- 1 AN ACT relating to academic centers of excellence.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 5 Metro East Academy District Act.
- 6 Section 5. Creation of district. The Metro East Academy
- 7 District, hereinafter called the District, is hereby created.
- 8 The territory of the District shall consist of the contiguous
- 9 territory within the boundaries of Madison and St. Clair
- 10 Counties. The District is created to attract and retain
- 11 academic centers of excellence, technology and research
- 12 centers, and such other educational resource facilities and
- uses as are permitted by this Act.
- 14 Section 10. Metro East Academy District Commission.
- 15 (a) There is hereby created a body politic and corporate
- 16 under the corporate name of the Metro East Academy District
- 17 Commission, hereinafter called the Commission, whose general
- 18 purpose in addition to and not in limitation of those
- 19 purposes and powers set forth in other Sections of this Act
- 20 shall be to:
- 21 (1) maintain the proper surroundings for academic
- 22 centers of excellence and related technology and resource
- centers in order to attract and retain therein (i)
- 24 training and continuing education facilities for
- teachers, administrators, and other educators, and (ii)
- 26 computer technology, distance learning and
- 27 telecommunication, laboratory, library, research and
- 28 related educational resource facilities as permitted
- 29 under this Act; and
- 30 (2) provide for the orderly creation and expansion

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of (i) various county, and local governmental facilities as permitted under this Act, (ii) other ancillary or related facilities which the Commission may from time to time determine are established and operated for any aspect of the carrying out of the Commission's purposes as set forth in this Act, or are established and operated to promote educational, technological, or scientific research and knowledge as permitted under this Act, and (iii) research and high technology parks, together with the necessary lands, buildings, facilities, equipment, and personal property therefor.

(b) The Commission shall have perpetual succession, power to contract and be contracted with, to sue and be sued except in actions sounding in tort, to plead and impleaded, to have and use a common seal, and to alter the same at pleasure. All actions sounding in tort against Commission shall be prosecuted in the Court of Claims. The principal office of the Commission shall be in the Village of Cahokia, and the Commission may establish such other offices within the State of Illinois at such places as to the Commission shall seem advisable. The Commission shall consist of 9 members, 4 of whom shall be appointed by the Governor (one of whom shall be a representative of private industry), one of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor of Cahokia, 2 of whom shall be appointed, one each, by the chairpersons of the County Boards of Madison and St. Clair Counties, and the other 2 of whom shall be the persons from time to time serving as the regional superintendents of schools for the Madison County educational service region and the St. Clair County educational service region. All appointed members shall hold office for a term of 5 years and until their successors are appointed as provided in this Act; provided, that as soon as possible after the effective date of this Act, the Governor shall appoint 4 members for terms expiring,

respectively, on June 30, 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007. The 1 2 other 3 appointed members shall draw lots to serve for terms expiring, respectively, on June 30, 2005, 2006, and 2007. Any 3 4 in an appointed membership of the Commission vacancy 5 death, occurring by reason of the resignation, 6 disqualification, removal, or inability or refusal to act of 7 an appointed member shall be filled by the person who had appointed the particular member, and for the unexpired term 8 9 of office of that particular member. A vacancy caused by expiration of the period for which the member was appointed 10 11 shall be filled by a new appointment for a term of 5 years from the date of such expiration of the prior 5 year term 12 notwithstanding when such appointment is actually made. 13 Commission shall obtain, pursuant to the provisions of the 14 Personnel Code, such personnel as to the Commission shall 15 16 seem advisable to carry out the purposes of this Act and the work of the Commission. The Commission may appoint a General 17 18 Attorney and define the duties of that General Attorney. 19

The president of the Commission shall be appointed annually by the Governor from the membership of the Commission. The Commission shall hold regular meetings annually for the election of a vice-president, secretary, and treasurer and for the adoption of a budget. Special meetings may be called by the president or by any 3 members. Each member shall take an oath of office for the faithful performance of his duties. Five members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

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The Commission shall submit, to the General Assembly not later than March 1 of each odd-numbered year, a detailed report covering its operations for the 2 preceding calendar years and a statement of its program for the next 2 years.

