Final Report to the Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission December 31, 2020

This report is submitted to the Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission (“RICC” or “Commission”) pursuant to ILCS 20 605/605-1045, requiring the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) to submit a report not less than every 30 days, beginning July 1, regarding the status of current and proposed economic revitalization efforts in response to the COVID-19 crisis.

The report to the Commission provides a summary of the Restore Illinois plan and metrics and a summary of ongoing recovery efforts, including:

- Support to impacted businesses through grants, loans, and other forms of relief.
- Support to residents through job training and other services for low-income residents, such as LIHEAP and basic needs assistance.
- Targeted support in communities most impacted by this crisis through grants, technical assistance, and outreach.

DCEO appeared before the Commission on December 1 and the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) appeared before the Commission on December 22 to provide updates and respond to questions. DCEO’s staff will continue to meet with members of the General Assembly as needed and provide any information requested.

Restore Illinois

Central to Governor Pritzker’s strategy for containing the spread of COVID-19 while encouraging a safe economic recovery is the Restore Illinois plan, as updated by [Actions to Combat a Resurgence of COVID-19](#). Restore Illinois relies on core health metrics (COVID test positivity rates, hospital admissions, ICU and other hospital capacity indicators) to identify measures that business owners and residents can take to help reduce the spread of the coronavirus.

With a new wave of COVID-19 surging across the state of Illinois, the Midwest and the nation, Governor Pritzker and IDPH adopted new Tier 3 statewide COVID-19 resurgence mitigations effective November 20 to slow the spread of the virus. Tier 3 mitigations build on the Resurgence Mitigation Plan released in July to suppress the spread of the virus and prevent hospitals from becoming overrun. This latest round of mitigations aims to limit gatherings and encourages residents to stay home as much as possible and follow proper safety measures when out in public. The mitigations carefully balance the paramount goal of saving lives while preserving the option for in-person learning for children and protecting as much of the economy as possible from the continued impacts of the virus.

Since Tier 3 mitigations were implemented, test positivity rates statewide have declined steadily, with the statewide seven-day rolling average declining to 7.2% by December 23 and regional averages now below 10% in eight of the eleven regions. IDPH and the Governor have indicated that while the overall health metrics have shown improvement, significant risks remain should hospitalizations rise in the wake of the holiday season. Going forward, IDPH will continue to track regional positivity rates and hospital capacity metrics over 14-day monitoring periods.¹ However, any consideration of plans to relax Tier 3 mitigations based on regional health data will be deferred until the new year.

Another welcome development is the rollout of COVID-19 vaccine distribution in Illinois. The vaccines are critical for safely recovering from this pandemic and beginning Phase 5 of the Restore Illinois plan. Through efficient and effective distribution of vaccines, we can suppress the spread of the virus, foster economic recovery, and save lives. More than 100,000 doses were administered by December 24, the most of any state. Initial supplies will be limited and therefore allocated to health care personnel and residents and staff at long-term care facilities. However, vaccine supplies will increase over time and all adults should be able to be vaccinated in 2021.

State of Illinois Support for Businesses, Communities and Families

Information below provides an update for program initiatives since the previous Restore Illinois Collaborative Commission Report was delivered to the Commission on December 1, 2020.

Resources for Businesses and Communities

Given the significant challenges businesses face in the current climate, the State has established various business assistance programs aimed to help small businesses with the most urgent needs. These programs are designed to ensure assistance is accessible by all Illinois communities.

Business Interruption Grant (BIG) Program – DCEO/IDHS

- Budgeted amount: \$560 million funded by the CARES Act.

