- 8 Sec. 27-24. Short title. Sections 27-24 through
- 9 <u>27-24.12</u> 27-24.8 of this <u>Code</u> Article are known and may be
- 10 cited as the Driver Education Act.

- 12 (105 ILCS 5/27-24.9 new)
- 13 <u>Sec. 27-24.9. Parent or guardian-directed driver</u>
- 14 <u>education</u>.
- 15 <u>(a) A parent or legal guardian may elect to teach his or</u>
- 16 <u>her child's driver education course if the parent or</u>
- 17 <u>guardian:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) is a licensed driver;</u>
- 19 <u>(2) has not had his or her driver's license</u>
- 20 <u>suspended within the past 5 years; and</u>
- 21 (3) has never been convicted of driving under the
- 22 <u>influence of alcohol, drugs, or intoxicating compounds</u>,
- 23 <u>leaving the scene of an accident involving personal</u>
- 24 <u>injury or death, or reckless homicide and has never</u>
- 25 <u>received a statutory summary suspension of his or her</u>
- 26 <u>driver's license.</u>
- 27 (b) A parent or guardian electing to teach his or her
- 28 <u>child's driver education course must maintain adequate</u>
- 29 <u>records</u>, as <u>prescribed</u> by rule by the State Board, to
- 30 <u>demonstrate that approved driver education material was</u>

- 1 completed and must provide those records to the person or
- 2 company providing the driver education materials. The
- 3 parent or guardian must demonstrate proof of insurance to the
- 4 person or company providing the driver education materials.
- 5 (c) The student driver must spend the minimum number of
- 6 hours provided by rule of the State Board in classroom
- 7 <u>instruction and practice driving instruction.</u>
- 8 (d) Any parent or quardian-directed driver education
- 9 course must meet with the approval of the State Board.
- 10 (e) The State Board may not approve a course unless the
- 11 State Board determines that the course materials are at least
- 12 equal to those required in a school-based course approved by
- 13 <u>the State Board. The State Board, however, may not require</u>
- 14 that the classroom instruction be provided in a room having
- 15 particular characteristics or equipment or that the vehicle
- 16 <u>used for the practice driving instruction have equipment</u>
- other than the equipment required by law for operation on a
- 18 <u>highway.</u>
- 19 <u>(f) Before the State Board may approve a driver</u>
- 20 <u>education course</u>, the person or company offering the course
- 21 <u>materials must register with the Secretary of State to do</u>
- 22 <u>business in Illinois and must have professional liability</u>
- 23 <u>insurance</u> for the course materials and company being
- 24 <u>considered</u>. The company's insurance policy must include the
- 25 <u>State of Illinois as an additional insured.</u>
- 26 (g) The State Board shall supply to companies with
- 27 <u>approved driver education courses any applications and other</u>
- 28 <u>materials necessary for obtaining an instruction permit under</u>
- 29 <u>the Illinois Vehicle Code.</u>
- 30 (h) The rules adopted by the State Board must include
- 31 <u>requirements for obtaining approval of a driver education</u>
- 32 <u>course and for proof of completion of an approved parent or</u>
- 33 <u>guardian-directed driver education course.</u>
- 34 (i) Completion of a parent or quardian-directed driver

- 1 <u>education course approved under this Section is equivalent to</u>
- 2 <u>completion of a school-based driver education course approved</u>
- 3 by the State Board.
- 4 (j) Students participating in parent or
- 5 guardian-directed driver education courses approved by the
- 6 State Board must meet current academic requirements for
- 7 participating in driver education under Section 27-24.2 of
- 8 this Code.
- 9 (k) In order for a parent or guardian-directed driver
- 10 <u>education course to be approved, the parent or quardian must</u>
- 11 perform at least 50 hours of practice driving instruction,
- 12 <u>including 10 hours of practice driving instruction during the</u>
- 13 <u>nighttime hours.</u>
- 14 (1) The State Board shall make a listing of approved
- 15 <u>driver education courses available on its website.</u>

- 17 Sec. 27-24.10. Unauthorized transfer of a certificate of
- 18 <u>completion of a driver education course. Any parent or</u>
- 19 <u>guardian who knowingly sells, trades, issues, or otherwise</u>
- 20 <u>transfers</u> or possesses with intent to sell, trade, issue, or
- 21 <u>otherwise transfer a certificate of completion of a driver</u>
- 22 <u>education course to an individual, firm, or corporation not</u>
- 23 <u>authorized to possess the certificate is quilty of a Class C</u>
- 24 <u>misdemeanor</u>.
- 25 (105 ILCS 5/27-24.11 new)
- 26 <u>Sec. 27-24.11. Unauthorized possession of a certificate</u>
- 27 <u>of completion of a driver education course. Any parent or</u>
- 28 guardian who knowingly possesses a certificate of completion
- of a driver education course when he or she is not authorized
- 30 to possess the certificate is guilty of a Class C
- 31 <u>misdemeanor</u>.