The requirement for reporting to the General Assembly shall be satisfied by filing copies of the report with the Speaker, the Minority Leader and the Clerk of the House of

- 1 Representatives and the President, the Minority Leader and
- 2 the Secretary of the Senate and the Legislative Research
- 3 Unit, as required by Section 3.1 of the General Assembly
- 4 Organization Act, and filing such additional copies with the
- 5 State Government Report Distribution Center for the General
- 6 Assembly as is required under paragraph (t) of Section 7 of
- 7 the State Library Act.

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- 8 Section 15. Grants; loans; contracts. The Commission 9 may apply for and accept grants, loans, or appropriations 10 from the State of Illinois, the federal government, any State or federal agency or instrumentality, or any other person or 11 entity to be used for any of the purposes of the District and 12 enter into any agreement with the State of Illinois, the 13 14 federal government, any State or federal instrumentality, 15 any person or entity in relation to the grants, matching 16 grants, loans, or appropriations. The Commission also may, 17 by contractual agreement, accept and collect assessments or fees for District enhancement and improvements, common area 18 shared services, shared facilities, or other activities or 19
- 21 Section 20. Property; acquisition. The Commission is authorized to acquire the fee simple title to real property 22 lying within the District and personal property required for 23 its purposes, by gift, purchase, or other form of transfer, 24 except the Commission shall have no power to acquire title or 25 any other interest in any property by exercise of the power 26 27 eminent domain; and title thereto shall be taken in the 28 corporate name of the Commission.

Section 25. Authority to construct or acquire. The Commission may, in its corporate capacity, construct or cause or permit to be constructed in the District academic centers

of excellence and related technology and resource centers,

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2 including training and continuing education facilities for administrators, and other educators, computer 3 teachers, 4 technology and distance learning and telecommunication 5 laboratories, and any other institution, facilities, 6 building, structure or other ancillary or related facilities 7 which the Commission may, from time to time, determine are 8 established and operated for the carrying out of any aspect 9 of the Commission's purpose as set forth in this Act, or as are established and operated 10 to promote educational, 11 technological, or scientific research and knowledge, or for any uses the Commission shall determine will support and 12 13 nurture facilities and uses permitted by this Act. All such structures and improvements shall be erected and constructed 14 in accordance with Section 49 of the Civil Administrative 15 16 Code of Illinois, and the Illinois Purchasing Act, to the same extent as if the Commission were a Code Department. The 17 Commission shall administer and exercise ultimate authority 18 19 with respect to the development and operation of the Metro East Technology Park on the former site of Parks College at 20 2.1 Cahokia, Illinois, and any extensions or expansion thereof. 22 In addition, the Commission may create and designate the 23 boundaries of a development area on lands within the District that are compact and contiguous to the Metro East Technology 24 25 Park, called the District Development Area. Within the 26 District Development Area the Commission may cause to be acquired or constructed commercial and other types 27 development, public and private, if the Commission determines 28 29 the commercial developments are ancillary to and 30 necessary for the support of facilities within the District and any other purposes of the District, after a public 31 32 hearing held by a Commissioner or the person authorized by the Commission to conduct the hearing. The Commissioner or 33 34 other authorized persons shall have the power to administer 1

oaths and affirmations, take the testimony of witnesses, 2 receive pertinent evidence, and certify the record of the hearing to the Commission. The record of the hearing shall 3 4 become part of the Commission's records. Notice of the time, 5 place, and purpose of the hearing shall be given by a single 6 publication notice in a secular newspaper of general 7 circulation in the Counties of Madison and St. Clair at least 8 10 days before the date of the hearing. In addition to 9 powers set forth above, the Commission may sell, lease, 10 develop, operate, and manage for any person, firm, 11 partnership, or corporation, either public or private, all or 12 any part of the land, buildings, facilities, equipment, or other property included in the District Development Area and 13 high technology park or the designated commercial 14 15 development area upon the terms and conditions the Commission 16 may deem advisable, and may enter into any contract or agreement with any person, firm, partnership, or corporation, 17 public or private, or any combination of 18 either 19 foregoing, as may be necessary or suitable for the creation, development, construction, reconstruction, 20 marketing, rehabilitation, financing, operation and maintenance, and 21 22 management of the District Development Area and any 23 technology park or designated commercial development area; and may sell or lease to any person, firm, partnership, or 24 25 corporation, either public or private, any part or all of the land, building, facilities, equipment, or other property of 26 the park or the designated commercial development area upon 27 the rentals, terms, and conditions as the Commission may deem 28 advisable; and may finance all or part of the cost of the 29 30 Commission's development and operation of the District 31 Development Area as well as any park or the designated 32 commercial development including the creation, area, marketing, development, 33 purchase, lease, construction, 34 reconstruction, rehabilitation, improvement, remodeling,

