

1 provide, in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities
2 and prisons, printed information on the transmission and
3 prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually
4 transmitted diseases and referral information to
5 community-based-providers of HIV/AIDS prevention, HIV/AIDS
6 treatment, and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing services
7 throughout Illinois; (2) display in all public waiting rooms
8 of detention facilities and prisons an HIV/AIDS informational
9 video, produced by a national organization with expertise in
10 HIV/AIDS prevention; (3) provide written information on the
11 transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and
12 other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates upon
13 entrance to a detention center or prison and offer voluntary
14 HIV/AIDS testing to all inmates; and (4) provide written
15 information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS,
16 hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all
17 inmates just prior to their release from custody and referral
18 to appropriate community based organizations that provide
19 HIV/AIDS services and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing.

20 Section 15. Report to the General Assembly. One year
21 after implementation of this Act, the Illinois Department of
22 Corrections shall report to the General Assembly on the
23 effectiveness of this program in increasing voluntary
24 HIV/AIDS testing.

25 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
26 becoming law.".
