- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 21-27 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 21-27. The Illinois Teaching Excellence Program.
- 8 The Illinois Teaching Excellence Program is hereby
- 9 established to provide categorical funding for monetary
- 10 incentives and bonuses for teachers who are employed by

- 12 State Board of Education shall allocate and distribute to

Credit may not be granted by a school district for mentoring or related services provided during a regular school day or during the total number of days of required service for the school year.

shall be paid to each teacher who holds a Master Certificate, who is employed by a school district, and who agrees, in writing, to provide 60 hours of mentoring during that year to classroom teachers in schools on the Academic Early Warning List or in schools in which 50% or more of the students receive free or reduced price lunches, or both. The school district shall distribute 50% of each annual incentive payment upon completion of 30 hours of the required mentoring and the remaining 50% of the incentive upon completion of the required 60 hours of mentoring. Credit may not be granted by a school district for mentoring or related services provided during a regular school day or during the total number of days of required service for the school year.

Each regional superintendent of schools shall provide information about the Master Certificate Program of the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) and this amendatory Act of the 91st General Assembly to each individual seeking to register or renew a certificate under Section 21-14 of this Code.
