- 13 based nursing\_ program--diploma,--completion-of-a-practical

- 17 health, welfare and security of this State and Nation, and
- 18 consequently is an important public purpose. Many qualified

and potential nurses are deterred by financial considerations

from pursuing their nursing education, with consequent

- 21 irreparable loss to the State and Nation of talents vital to
- 22 health, welfare and security. A system of scholarships,
- 23 repayment of which may be excused if the individual is
- 24 <u>employed as a registered</u> practices professional <u>nurse</u> nursing
- or <u>a licensed</u> practical <u>nurse</u> nursing after obtaining an
- 26 associate degree in nursing, associate degree <u>in</u> of applied
- 27 sciences in nursing, or <u>hospital-based diploma in</u> completing
- 28 a---practical---nursing--education--program,--hospital--based

If in any year the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of scholarships to be awarded, the Department shall give priority in awarding scholarships to students in the greatest financial need, as shown on a standardized financial needs assessment form used by an approved institution who will pursue their education on a full-time or closest to full-time basis and who already have a certificate in practical nursing, a diploma in nursing, or an associate degree in nursing and are pursuing a higher degree. The Department-shall-consider-factors--such--as--the--applicant's family--income, --the--size--of-the-applicant's-family-and-the number-of-other-children-in-the-applicant-is--the--head--of-the household--in--determining--the---financial---need---of---the individual:

Unless otherwise indicated, these scholarships shall be awarded to recipients at approved institutions good for a period of up to 2 3 years if while the recipient is enrolled in an associate degree in nursing program, up to 3 years if the recipient is enrolled in a hospital-based diploma in

nursing program, up to 4 years if the recipient is enrolled 1 2 in a baccalaureate degree in nursing program, and up to one 3 year if the recipient is enrolled in a certificate in 4 practical nursing program. - 33 <u>Within 12 months after</u> Upon graduation from an associate

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degree in nursing program, hospital-based diploma in nursing or--hospital--based program, 2 in---professional---nursing, 3 baccalaureate degree in nursing program, or certificate in 4 practical nursing other program, or--eourse--of--study any recipient person who accepted a scholarship under Section 5 5 shall begin meeting the required nursing employment 6 7 obligation, --during -- the -- 7-year-period - immediately - following 8 his-or-her--graduation,--be--employed--in--this--State--as--a 9 registered-professional-nurse-or-licensed-practical-nurse,-as 10 each--term--defined--in--the--Nursing--and--Advanced-Practice 11 Nursing-Act,-for-at-least-one-year-for-each-year-of-full-time 12 seholarship-support-received. <u>In order to defer his or her</u> 13 continuous employment obligation, a recipient must request the deferment in writing from the Department. 2 Any person who fails to fulfill the nursing employment obligation requirement shall pay to the Department an amount 3 4 equal to the amount of scholarship funds received per year 5 for each unfulfilled year of the nursing employment obligation requirement, together with interest at 7% per year 6 7 on the unpaid balance. Payment must begin within 6 months following the date of the occurrence initiating the 8 9 <u>repayment</u>. All repayments must be completed within 6 years from the date of the occurrence initiating the repayment. 10 11 However, this obligation may be deferred and re-evaluated 12 every 6 months to-repay-does-not-apply when the failure to 13 fulfill the nursing employment obligation requirement results from involuntarily leaving the profession due to a decrease 14 15 in the number of nurses employed in the State or when the 16 failure to fulfill the nursing employment obligation results from total and permanent disability. The repayment 17 obligation shall be excused if the failure to fulfill the 18 19 nursing employment obligation results from the death or adjudication as incompetent of the person holding the 20 21 scholarship. No claim for repayment may be filed against the 22 estate of such a decedent or incompetent. 23 Each person applying for such a scholarship shall be provided with a copy of this Section at the time of 24 25 application he--er--she--applies for the benefits of such scholarship. 26

scholarship amount, the Department shall consider tuition and

fee charges at community colleges and universities statewide

and projected living expenses. Using information provided

annually by the Illinois Student Assistance Commission, 75%

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of the weighted tuition and fees charged by community 2 colleges in Illinois shall be added to the uniform living 3 allowance reported in the weighted Monetary Award Program 4 (MAP) budget to determine the full-time scholarship amount for students pursuing an associate degree or diploma in 5 nursing at an Illinois community college. Scholarship 6 7 amounts for students pursuing associate or baccalaureate 8 degrees in nursing at a college or university shall include 9 75% of the weighted tuition and fees charged by public 10 universities in Illinois plus the uniform living allowance 11 reported in the weighted MAP budget. Scholarship amounts for 12 students in practical nursing programs shall include 75% of 13 the average of tuition charges at all practical nursing programs plus the uniform living allowance reported in the 14 15 weighted MAP budget.
