Program title:

How to Conduct "Sexual Abuser Risk of Sexual Abuse to Children Assessment" Using the ROSAC

Date: June 25, 2020 Time: 8:00 am – 4 pm Location: Online webinar

Description: Mental health, corrections, and child protective services professionals are commonly asked to assess the risk a sexual abuser poses to a particular child and under what circumstances, if any, the abuser might safely be allowed to have contact with the child. The Risk of Sexual Abuse of Children (ROSAC) is a structured professional judgment assessment instrument for conducting these types of risk of sexual abuse assessments. This training provided participants with information about the development of the ROSAC, how to administer the assessment tool and utilize results for making risk determinations and safety plans.

(Two Day combined) Static-99r and Stable-2007 training

Dates: September 16, 2020; September 17, 2020

Day 1 (Static-99r) Description:

The Static- 99R is the most widely used actuarial risk assessment tool in the United States. The Static- 99R identifies the RISK part of the risk-needs-responsivity model of treatment need identification. Participants learned the most updated scoring rules for the Static 99-R and how to utilize Static 99-R conclusions to inform treatment and supervision.

Day 2 (Stable 2007) Description:

The STABLE-2007 is one of the most widely used risk assessment tools for measuring **dynamic** risk factors for sex offender recidivism. Participants learned about the development of the instrument, itemby-item instructions on how to reliably score the measures and interpret their findings, and guidance on incorporating STABLE-2007 results in written reports.
