- (c) An Early Childhood Education Block Grant shall be 30
- created by combining the following programs: 31 Preschool

- 2 These funds shall be distributed to school districts and
- 3 other entities on a competitive basis. Eight percent of this
- 4 grant shall be used to fund programs for children ages 0-3.
- 5 (d) The general education block grant shall include the

- 29 <u>It is the intention of the General Assembly in enacting the</u>
- 30 provisions of this subsection (e) to relieve districts of the
- 31 <u>administrative burdens that impede efficiency and accompany</u>
- 32 <u>single-program funding</u>. The General Assembly encourages
- 33 <u>school boards to pursue mandate waivers pursuant to Section</u>
- 34 <u>2-3.25q.</u>
