**SUBJECT:** Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Annual Report

To whom it may concern,

As the designated body-worn camera coordinator for the Wilmette Police Department, I respectfully submit this report as required by 50 ILCS 706/10-25 for your consideration.

The Wilmette Police Department consists of the following ranks as of today's date:

- 1 Chief of Police
- 2 Deputy Chiefs of Police
- 2 Commanders
- 6 Sergeants
- 35 Officers

For a total of 46 Sworn Police Officers. The Department also has 24 civilian personnel (not including crossing guards or seasonal employees). Each Sworn Officer, and one civilian employee are assigned a personal issue body-worn camera.

The Wilmette Police Department owns 47 Axon Body 3 body-worn cameras. These are part of a contract which provides for the replacement of each camera at the midpoint of the 5-year agreement. No technical issues requiring more than a restart of the camera have been experienced.

The Wilmette Police Department has a robust review process for body-worn camera videos. First-line supervisors are required to perform random reviews of each of the Officers under their command. They will also conduct reviews of all body-worn camera

videos from an incident involving use of force, or which are related to a complaint. Additionally, videos from incidents identified as being of training value are regularly reviewed in roll call training.
