

# Report to the Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission December 1, 2020

This report is submitted to the Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission ("RICC" or "Commission") in response to ILCS 20 605/605-1045, requiring the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) to submit a report not less than every 30 days, beginning July 1, regarding the status of current and proposed economic revitalization efforts in response to the COVID-19 crisis.

The report to the Commission provides a summary of the Restore Illinois plan and metrics and a summary of ongoing recovery efforts, including:

- Support to impacted businesses through grants, loans, and other forms of relief.
- Support to residents through job training and other services for low-income residents, such as LIHEAP and basic needs assistance.
- Targeted support in communities most impacted by this crisis through grants, technical assistance, and outreach.

The Illinois Housing Development Authority appeared before the Commission on November 24 to provide updates and respond to questions. The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) is scheduled to appear on December 1. DCEO's staff will continue to meet with the Commission as needed and provide any information requested.

# Restore Illinois

Central to Governor Pritzker's strategy for containing the spread of COVID-19 while encouraging a safe economic recovery is the Restore Illinois plan, as updated by <u>Actions to Combat a Resurgence of COVID-19</u>. Restore Illinois relies on core health metrics (COVID test positivity rates, hospital admissions, ICU and other hospital capacity indicators) to identify measures that business owners and residents can take to help reduce the spread of the coronavirus.

While this latest round of mitigations does not include a stay at home order, Illinois residents are urged to stay home as much as possible and celebrate upcoming holidays with members of their household. Residents over the age of two years are required to wear a face covering when out in public and social distancing is not easily achievable. Anyone exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 or who may have been in contact with someone exhibiting symptoms should seek out testing and quarantine at home; anyone who has tested positive for the virus should isolate at home as directed by their physician or local health department.

As they have since the start of COVID-19, grocery stores across the state will remain open and available. Child care facilities may continue to operate subject to guidelines from the Illinois Department of Children and Family Services. School districts and officials should continue to follow the extensive guidance released by the Illinois State Board of Education in August to make decisions related to in-person and remote learning at the local level.

IDPH will continue to track the positivity rates and hospital capacity metrics in regions over a 14-day monitoring periods to determine if mitigations can be relaxed, if additional mitigations are required, or if current mitigation should remain in place. In order for a region to move back to Tier 2 mitigations, a region must experience less than 12 percent test positivity 7-day average for three consecutive days AND greater than 20 percent available intensive care unit (ICU) and hospital bed availability for three consecutive days AND declining 7-day COVID hospitalizations average in 7 out of the last 10 days. # State of Illinois Support for Businesses, Communities and Families

Information below provides an update for program initiatives since the previous Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission Report was delivered to the Commission on November 1, 2020.

# **Resources for Businesses and Communities**

Given the significant challenges businesses face in the current climate, the State has established various business assistance programs aimed to help small businesses with the most urgent needs. These programs are designed to ensure assistance is accessible by all Illinois communities.

### Business Interruption Grant (BIG) Program – DCEO/IDHS

• Budgeted amount: \$540 million funded by the CARES Act.

#### **BIG for Small Business**

- BIG provides relief for costs or losses incurred by qualifying businesses due to COVID-related business interruption.
- More than 5,500 BIG grants (\$141 million) have been provided to small businesses in every corner of the state, including businesses in 526 cities and 94 counties. The program is guided by an equity framework which has yielded a diverse distribution of the grants, with an emphasis on support for communities and businesses facing the most immediate and profound business interruptions:
  - Restaurants and taverns: \$64.7 million to nearly 2,300 businesses
  - Downstate businesses: \$46.8 million to over 1,500 businesses outside of Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, and Will Counties.
- Businesses in DIAs: \$63.7 million to nearly 2,700 businesses in these geographies representing 45% of the total amount awarded to date. This is above the 30% minimum in statute. A list of eligible zip codes can be found at this link:

- Minority owned businesses: \$51.8 million to over 2,400 businesses
- The application period for the \$5 million of funding set aside for the Agricultural BIG program were closed on October 31. Applications are currently undergoing a fiscal, veterinary and legal review. The Department of Agriculture anticipates releasing pre-award letters for the Meat and Poultry Capacity Program by early December, with grants issued on a rolling basis in December.
- Nearly \$129 million of funding remains available through the BIG program and the State will continue to
  prioritize the hardest hit businesses in the hardest hit geographies. Additionally, DCEO continues to
  conduct heavy outreach to hard to reach populations and minority owned businesses statewide.
  Working with its team of community navigators, DCEO has reached out to 8,000 individual minority
  owned businesses, offering to provide technical assistance needed to apply and qualify for BIG.
- Applications opened on September 17 and are being reviewed on a rolling basis, with the expectation that all awards will be made by the end of the calendar year.