1 addition to, extension, and maintenance of all or part of the 2 high technology park or the designated commercial development area, and all equipment and furnishings, by legislative 3 4 appropriations, government grants, contracts, private gifts, 5 loans, bonds, receipts from the sale or lease of land for the б operation of the District and any high technology park or the 7 designated commercial development area, rentals, and similar 8 receipts or other sources of revenue legally available for 9 these purposes. The Commission also may defray the expenses of the operation of the District Development Area and 10 11 technology park, improvements to the District Development 12 Area and technology park, provision of shared services, common facilities and common area expenses, benefiting owners 13 and occupants of property within the District Development 14 15 Area and the technology park by general assessment, special 16 assessment, or the imposition of service or user fees. As to the entities eligible to be members of the advisory District 17 Member Council, such assessments or impositions may be 18 19 undertaken only with District Member Council consent as provided in Section 70. 20

21 Section 30. Revenue bonds. To obtain the funds necessary 22 for financing the acquisition of land, the acquisition or construction of any building hereinabove mentioned, and for 23 24 the operation of the District as is in this Act set forth, the Commission may borrow money from any public or private 25 26 agency, department, corporation or person. In evidence of and as security for funds borrowed, the Commission may issue 27 28 revenue bonds in its corporate capacity to be payable from 29 the revenues derived from the operation of the institutions or buildings, owned, leased, or operated by or on behalf of 30 31 the Commission, but the bonds shall in no event constitute an indebtedness of the Commission or a claim against the 32 33 property of the Commission. Such bonds may be issued in such

denominations as may be expedient, and in such amounts and at such rates of interest as the Commission shall deem necessary to provide sufficient funds to pay all the costs of acquiring land, the construction, acquisition, equipping and operation of buildings within the district, including engineering and other expenses. Such bonds shall be executed by the president of the Commission, attested by the secretary thereof and sealed with the Commission's corporate seal. In case either of said officers of the Commission who shall have signed or attested any of such bonds shall have ceased to be such officer before delivery of such bonds, the signature of such officer shall be valid and sufficient to the same effect as if such officer had remained in office at the time of delivery. The Commission shall furnish the State Comptroller with a record of all bonds issued under this Act.

Section 35. Internal and procedural audit authority. The Department of Central Management Services shall exercise the same powers in regard to the Commission as it exercises for Code Departments under Section 35.4 of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois.

Section 40. Sale or lease of Commission property. The Commission may sell, convey, transfer, or lease any title or interest in real estate owned by it to any person or persons, to be used, subject to the restrictions of this Act, for the purposes stated in Section 25, or for the purpose of serving persons using the facilities offered within the District or for carrying out of any aspect of the Commission's purpose as set forth in Section 10 of this Act, subject to such restrictions as to the use thereof as the Commission shall determine will carry out the purpose of this Act. To assure that the use of the real property so sold or leased is in accordance with the provisions of this Act, the Commission

1 shall inquire into and satisfy itself concerning the 2 financial ability of the purchaser to complete the project for which that real estate is sold or leased in accordance 3 4 with a plan to be presented by the purchaser or lessee, which 5 plan shall be submitted, in writing, to the Commission. 6 purchaser or lessee shall under such plan undertake (1) to 7 use the land for the purposes designated in the plan so 8 presented; (2) to commence and complete the construction of 9 the buildings or other structures to be included in project within such periods of time as the Commission fixes 10 11 as reasonable; and (3) to comply with such other conditions as the Commission shall determine are necessary to carry out 12 the project. Any real property sold by the Commission under 13 this Act shall be sold at its use value, which may be more or 14 15 its acquisition cost, and which use value 16 represents the value at which the Commission determines, after a hearing by the Commission or by a person that the 17 18 Commission designates to hold the hearing, that the property should be made available for sale or rental in order 19 that it may be developed to accomplish the purposes of this 20 21 Act. In determining the use value of the real property, 22 Commission shall take into consideration whether or not the 23 property is to be used by a wholly or partially tax supported body created under the laws of the State of Illinois, by any 24 25 of the State government or any political department subdivision of the State, by a charitable institution, or by 26 a private person or institution operating for profit; and the 27 Commission shall also consider the contribution that the 28 29 project will make toward the development of the District and 30 the furtherance of the purposes of this Act in determining such use price. However, the Commission may convey the fee 31 32 simple title to land acquired by it, without the payment of any consideration, to the State of Illinois, any political 33 34 subdivision thereof, or to any body politic and corporate or

