consider
 25 applications for scholarship assistance under this Section

 27 Teaching National Board Certification Scholarships, to
 28 exceptional teachers, as determined by the Commission, for
 29 the costs of undertaking the National Board for Professional
 30 Teaching Standards (NBPTS) certification process.
- All applications for scholarship assistance under this

 Section shall be made to the Commission in a form as set

 forth by the Commission. The form of application and the

- 1 <u>information required to be set forth in the application shall</u>
- 2 <u>be determined by the Commission. The Commission shall</u>
- 3 require applicants for scholarship assistance under this
- 4 Section to submit with their applications any supporting
- 5 <u>documents that the Commission deems necessary.</u>
- 6 (b) Prior to receiving scholarship assistance under this
- 7 Section, the recipient of a scholarship awarded under this
- 8 <u>Section shall be required by the Commission to sign an</u>

- 17 (c) If a recipient of a scholarship awarded under this
- 18 <u>Section fails to complete the NBPTS certification process</u>,
- 19 the recipient may not receive any additional scholarship
- 20 <u>assistance under this Section and the Commission shall</u>
- 21 require the recipient to repay the scholarship assistance he
- 22 <u>or she has received under this Section plus interest at a</u>
- 23 <u>rate</u> no greater than the highest rate applicable for

educational loans made pursuant to Title IV, Part B of the
