In 2016, Thomas J. Dart became the first sheriff in the nation to call for the end of cash bail, which too often fails to ensure public safety and unjustly penalizes those too poor to afford to buy their release. Since then, reforms have been made to reduce the burden of bail and to assess the risk that each defendant poses if released to the community. As a result of the changes the jail population has dropped substantially. Sheriff Dart welcomes the opportunity to contribute his insight into this important conversation about ending cash bail and removing poverty as a barrier to pre-trial release.