1 public corporation created under the laws of the State of 2 Illinois for the carrying out of any function of the State. At any hearing for the purpose of the Commission's making the 3 4 aforesaid determinations, an investigation should be made and 5 such witnesses and documentary evidence examined as will have 6 bearing on the use value of the property to be sold or leased 7 as is herein provided. The Commission shall designate a 8 Commissioner or other person of legal age to conduct the 9 hearing, and the Commissioner or other person so designated shall give reasonable notice to the interested parties of the 10 11 time, place, and purpose for the holding of the hearing. The 12 Commissioner or other person designated by the Commission to hold the hearing shall have the power to administer oaths and 13 affirmations, shall cause to be taken the testimony of 14 15 witnesses and the production of papers, books, 16 accounts, and documents, and shall certify to the Commission the record of the proceedings held before him or her in 17 connection with the hearing. The record of proceedings shall 18 19 become a part of the records of the Commission. All conveyances and leases authorized in this Section shall be on 20 2.1 condition that, in the event of use for other than the 22 purposes prescribed in this Act, or of nonuse for a period of 23 one year, title to such property shall revert to the Commission. All conveyances and leases made by the Commission 24 25 to any corporation or person serving or using the facilities offered within the District shall be on condition that in the 26 event of violation of any of the restrictions as to the use 27 thereof as the Commission shall have determined will carry 28 29 out the purposes of this Act, that title to such property 30 shall revert to the Commission. However, if the Commission finds that financing necessary for the acquisition or lease 31 32 of any real estate or for the construction of any building or 33 improvement to be used for purposes prescribed in this Act cannot be obtained if title to the land or building or 34

1 improvement is subject to such reverter provision, which 2 finding shall be made by the Commission after public hearing held pursuant to a single publication notice given in a 3 4 secular newspaper of general circulation in the Counties of 5 Madison and St. Clair at least 10 days prior to the date of б such hearing, such notice to specify the time, place, and 7 purpose for such hearing, and upon such finding being made, the Commission may cause such real property to be conveyed 8 9 free of such reverter provision, provided that at members of the Commission vote in favor thereof. 10 11 Commission may also provide in the conveyances, leases, other documentation provisions for notice of such violations 12 or default and the cure thereof for the benefit of any lender 13 the Commission shall 14 or mortgagee as determine are 15 appropriate. If, at a regularly scheduled meeting, 16 Commission resolves that a parcel of real estate leased by it, or in which it has sold the fee simple title or 17 lesser estate, is not being used for the purposes prescribed 18 19 in this Act or has been in nonuse for a period of one year, the Commission may file a lawsuit in the circuit court of the 20 21 county in which the property is located to enforce the terms 22 of the sale or lease. In the event a reverter of title to any 23 property is ordered by the court pursuant to the terms of this Act, the interest of the Commission shall be subject to 24 25 any then existing valid mortgage or trust deed in the nature of a mortgage, but in case the title is acquired through 26 foreclosure of such mortgage or trust deed or by deed in lieu 27 of foreclosure of such mortgage or trust deed, then the title 28 29 to the property shall not revert, but shall be subject to the 30 restrictions as to use, but not any penalty for nonuse, contained in this Act with respect to any mortgagee in 31 32 possession or its successor or assigns. No conveyance of real property shall be executed by 33 the