BIG for Small Business

- BIG provides relief for costs or losses incurred by qualifying businesses due to COVID-related business interruption.
- As of December 22, more than 8,300 BIG grants (\$245 million) have been provided to small businesses in every corner of the state, including businesses in 98 counties and over 600 cities and towns. The program is guided by an equity framework which has yielded a diverse distribution of the grants, with an emphasis on support for communities and businesses facing the most immediate and profound business interruptions:
 - Restaurants and taverns: \$109 million to more than 3,300 businesses
 - Downstate businesses: \$99 million to more than 2,900 businesses outside of Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, and Will Counties.
- Businesses in DIAs: \$109 million to nearly 4,000 businesses in these geographies, representing 44% of the total amount awarded to date. This is above the 30% minimum in statute. A list of eligible zip codes can be found at this link:

- Minority-owned businesses: \$79 million to more than 3,300 businesses
- The application period for the \$5 million of funding set aside for the Agricultural BIG program has closed. The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA) has conducted extensive outreach to small agricultural operations to provide technical assistance and began making awards on a rolling basis in December.
 - Thirteen Agriculture BIG applications totaling \$60,000 have been approved and submitted for disbursement. An additional 654 applications are being processed.
 - Two Swine Depopulation Program applications for slightly above \$15,000 total have been funded.
 - Thirty-seven Meat and Poultry Capacity Program applications totaling \$892,000 have been approved and 21 applications \$492,000 submitted for disbursement of funds with vouchers in progress.
- DCEO conducted heavy outreach to hard-to-reach populations and minority-owned businesses statewide. Working with its team of community navigators, DCEO reached out to 8,000 individual minority-owned businesses, offering to provide technical assistance needed to apply and qualify for BIG.
- Applications opened on September 17 and were reviewed on a rolling basis until the application window was closed on December 15.
- Notifications for the final BIG awards were delivered on December 30, and funds will be disbursed to those businesses during the first week of January. DCEO will post updated information on grantees on its website once all funds are disbursed.

Child Care Restoration Grants (CCRG)

- The BIG child care program received \$290 million in funds to assist childcare providers across the state with reopening in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. The CCRG program is being administered by the Illinois Network of Child Care Resource and Referral Agencies (INCCRRA) and the Illinois Department of Human Resources (IDHS). - The CCRG has been administered in three distinct rounds of funding. The first round covered July-September and the second round covered October and November. A third round of funds was released in December to a smaller pool of recipients.
- The third round released the \$2.3 million in remaining funds to a smaller pool of recipients.
 - 305 licensed providers received a one-month grant for December expenses.
 - The 305 providers represented NEW applicants in Round II of the CCRG (meaning they did not apply/receive a grant in the first round of grants covering the months July – September).
 - No application was required for this funding. If providers received a grant in Round II for the first time and met the reporting requirements, they were notified the week of December 14 of the December award.
- Through December 22, the CCRG has distributed 4,995 grant awards to licensed child care

providers in 95 counties across Illinois totaling \$267 million. Some awards are still pending due to missing documentation.

- CCRG has met or exceeded all targets for DIA and downstate investments and each senate district has providers who have successfully participated in the program.
 - 2,030 child care centers have been awarded a grant.
 - 2,428 family child care home providers have received a grant.
 - 537 group family child care home providers have received a grant.
- When CCRG is complete, all awardees will be posted on the DCEO website.
- The administration has allocated an additional \$20 million to the CCRG program for an additional round of grants.
- Funds must be obligated before December 30
- Because Family Child Care Home providers are returning to full licensed capacity in December, this final round of CCRG will go to licensed center-based providers only.
- Funding will cover Child Care Assistance Program payments for December, January, and February
- Notices of award will go out prior to the December 30 deadline but checks will not be issued until February due to a capacity issue on the part of the third-party administrator.

Rebuild Distressed Communities – DCEO

- Rebuild Distressed Communities is a \$25 million economic recovery program using funds from the Rebuild Illinois capital plan to strengthen Illinois commercial corridors that sustained property damage as a result of civil unrest on or after May 25, 2020. Businesses not listed in those zip codes that sustained property damage as a result of civil unrest may still be eligible if they operate in an economically distressed area, [listed here](#), and may apply to have their zip code included.
- This program will reimburse the cost of or hire contractors to perform repairs for structural damages, including repairs to storefronts and entrances, improving electrical systems, and restoring exterior work for businesses that experienced property damage in economically distressed communities around Illinois. Local Initiative Support Corporation (LISC) and the Chicago Neighborhood Initiative (CNI) have been competitively selected to administer the RDC grant on behalf of DCEO.
- Top priorities will include small businesses, underinsured or uninsured businesses, businesses that have a high community impact, and businesses in communities that have experienced historic disinvestment. It also includes provisions to prioritize partnerships with BEP-certified contractors to do the repair work.
- Applications will be accepted in rounds until funding is exhausted. Any impacted business may apply during any round.
- Round 2 opened on December 21 and will close at 5 p.m. on January 21. DCEO and its grant partners are conducting technical assistance webinars in English and Spanish for potential applicants.
- Round 1 closed on November 10 and applications are currently under review by LISC and CNI now. DCEO expects the first funding disbursements to begin in mid-January.