# **Child Care Restoration Grants (CCRG)**

- The BIG child care program received \$270M in funds to assist childcare providers across the state with
  reopening in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. The CCRG program is being administered by the Illinois
  Network of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (INCCRRA) and the Illinois Department of Human
  Resources (IDHS). Additional information regarding the CCRG can be found at the Gateways to Opportunity

- The CCRG has been administered in two distinct rounds of funding. The first round covered July-September and the second round covered October and November.
- Through November 24, the CCRG has distributed 4,987 grant awards to licensed child care providers in 95 counties across Illinois totaling \$259.3 million. The processing of applications is ongoing with two applications still pending. Another 144 have been deemed ineligible, but this finding may be appealed.
  - Grants have been awarded to 2,029 child care centers, 2,428 family child care homes and 537 group family child care homes.
  - The monthly average grant amount is \$24,809 for child care centers, \$1,475 for family child care homes and \$2,981 for group family child care homes.
  - o Forty eight percent of grant recipients reside in Disproportionately Impacted Areas (DIAs).
- When Round II of the CCRG is complete, all awardees from both rounds will be posted on the DCEO website.

#### **Rebuild Distressed Communities – DCEO**

- Rebuild Distressed Communities is a \$25 million economic recovery program using funds from the Rebuild Illinois capital plan to strengthen Illinois commercial corridors that sustained property damage as a result of civil unrest on or after May 25, 2020. Businesses not listed in those zip codes that sustained property damage as a result of civil unrest may still be eligible if they operate in an economically distressed area, <a href="listed here">listed here</a>, and may apply to have their zip code included.
- This program will reimburse the cost of or hire contractors to perform repairs for structural damages, including repairs to storefronts and entrances, improving electrical systems, and restoring exterior work for businesses that experienced property damage in economically distressed communities around Illinois. Local Initiative Support Corporation (LISC) and the Chicago Neighborhood Initiative (CNI) have been competitively selected to administer the RDC grant on behalf of DCEO.

- Top priorities will include small businesses, underinsured or uninsured businesses, businesses that have a
  high community impact, and businesses in communities that have experienced historic disinvestment. It
  also includes provisions to prioritize partnerships with BEP-certified contractors to do the repairwork.
- Applications will be accepted in rounds until funding is exhausted. Any impacted business may apply during any round.
- Round 1 closed on November 10 and applications are being reviewed by LISC and CNI now. DCEO expects
  the first funding disbursements to begin in mid-December. The program will have sufficient funds to
  operate a second round, which is expected to open in the coming weeks. For more information, <u>visit</u>

# Local Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Support Program (Local CURES) - DCEO

- Local CURES is a \$250 million local government reimbursement program supported by the Coronavirus Relief Fund using dollars allocated to Illinois through the CARES Act. All units of local government (as defined by the Illinois Constitution) outside of Cook, Lake, Will, Kane, & DuPage counties are eligible to apply.
- Local CURES can reimburse units of local government for costs that 1) are necessary expenditures
  incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19, 2) were not accounted for in the
  budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020, and 3) were incurred during the period beginning
  March 1, 2020 and ending December 30, 2020. Examples of eligible costs include PPE, staff time and
  other public health expenses.
- The Local CURES Support Program has created a \$15 million Economic Support Program. This program
  offers grants to local governments to provide funds to local businesses that have been negatively
  impacted by COVID-19. \$9.1 million of the \$15 million has been awarded to local governments for

