**Juvenile Justice Reform**  
**Quarterly Reports**  
**January 1, 2020 through March 31, 2020**

The Juvenile Justice Reform provisions of 1998 reflect a fundamental change in the purpose and goals of the Illinois Juvenile Justice system. A clear direction by the Illinois legislature toward a balanced and restorative juvenile justice environment is intended to provide for prevention, early intervention and competency building.

Effective January 1, 2000, amendments to the Criminal Identification Act (20 Illinois Compiled Statutes 2630/5) became effective requiring the submission of juvenile fingerprint cards for violations of the following:

- 625 Illinois Compiled Statute 5/4 (series);
- 625 Illinois Compiled Statute 5/11-204.1;
- 625 Illinois Compiled Statute 5/11-501; and
- for all minors age 10 and over who have been arrested for an offense which would be a felony if committed by an adult.

A legislative requirement is placed on the Illinois State Police to submit quarterly reports to the General Assembly and the Governor relating to information collected in the Statewide Central Juvenile Records System. The following reports are included in this document:

- Quarterly statewide total of charges reported 1st Quarter 2020
- Quarterly statewide total of charges reported by county 1st Quarter 2020

This report is intended to satisfy the Illinois State Police Legislative Requirement to submit quarterly reports to the General Assembly and the Governor and provides an overview of juvenile fingerprint card submissions received by the Statewide Central Juvenile Records System.
