RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge the Department of Central Management Services to partner with the Illinois Regional Insulator Contractors Association to conduct energy efficiency audits at five State buildings at no charge to the State; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Central Management Services and the Illinois Regional Insulator Contractors Association conduct these audits around the State, if possible, in Chicago, Cook County, DuPage County, Kane County, McHenry or Will County, Central Illinois, and Southern Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the energy efficiency audit be in accordance with the 3E plus system and may consider the study of all of the following for each real property: (1) the efficiency of equipment located at the real property; (2) the use of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning; (3) the use of energy for lighting; (4) maintenance procedures; and (5) the cost of alternate sources of energy for any energy used; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the energy efficiency audit may include: (1) recommendations on methods to conserve energy; (2) an estimate of the time necessary to implement any recommended changes; and (3) projected costs of any capital improvement necessary to reduce energy costs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Central Management Services shall post a copy of the audits on the Department's website.

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION
CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 10**

SC0010

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, That there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to add Section 13 to Article VII of the Illinois Constitution as follows:

ARTICLE VII
LOCAL GOVERNMENT

SECTION 13. UNFUNDED MANDATES

(a) If the General Assembly or any State executive action requires a unit of local government to establish, expand, or modify its activities in such a way as to necessitate additional expenditures of revenue by the unit of local government, then the State must provide funds to reimburse the unit of local government for the costs necessary to carry out the mandated requirement, except that the General Assembly may, but need not, provide funds for the following mandates:

(1) legislatively mandated requirements requested by the unit of local government affected; and
(2) legislatively mandated requirements that became effective before the effective date of this Section or State executive actions initially implementing legislation that became effective before the effective date of this Section.

(b) A mandated requirement that is not funded is not enforceable while not funded unless the bill implementing the mandated requirement passed with the concurrence of at least three-fourths of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly and specifically states that it is a non-reimbursable mandate under this subsection.

SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, A former co-worker said this of Officer Snyder's work, "His reports were pristine", and "He could never be beat in court, and defense attorneys knew that"; and

WHEREAS, On October 6, 2016, Officer Snyder was called to action in response to a complaint of disturbing the peace in Green Park, Missouri; he was shot and killed by the perpetrator of the disturbance; and

WHEREAS, Officer Snyder is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Snyder; his son, Malachi Snyder; his parents, Richard and Peggy Snyder; his brother, Adam Snyder; and his half-brother, Scott Harrold; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate Illinois Route 100 beginning at the northwest city limits of Godfrey and ending at the southeast city limits as the "Officer Blake Snyder Memorial Highway"; and be it further