- As of November 30, \$92.3 million had been paid to 362 LGUs. An additional \$43.4 million under review to 399 LGUs.
- To manage funds within the federal deadline of December 30, local governments must submit a survey indicating anticipated uses of allotted funds by December 1. As of Nov 30, 297 local governments need to certify then register in the portal. Another 139 local governments need to register in the portal. A list of these local governments is included in Appendix 1.
- DCEO has taken an active role in working with municipalities and counties to help them recoup the maximum amount of reimbursement since the program launched in August. To assist local governments with applying and qualifying for these funds, DCEO has held dozens of webinars, fielded thousands of calls and engaged in direct outreach to hundreds of municipalities, recently launching weekly office hours to help answer questions on submissions for payment in real-time. # **Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program – DCEO**

- \$20 million program using federal Community Development Block Grant funds for small businesses in suburban and rural counties across Illinois, providing grants of up to \$25,000 to small businesses in communities served by DCEO's Office of Community Development. - These grants will offer businesses of up to 50 employees the opportunity to partner with their local governments to obtain grants of up to \$25,000 in working capital.
- Approximately \$7.5 million has been awarded to date. DCEO will continue to make awards on a rolling basis as applications are evaluated and agreements are finalized. The Department expects to issue its next

batch of awards by late December.

#### Advantage Illinois Loan Payment Relief - DCEO

- Advantage Illinois (AI) is DCEO's loan participation program for small businesses. It partners with local banks to provide a low-interest option for small businesses looking to start up or expand operations.
- Since March, AI has accounted for 12 new loans worth a total of \$4.7 million. Nine of the 12 qualify as Fund for the Advancement of Minority Enterprises (FAME) loans, which can provide additional support for woman-, disabled-, veteran-, and minority-owned businesses.
- DCEO is encouraging and automatically approving adjustments to the terms of existing Advantage Illinois and FAME loans. These adjustments could include either 3 months of no payments or 6 months of interest-only payments. As of late November, 21 companies have received approximately \$483,100 in relief.

# **Support for Residents and Families**

The following programs were established to provide financial relief in the form of grants, emergency services, regulatory protection, and more to households and families facing hardships during this crisis

Help Illinois Families - Emergency Support for Households (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant and Community Services Block Grant) -- DCEO

- Help Illinois Families is a \$275 million program supported with both federal and state matching funds -including \$90 million from the CARES Act -- that bolsters efforts to provide food, rent, utilities, temporary
  shelter, medicine and other essential household services to lower income families impacted by the
  COVID-19 crisis.
- \$250 million has either been obligated to local Community Action Agency partners delivering services or is awaiting final approvals to be obligated. DCEO expects to receive remaining funds from the federal government over the next couple of months.
- Eligibility for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) in fiscal year 2021 has been expanded from 150% to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. Applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is exhausted.
- LIHEAP provides assistance to lower income households to receive assistance with home energy services, including heating and cooling.
- The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program supports projects that lessen poverty in communities; address the needs of low-income individuals including the homeless, migrants and the elderly; and provides services and activities addressing employment, education, housing, nutrition, emergency services and health.
- DCEO has launched a new remote application process that will provide applicants the option to begin the intake process online or over the phone with the assistance of a live agent. The State's new website and call center is accessible for all residents with assistance provided in English and Spanish, and other languages assisted through translation.
- Beginning with the June 15 launch of the Help Illinois Families initiative through November 21, DCEO has
  received 98,654 requests for assistance through the on-line pre-application form. Most-requested forms
  of assistance include help with utility bills (76,962 requests), housing costs (50,608), food costs (25,207),
  and water/sewer bills 24,454).

<sup>1</sup> Advantage Illinois was launched in 2010 using federal Small Business Credit Initiative (SBCI) funding. It has since been converted to a state-run program using "recycled" funds – essentially repayments from participating businesses.

- During the current program year beginning in July, DCEO has received 139,000 LIHEAP applications and approximately \$92 million in benefits have been paid or are in process.