Local Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Support Program (Local CURES) – DCEO

- Local CURES is a \$250 million local government reimbursement program supported by the

Coronavirus Relief Fund using dollars allocated to Illinois through the CARES Act. All units of local government (as defined by the Illinois Constitution) outside of Cook, Lake, Will, Kane, & DuPage counties are eligible to apply.

- Local CURES can reimburse units of local government for costs that 1) are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19, 2) were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020, and 3) were incurred during the period beginning March 1, 2020 and ending December 30, 2020. Examples of eligible costs include PPE, staff time and other public health expenses.
- The Economic Support Program has exhausted its initial \$15 million and has received an additional allocation of \$3.4 million. This program offers grants to local governments to provide funds to local businesses that have been negatively impacted by COVID-19. - As of December 28, \$143.9 million had been paid to 555 local units of government. An additional \$38.3 million to 151 local governments is under review.

Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program – DCEO

- \$20 million program using federal Community Development Block Grant funds for small businesses in suburban and rural counties across Illinois, providing grants of up to \$25,000 to small businesses in communities served by DCEO's Office of Community Development. - These grants will offer businesses of up to 50 employees the opportunity to partner with their local governments to obtain grants of up to \$25,000 in working capital.
- Approximately \$7.5 million has been awarded to date. DCEO will continue to make awards on a rolling basis as applications are evaluated and agreements are finalized. The Department expects to issue its next batch of awards by early January.

Advantage Illinois Loan Payment Relief – DCEO

- Advantage Illinois (AI) is DCEO's loan participation program for small businesses. It partners with local banks to provide a low-interest option for small businesses looking to start up or expand operations.
- Since March, AI has accounted for 15 new loans worth a total of \$5.1 million. Twelve of the 15 qualify as Fund for the Advancement of Minority Enterprises (FAME) loans, which can provide additional support for woman-, disabled-, veteran-, and minority-owned businesses.
- DCEO is encouraging and automatically approving adjustments to the terms of existing Advantage Illinois and FAME loans. These adjustments could include either 3 months of no payments or 6 months of interest-only payments. As of late December, 22 companies have received approximately \$503,350 in relief.

Support for Residents and Families

The following programs were established to provide financial relief in the form of grants, emergency services, regulatory protection, and more to households and families facing hardships during this crisis

Help Illinois Families - Emergency Support for Households (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant and Community Services Block Grant) -- DCEO

- Help Illinois Families is a \$275 million program supported with both federal and state matching funds -- including \$90 million from the CARES Act -- that bolsters efforts to provide food, rent, utilities, temporary shelter, medicine and other essential household services to lower income families impacted by the COVID-19 crisis.
- \$250 million has either been obligated to local Community Action Agency partners delivering services or is awaiting final approvals to be obligated. DCEO expects to receive remaining funds from the federal government over the next couple of months.
- Eligibility for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) in fiscal year 2021 has been expanded from 150% to 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. Applicants will be served on a first-come, first-served basis until funding is exhausted.
- LIHEAP provides assistance to lower income households to receive assistance with home energy services, including heating and cooling.
- The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) program supports projects that lessen poverty in communities; address the needs of low-income individuals including the homeless, migrants and the elderly; and provides services and activities addressing employment, education, housing, nutrition, emergency services and health.
- DCEO has launched a new remote application process that will provide applicants the option to begin the intake process online or over the phone with the assistance of a live agent. The State's new website and call center is accessible for all residents – with assistance provided in English and Spanish, and other languages assisted through translation.
- Beginning with the June 15 launch of the Help Illinois Families initiative through December 21, DCEO has received 117,611 requests for assistance through the on-line pre-application form. Most-requested forms of assistance include help with utility bills (93,509 requests), housing costs (59,058), food costs (28,888), and water/sewer bills 28,358).
- During the current program year beginning in July, DCEO has received 189,000 LIHEAP applications and approximately \$120 million in benefits have been paid or are in process.