Commission without the prior written approval of

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- 1 Governor. Commission property leased or occupied by others
- 2 for purposes permitted under this Act or Commission property
- 3 held for redevelopment shall not constitute "property" for
- 4 the purposes of the State Property Control Act.
- 5 Section 45. Notice to grantees and lessees. Prior to the 6 holding of any public hearing prescribed in Section 40 of 7 this Act, or any meeting regarding the passage of any resolution to file a lawsuit, the Commission shall give 8 notice to the grantee or lessee, or his, her, or their legal 9 10 representatives, successors, or assigns, of the time and 11 place of such proceeding. The notice shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the secretary of the Commission, or by 12 any person authorized by the Commission to sign the same, 13 14 setting forth any act or things done or omitted to be done in 15 violation, or claimed to be in violation, of any restriction as to the use of such property, whether that restriction is 16 17 prescribed in any of the terms of this Act or by any restriction as to the use of such property determined by the 18 Commission under the terms of this Act. The notice of the 19 20 time and place fixed for the proceeding shall also be given 21 to such person or persons as the Commission shall deem necessary. The notice shall be given by certified mail, 22 return receipt requested, addressed to such grantee, lessee, 23 24 or to their legal representatives, successors, or assigns, at the last known address of such grantee, lessee, or their 25 26 legal representatives, successors, or assigns.
- Section 50. Rules. The Commission shall have power to adopt reasonable and proper rules relative to the exercise of its powers, and proper rules to govern its proceedings and to regulate the mode and manner of all hearings held by it or at its direction, and to alter and amend those rules.

- 1 Section 55. Evidence. Copies of all official documents,
- 2 findings, and orders of the Commission, certified by a
- 3 Commissioner or by the secretary of the Commission to be true
- 4 copies of the originals thereof, under the official seal of
- 5 the Commission, shall be evidence in like manner as the
- 6 originals.
- 7 Section 60. Judicial review. Any party may obtain a
- 8 judicial review of final orders or decision of the Commission
- 9 in the circuit court of the county in which the property
- 10 involved in the proceeding is situated, or if such property
- is situated in more than one county, then of any one of such
- 12 counties, only under and in accordance with the provisions of
- 13 the Administrative Review Law. The circuit court shall take
- 14 judicial notice of all the rules of practice and procedure of
- 15 the Commission.
- 16 Section 65. Park land. The Commission may set apart any
- 17 part of the District as a park and may construct, control,
- 18 and maintain the same or may provide by contract with the
- 19 corporate authorities of the unit of local government in
- 20 which the park is to be located for the construction,
- 21 control, and maintenance of the area within the District set
- 22 apart as a park.
- Section 70. Master plan; improvement and management of
- 24 District; building regulations; zoning. The Commission shall
- 25 prepare a comprehensive master plan for the orderly
- 26 development of all property within the District. The
- 27 Commission shall so improve and manage the District as to
- 28 provide conditions most favorable for the purposes described
- 29 in Section 25. The Commission shall, by ordinance in the
- 30 manner hereinafter set forth, classify, regulate, and
- 31 restrict the location and construction of all buildings

1 within the District, shall regulate the height and size of 2 such buildings, determine the area of open space within and buildings, fix standards of construction, 3 around such 4 control, and regulate additions to or alterations of existing 5 buildings and prohibit the use of buildings and structures б incompatible with the character of the District, to the end 7 that adequate light, air, quietness, and safety from fire and 8 other dangers may be secured. However, the power herein 9 conferred shall not be so exercised as to deprive any owner of any existing property of its use or maintenance for the 10 11 purpose to which it is now lawfully devoted nor to limit the 12 expansion, design, location, maintenance, use, or occupancy 13 of real property to be used by any governmental body, agency, or instrumentality. 14

The Commission shall request the planning commissions of 15 16 the units of local government in whose territory the District is located to recommend appropriate zoning regulations for 17 the District. If, at the end of 60 days following such 18 request, an ordinance or ordinances have not been submitted 19 by any such planning commission to the Commission, the 20 21 Commission may prepare a zoning ordinance either with or 22 without the advice of any such local planning commission. 23 When such zoning ordinance is ready for adoption, Commission shall cause notice of a public hearing to be 24 25 posted in at least 4 conspicuous places within the District, at least 10 days before the date of such hearing. It shall 26 also publish notice of such hearing in some newspaper of 27 general circulation in the Counties of Madison and St. Clair 28 for 3 consecutive days. The hearing shall be held not earlier 29 30 than 10 days after the date of the last publication. Both types of notice shall contain the time and place of 31 32 hearing and the place where copies of the proposed ordinance may be examined. The hearing shall be held at the time and 33 place specified and shall be adjourned from time to time 34