#### Rental and Mortgage Assistance -- IHDA

- Per Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-72, landlords are prohibited from initiating eviction actions
  against covered persons unless they pose a direct threat to the health and safety of other tenants or an
  immediate and severe risk to property. A "covered person" is defined as a tenant who provides their
  landlord with a certification under penalty of perjury stating that:
  - They expect to earn no more than \$99,000 in annual income for Calendar Year 2020 (or \$198,000 if filing jointly);
  - They are unable to make a full rent or housing payment due to a COVID-19 related hardship including, but not limited to, substantial loss of income, loss of compensable hours of work or wages, or an increase in out-of-pocket expenses directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic;
  - They are using best efforts to make timely partial payments that are as close to the full payment as the individual's circumstances may permit, taking into account other non-discretionary expenses; and
  - Eviction would likely render them homeless—or force them to move into and live in close quarters
    in a new congregate or shared living setting—because they have no other available housing options.
  - Executive Order 2020-72 also prohibits the enforcement of eviction orders against all individuals
    unless they have been found to pose a direct threat to the health and safety of other tenants or an
    immediate and severe risk to property. The Executive Order does not relieve any individual of the
    obligation to pay rent or comply with any other obligation that they may have pursuant to a lease or
    rental agreement. This moratorium is in effect until December 12, 2020 (subject to further extension
    or amendment by the Governor).
  - o <u>Declaration form</u> and <u>FAQ</u> are available on the IHDA website.
- The **Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA)** program will use CARES Act funding to provide eligible renters impacted by COVID-19 with \$5,000 for back rent and prepay through 2020, or until funds are exhausted.
  - To be eligible, an applicant must have had an unpaid rent balance that began on or after March 1,
     2020 due to loss of income related to COVID-19 pandemic and have household income at or below
     80% of the area median income. The application period has closed.
  - For those who applied for Emergency Rental Assistance, application status notifications began September 10th and will continue through early December, when full disbursement of funds is expected. IHDA expects to ultimately fund nearly 50% of all rental applications received.
  - IHDA has approved over 30,117 applications and allocated \$150.6 million directly to landlords.
  - Due to a surplus from the EMA program, IHDA is projecting to assist an additional 10,000 renters than initially planned for a total around 40,000.
  - o IHDA has compiled a new FAQ to address the Emergency Rental Assistance program.
- The Emergency Mortgage Assistance (EMA) program will use CARES Act funding to provide homeowners impacted by COVID-19 up to \$15,000 to reinstate their mortgage and prepay through 2020 or until funds are exhausted.
  - To be eligible, an applicant must have had a past due balance or a forbearance balance that began sometime on or after March 1, 2020 due to loss of income related to COVID-19 pandemic and have household income at or below 120% of area median income. The application period has closed.

- For those who applied for Emergency Mortgage Assistance, application status notifications began
   October 20<sup>th</sup> and are expected to be completed by the end of December. IHDA expects to ultimately fund about 50% of all mortgage applications received.
- IHDA has preapproved 15,053 Illinois homeowners for help and is awaiting servicer processing/response.
- To date, IHDA has allocated \$44 million to help 5,711 homeowners.

# **Job Training and Placement**

The state offers a range of workforce training and assistance programs, which are being recalibrated to assist both employers and workers in the wake of the COVID-19 crisis.

#### Get Hired Illinois - DCEO

- In May, the Governor announced the launch of Get Hired Illinois a new portal designed to connect
  workers with available job and career training opportunities across the state of Illinois. Prospective

- More than 400 new employers have signed up for Get Hired since the website launched, adding 372 virtual job fairs and 20,571 job listings to the portal. In total, this portal provides Illinois job seekers access to nearly 60,000 jobs connected through the state's webpage.

# Coursera On-Line Workforce Training - DCEO

- The State of Illinois has partnered with Coursera, University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Northwestern University, and the University of Chicago to offer free online career training geared toward helping Illinoisans who have lost their jobs due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Free virtual training courses will provide training and credentialing that will help ready dislocated workers for jobs in Information Technology (IT) and other marketable fields. - TechReady Illinois is also included in the partnership with Illinois and Coursera offering a set of their courses through the Coursera Platform. The TechReady Illinois is an effort to help Illinois residents hurt by COVID-19 gain new digital skills at steeply discounted tuition rates.
- Since the beginning of June, 7,235 invitations were sent through Illinois workNet to individuals interested in taking courses on the Illinois IT Training on Coursera. Of these, 4,776 learners created an account and 3,798 enrolled in one or more courses.
- Enrollment for Coursera ended on October 31, 2020. Participants have until December 31, 2020 to complete coursework.

