

## Rochester Police Department

Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board,

The Rochester Police Department did not receive any Camera Grants for 2021 or 2022. The Department currently has ten sworn full-time officers and three sworn part-time officers. We currently do not have any body-worn cameras in use. However, the Department does have eight in-car camera systems (Watch Guard 4RE) for daily operations.

In-car video system recordings are reviewed by a Supervisor upon a complaint or threat of complaint on an officer, prior to any distribution (Supeona, FOIA, etc.) of a recorded incident, quarterly basis, and a random basis throughout the year.

Fortunately, the Department has experienced a minimal amount of issues with the in-car video systems. The most common issue is USB storage devices failing after prolonged use. A new USB storage device has corrected the issue. The in-car systems have seldomly stalled, resetting the system corrects the issue. Officers refer to the trouble-shooting section of the User Manual for any other issues. If the solution is not addressed in the trouble-shooting section, the officer will contact Watch Guard customer service. Squad cars with un-operationally video systems are removed from service.