- Sec. 27-24.12. State Board's response to possible
- 3 <u>violations. If a member of the State Board believes that a</u>
- 4 <u>company providing driver education materials or a parent or</u>
- 5 guardian has violated any provision of Sections 27-24.9
- 6 through 27-24.11 of this Code or a rule adopted under those
- 7 <u>Sections, the State Board may, without notice, order</u>
- 8 <u>appropriate sanctions.</u>
- 9 Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 10 changing Section 6-107 as follows:
- 11 (625 ILCS 5/6-107) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-107)
- 12 Sec. 6-107. Graduated license.
- 13 (a) The purpose of the Graduated Licensing Program is
- 14 to develop safe and mature driving habits in young,
- 15 inexperienced drivers and reduce or prevent motor vehicle
- 16 accidents, fatalities, and injuries by:
- 17 (1) providing for an increase in the time of
- 18 practice period before granting permission to obtain a
- 19 driver's license;
- 20 (2) strengthening driver licensing and testing
- 21 standards for persons under the age of 21 years;
- 22 (3) sanctioning driving privileges of drivers under
- 23 age 21 who have committed serious traffic violations or
- other specified offenses; and
- 25 (4) setting stricter standards to promote the
- 26 public's health and safety.
- 27 (b) The application of any person under the age of 18
- years, and not legally emancipated by marriage, for a drivers
- 29 license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under the
- 30 laws of this State, shall be accompanied by the written
- 31 consent of either parent of the applicant; otherwise by the
- 32 guardian having custody of the applicant, or in the event

- 1 there is no parent or guardian, then by another responsible
- 2 adult.

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- No graduated driver's license shall be issued to any applicant under 18 years of age, unless the applicant has:
- 5 (1) Held a valid instruction permit for a minimum 6 of 3 months.
  - (2) Passed an approved driver education course and submits proof of having passed the course as may be required.
  - (3) certification by the parent, legal guardian, or responsible adult that the applicant has had a minimum of 25 hours of behind-the-wheel practice time and is sufficiently prepared and able to safely operate a motor vehicle. Performance of the required number of hours of practice driving instruction provided for under Section 27-24.9 of the School Code is sufficient for compliance with this paragraph (3).
- No graduated driver's license or permit shall be 18 (C) 19 issued to any applicant under 18 years of age who has committed the offense of operating a motor vehicle without a 20 21 valid license or permit in violation of Section 6-101 of this Code and no graduated driver's license or permit shall be 22 23 issued to any applicant under 18 years of age who has committed an offense that would otherwise result in a 24 25 mandatory revocation of a license or permit as provided in Section 6-205 of this Code or who has been either convicted 26 of or adjudicated a delinquent based upon a violation of the 27 Cannabis Control Act or the Illinois Controlled Substances 28 29 Act, while that individual was in actual physical control of 30 a motor vehicle. For purposes of this Section, any person placed on probation under Section 10 of the Cannabis Control 31 Act or Section 410 of the Illinois Controlled Substances Act 32 shall not be considered convicted. Any person found guilty of 33 34 this offense, while in actual physical control of a motor

- 1 vehicle, shall have an entry made in the court record by the
- 2 judge that this offense did occur while the person was in
- 3 actual physical control of a motor vehicle and order the
- 4 clerk of the court to report the violation to the Secretary
- of State as such.
- 6 (d) No graduated driver's license shall be issued for 6
- 7 months to any applicant under the age of 18 years who has
- 8 been convicted of any offense defined as a serious traffic
- 9 violation in this Code or a similar provision of a local
- 10 ordinance.
- 11 (e) No graduated driver's license holder under the age
- of 18 years shall operate any motor vehicle, except a motor
- driven cycle or motorcycle, with more than one passenger in
- 14 the front seat of the motor vehicle and no more passengers in
- 15 the back seats than the number of available seat safety belts
- as set forth in Section 12-603 of this Code.
- 17 (f) No graduated driver's license holder under the age
- 18 of 18 shall operate a motor vehicle unless each driver and
- 19 front or back seat passenger under the age of 18 is wearing a
- 20 properly adjusted and fastened seat safety belt.