1 until all interested parties have had an opportunity to 2 heard. The Commission shall invite the planning commissions for the units of local government in whose territory the 3 4 District is located to attend such hearing and shall ask for 5 suggestions of those planning commissions as to the 6 modification of the proposed ordinance. However, all 7 ordinances adopted by the Commission shall be subject to all 8 restrictions upon the use and maintenance of property within 9 the District prescribed by the zoning ordinances of the units of local government in which the property is located. 10 11 the adoption of such zoning ordinance or any other proper 12 ordinance of the Commission, it may institute any appropriate action to prevent or abate any unlawful act within the 13 Any government body, agency, or instrumentality 14 District. owning or occupying property within the District may consent 15 16 to be bound in whole or in part by the provisions of such master plan or development ordinance 17 adopted Commission. The Commission may establish an advisory council 18 19 of 2 representatives of each of the major district members owning or occupying facilities within the District totaling a 20 21 minimum of 500,000 square feet. Council members shall be 22 appointed by and serve at the pleasure of their respective 23 governing boards. The council may assist the Commission fulfillment of 24 its statutory purposes and 25 responsibilities and the maintenance of the District. At the Commission's request, the council may review and 26 make 27 recommendations to the Commission with respect to the comprehensive master plan to be adopted by the Commission or 28 29 any plan of development or occupancy of its facilities within 30 the District presented to the Commission by any governmental body, agency, or instrumentality. The Commission may upon a 31 32 unanimous request of the council provide for shared services and facilities within the District for members of the 33 34 council. The Commission may provide, contract, and construct these shared services and facilities so approved. The Commission may utilize any powers specified within this Act regardless of geographic boundary for or in support of a

regardless of geographic boundary for or in support of a

facilities and charge and collect fees necessary to supply

specific project, activity, or development if that request is

made by a unanimous recommendation of all of the members of

7 the member council.

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8 Section 75. Jurisdiction of units of local government. This Act shall not be construed to limit the jurisdiction of 9 10 any unit of local government in whose territory the District is located nor to impair any power now possessed by or 11 hereafter granted to any such unit of local government, 12 are expressly granted to the Commission by 13 except such as 14 Section 70 of this Act. The property of the Commission shall 15 be exempt from taxation, and shall be subject to condemnation by the State and any municipal corporation or agency of the 16 17 State for any State or municipal purpose under the provisions for the exercise of the right of eminent domain under Article 18 VII of the Code of Civil Procedure, as amended. 19

Section 80. Disposition of money; income fund. All money received by the Commission from the sale or lease of any property, in excess of such amount expended by the Commission for authorized purposes under this Act or as may be necessary to satisfy the obligation of any revenue bond issued pursuant to Section 30, shall be paid into the State Treasury for deposit into the Metro East Academy Commission Income Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury; provided, that the Commission is authorized to use all money received as rentals for the purposes of planning, acquisition, and development of property within the District, for t.he operation, maintenance, and improvement of property of the Commission, and for all purposes and powers set forth in this

1 Act. Beginning in 2003, not later than July 10 of each year, 2 the Commission shall transmit to the State Treasurer for deposit into the Metro East Academy Commission Income Fund 3 4 all moneys on hand on the preceding June 30 in excess of 5 \$350,000 without deduction or offset of any kind, except that 6 the Commission may retain such additional funds as are 7 necessary to pay enforceable contractual obligations existing 8 as of June 30 and which will be paid not later than September 9 30 of that year. All moneys retained for the payment of these obligations and not paid out by September 30, shall be 10 11 remitted in full to the State Treasury, without deduction or offset of any kind, not later than October 10 of the same 12 13 year. All moneys held pursuant to this Section shall be maintained in a depository approved by the State Treasurer. 14 The Auditor General shall, at least biennially, audit 15 16 to be audited all records and accounts of Commission pertaining to the operation of the District. 17

18 Section 85. Severability. If any provision of this Act is held invalid, such provision shall be deemed to be excised 19 2.0 from this Act and the invalidity thereof shall not affect any 21 of the other provisions of this Act. If the application of any provision of this Act to any person or circumstance is 22 held invalid, it shall not affect the application of such 23 24 provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid. 25

Section 90. Legal Advisor. The Attorney General of the State of Illinois shall be the legal advisor to and shall prosecute or defend, as the case may be, all actions brought by or against the Commission.
