- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,

- 4 Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by
- 5 changing Section 8-2 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/8-2) (from Ch. 38, par. 8-2)
- 7 Sec. 8-2. Conspiracy.
- 8 (a) Elements of the offense. A person commits conspiracy
- 9 when, with intent that an offense be committed, he agrees
- 10 with another to the commission of that offense. No person may
- 11 be convicted of conspiracy to commit an offense unless an act
- in furtherance of such agreement is alleged and proved to
- have been committed by him or by a co-conspirator.
- (b) Co-conspirators.

- 24 A person convicted of conspiracy may be fined or