Rental and Mortgage Assistance -- IHDA

- Per Governor Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-72, landlords are prohibited from initiating eviction actions against covered persons unless they pose a direct threat to the health and safety of other tenants or an immediate and severe risk to property. A "covered person" is defined as a tenant who provides their landlord with a certification under penalty of perjury stating that:
 - They expect to earn no more than \$99,000 in annual income for Calendar Year 2020 (or \$198,000 if filing jointly);
 - They are unable to make a full rent or housing payment due to a COVID-19 related hardship including, but not limited to, substantial loss of income, loss of compensable hours of work or wages, or an increase in out-of-pocket expenses directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic;

- They are using best efforts to make timely partial payments that are as close to the full payment as the individual's circumstances may permit, taking into account other non-discretionary expenses; and
- Eviction would likely render them homeless—or force them to move into and live in close quarters in a new congregate or shared living setting—because they have no other available housing options.
- Executive Order 2020-72 also prohibits the enforcement of eviction orders against all individuals unless they have been found to pose a direct threat to the health and safety of other tenants or an immediate and severe risk to property. The Executive Order does not relieve any individual of the obligation to pay rent or comply with any other obligation that they may have pursuant to a lease or rental agreement. This moratorium is in effect until January 9, 2021 (subject to further extension or amendment by the Governor).

- The **Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA)** program is using CARES Act funding to provide eligible renters impacted by COVID-19 with \$5,000 for back rent and prepay through 2020, or until funds are exhausted. Including newly committed dollars noted below, the program allocates \$226 million in CARES funding to provide this assistance
 - To be eligible, an applicant must have had an unpaid rent balance that began on or after March 1, 2020 due to loss of income related to the COVID-19 pandemic and have household income at or below 80% of the area median income. The application period has closed.
 - IHDA has paid \$190 million directly to 38,000 housing providers/landlords.
 - Due to a surplus from the EMA program and additional CRF dollars, IHDA is projecting to assist an additional 15,000 renters than initially planned, for a total of approximately 45,000.
 - IHDA has compiled an FAQ to address the Emergency Rental Assistance program.
- The **Emergency Mortgage Assistance (EMA)** program is using CARES Act funding to provide homeowners impacted by COVID-19 up to \$15,000 to reinstate their mortgage and prepay through 2020 or until funds are exhausted.
 - To be eligible, an applicant must have had a past due balance or a forbearance balance that began sometime on or after March 1, 2020 due to loss of income related to COVID-19 pandemic, and have household income at or below 120% of area median income. The application period has closed.
 - For those who applied for Emergency Mortgage Assistance, application status notifications began October 20th and are expected to be completed by the end of December. IHDA expects to ultimately fund about 50% of all mortgage applications received.
 - To date, IHDA has allocated \$84 million to help 9,746 homeowners and is anticipating another \$14.5 million to go out by Dec. 31, 2020.

Job Training and Placement

The state offers a range of workforce training and assistance programs, which are being recalibrated to assist both employers and workers in the wake of the COVID-19 crisis.

Get Hired Illinois – DCEO

- In May, the Governor announced the launch of Get Hired Illinois – a new portal designed to connect workers with available job and career training opportunities across the state of Illinois. - More than 400 new employers have signed up for Get Hired since the website launched, adding 390 virtual job fairs and 22,173 job listings to the portal. In total, this portal provides Illinois job seekers access to nearly 60,000 jobs connected through the state’s webpage.

