Dear Governor and Members of the General Assembly:

The following report fulfills the statutory directive that the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) provide the Governor and the Members of the General Assembly with an annual report on the activities of the Office of Business Permits and Regulatory Assistance, more commonly known as the First Stop Business Information Center. The Business Assistance and Regulatory Reform Act (20 ILCS 608) authorizes the Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity (Department) to create the office which shall consolidate existing programs throughout State government, provide assistance to businesses with fewer than 500 employees in meeting State requirements for doing business and perform other functions specified in the Act in order to improve the State's business climate by making it easier for small and mid-size businesses to deal with State requirements for doing business. This goal will be achieved through providing quick, accurate information on existing requirements and avoiding unnecessary requirements.

Reporting Requirements

Business Assistance and Regulatory Reform Act (20 ILCS 608)

(q) Not later than March 1 of each year, beginning March 1, 1995, the office shall submit an annual report of its activities during the preceding year to the Governor and General Assembly. The report shall describe the activities of the office during the preceding year and shall contain statistical information on the permit assistance activities of the office (Source: P.A. 97-787, eff. 7-13-12; 98-346, eff. 8-14-13.)



The First Stop Business Information Center (First Stop) was created under the Business Assistance and Regulatory Reform Act (20 ILCS 608) as the Office of Business Permits and Regulatory Assistance over 28 years ago. First Stop provides small businesses and business start-ups with comprehensive information on business licenses, permits and government regulations, while also linking them to available programs and resources to help them succeed.

First Stop's business professionals continue to help Illinois' entrepreneurs and small businesses through the challenges and hardships brought on by the global pandemic with requests for business assistance in 2021 five times greater than 2019 pre-pandemic requests for services.

The First Stop Business Information Center staff have over 80 combined years of guiding budding entrepreneurs and existing business owners through Illinois' regulatory processes as well as linking them to federal, state, and local government resources to help them start and grow their business. If a business encounters difficulty with the state regulatory process, our professionals help facilitate communication between the business client and State agencies to help resolve confusion and frustration. Our specialists work hard to dispel the common perception that government is inaccessible to small businesses. Online KnowledgeBase of Business Resources & Requirements:

To better serve its clients, First Stop uses Oracle Service Cloud to house its comprehensive database of more than 630 business related questions and answers known as the KnowledgeBase System. The knowledgebase was visited over 97,000 times in 2021. This system allows entrepreneurs and small business owners to access the same business permit, license, certification, and business resource information as our professional staff on a self-serve basis and can be found on the First Stop website.

Business Start-up Assistance:

The <u>Starting Your Business in Illinois Handbook</u> is the core of the program's business startup kit. It features answers to basic questions and issues facing new business ventures. It

includes a business feasibility checklist, a business plan outline, listings of essential government agencies, and other useful information. The handbook is the most downloaded document offered on our website and is available in both English and Spanish.

In 2021, First Stop partnered with the Illinois Department of Corrections' Women and Family Services Division to provide 900 *Starting Your Business in Illinois Handbook* for use by their re-

entry counselors as they prepare individuals for return to their communities.