# **Disaster Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant -- DCEO**

- DCEO was awarded \$8,325,000 from the National Dislocated Worker Grant Program to prioritize services to
  individuals most impacted by the crisis, including low wage and traditionally lower skilled individuals who
  have been laid off or furloughed.
- Funds are being utilized to address immediate actions to stabilize families during this unprecedented time of
  work separation. Illinois will also utilize the funds to support humanitarian and cleanup recovery needs by
  providing Disaster Relief Employment.

Eight Local Workforce Innovation Areas (LWIAs) applied for and received \$8.1 million in funding to support
367 eligible individuals with Disaster Relief Employment, Occupational Training and Support Services; grant
funds have been fully obligated. Disaster recovery worksites are being established to assist communities in
their effort to mitigate COVID-19 spread, with 123 temporary workers enrolled to date at 30 disaster
worksites at nonprofit and local government office locations.

#### **Employment Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant -- DCEO**

- DCEO was awarded \$8,325,000 from the National Dislocated Worker Grant Program to provide workers with essential skills training and incumbent worker training targeted at specific industries (including but not limited to hospitality and restaurants) where low skilled and low wage workers who have been disproportionally impacted by this crisis.
- Illinois will provide employment and training services to dislocated workers to assist them in obtaining
  unsubsidized employment, adapting the types of services and the delivery of services to meet the changing
  economy and changing customer needs while following health emergency safety practices and
  requirements, including abiding by Illinois' Stay-at-Home orders.
- Eight Local Workforce Innovation Areas (LWIAs) applied for and received \$8.1 million in funding to support 930 Dislocated Workers with Career, Training and Support Services. These grants have been fully obligated and the grantees are started their intake and enrollment process with fifteen clients have been enrolled in IWDS.

# Apprenticeship Training Grants – DCEO

- On July 14, the administration announced a \$4.7 million investment to expand the Illinois Apprenticeship Program. This investment was made possible by a \$2.8 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor and \$1.9 million in discretionary workforce funds from the state. With this expansion, the Illinois Apprenticeship Program will receive total investment of \$20 million, providing the capacity to serve a record 17,000 participants in 2020.
- DCEO awarded grants to 25 organizations across the state to expand training programs and employer
  partnerships, with an emphasis on growth in underserved communities. These grantees are ramping up
  outreach efforts to expand Apprenticeships in Illinois. The program is ultimately expected to serve an
  additional 568 residents in training programs over the next two years.
- During the most recent quarter, the 25 Apprenticeship Expansion Grantees collectively engaged nearly 300 organizations and registered 79 new apprentices. Since these grants have just recently been issued, data regarding participation grows at a slower pace than most recognized workforce programs. Illinois is in the process of using U.S. DOL funding to create a system to better collect the data and track both employers and participants within the State.

# **Technical Assistance and Outreach**

Many of those that have been hardest hit by this crisis are also those that may have the most difficulty or least experience accessing government support.

# Office of Minority Economic Empowerment – DCEO

- OMEE promotes economic development opportunities for all minority communities across the state through targeted programs, resources, and advocacy.
- From March through late November, OMEE hosted 234 webinars and workshops with approximately 7,901 attendees regarding topics including DCEO COVID-19 State and Federal programs, Restore Illinois guidelines, the Business Enterprise Program (BEP), ongoing OMEE programming, general business support,

and other assistance as needed.

# Rapid Response Services for Layoff Aversion and Job Training - DCEO

- Rapid Response is a proactive, business-focused program to avert layoffs and plant closing through quick coordination of service and the provision of immediate aid to companies and their affected workers.
- When layoffs cannot be averted, laid off workers are connected to job training and placement services.
- Rapid Response teams have worked with 479 businesses since March to provide services to mitigate layoffs that affected approximately 73,943 workers. \$3.5 million in layoff aversion funds have been awarded.

# Regional Economic Development Outreach (Team RED) - DCEO

- DCEO has conducted extensive outreach to a wide range of constituencies to ensure businesses are familiar
  with available programs and assistance. Through November 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020, DCEO has conducted COVID-19
  related outreach for at least 12,083 small businesses, 994 local Chambers of Commerce and 1,456 economic
  development organizations.
- Team RED has also launched outreach to local units of government regarding CURE program assistance. This outreach includes emails to approximately 7,319 special taxing districts, 2,032 phone calls and webinars for a collective 7,780 attendees.