Coursera On-Line Workforce Training – DCEO

- The State of Illinois has partnered with Coursera, University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Northwestern University, and the University of Chicago to offer free online career training geared toward helping Illinoisans who have lost their jobs due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Free virtual training courses will provide training and credentialing that will help ready dislocated workers for jobs in Information Technology (IT) and other marketable fields. - TechReady Illinois is also included in the partnership with Illinois and Coursera offering a set of their courses through the Coursera Platform. The TechReady Illinois is an effort to help Illinois residents hurt by COVID-19 gain new digital skills at steeply discounted tuition rates.
- Since the beginning of June, 7,235 invitations were sent through Illinois workNet to individuals interested in taking courses on the Illinois IT Training on Coursera. Of these, 4,776 learners created an account and 3,798 enrolled in one or more courses. There were a total 1,191 unique course completers and 3,469 total course completions.
- Enrollment for Coursera ended on October 31, 2020. Participants have until December 31, 2020 to complete coursework.

Disaster Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant -- DCEO

- DCEO was awarded \$8,325,000 from the National Dislocated Worker Grant Program to prioritize services to individuals most impacted by the crisis, including low wage and traditionally lower skilled individuals who have been laid off or furloughed.
- Funds are being utilized to address immediate actions to stabilize families during this unprecedented time of work separation. Illinois will also utilize the funds to support humanitarian and cleanup recovery needs by providing Disaster Relief Employment.
- Eight Local Workforce Innovation Areas (LWIAs) applied for and received \$8.1 million in funding to support 367 eligible individuals with Disaster Relief Employment, Occupational Training and Support Services; grant funds have been fully obligated. Disaster recovery worksites are being established to assist communities in their effort to mitigate COVID-19 spread, with 150 temporary workers enrolled to date at 31 disaster worksites at nonprofit and local government office locations.

Employment Recovery National Dislocated Worker Grant -- DCEO

- DCEO was awarded \$8,325,000 from the National Dislocated Worker Grant Program to provide workers with essential skills training and incumbent worker training targeted at specific industries (including but not limited to hospitality and restaurants) where low skilled

and low wage workers who have been disproportionately impacted by this crisis.

- Illinois will provide employment and training services to dislocated workers to assist them in obtaining unsubsidized employment, adapting the types of services and the delivery of services to meet the changing economy and changing customer needs while following health emergency safety practices and requirements, including abiding by Illinois' Stay-at-Home orders.
- Eight Local Workforce Innovation Areas (LWIAs) applied for and received \$8.1 million in funding to support 930 Dislocated Workers with Career, Training and Support Services. The grants were obligated in September and the grantees have started their intake and enrollment process with twenty clients enrolled in IWDS to date.

Technical Assistance and Outreach

Many of those that have been hardest hit by this crisis are also those that may have the most difficulty or least experience accessing government support.

Office of Minority Economic Empowerment – DCEO

- OMEE promotes economic development opportunities for all minority communities across the state through targeted programs, resources, and advocacy.
- From March through late December, OMEE hosted 242 webinars and workshops with approximately 8,100 attendees regarding topics including DCEO COVID-19 State and Federal programs, Restore Illinois guidelines, the Business Enterprise Program (BEP), ongoing OMEE programming, general business support, and other assistance as needed.

Rapid Response Services for Layoff Aversion and Job Training – DCEO

- Rapid Response is a proactive, business-focused program to avert layoffs and plant closing through quick coordination of service and the provision of immediate aid to companies and their affected workers.
- When layoffs cannot be averted, laid off workers are connected to job training and placement services.
- Rapid Response teams have worked with 474 businesses since March to provide services to mitigate layoffs that affected approximately 75,459 workers. \$3.5 million in layoff aversion funds have been awarded.

Regional Economic Development Outreach (Team RED) – DCEO

- DCEO has conducted extensive outreach to a wide range of constituencies to ensure businesses are familiar with available programs and assistance. Through December 27, 2020, DCEO has conducted COVID-19 related outreach for at least 12,521 small businesses, 1,104 local Chambers of Commerce and 1,864 economic development organizations.
- Team RED has also launched outreach to local units of government regarding CURE program assistance. This outreach includes emails to approximately 7,319 special taxing districts, 2,032 phone calls and webinars for a collective 7,780 attendees.

Appendix
