Senator T. Cullerton offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 144

WHEREAS, Proposals have been made to sell or lease all or part of the property of the State toll highway system to private parties and also to assign all or part of the revenue received by the State toll highway system from tolls paid by the public to private parties, in order to raise money for Illinois' pension funds; and

WHEREAS, The Toll Highway Act provides that the purpose of the State Toll Highway Authority is "to promote the public welfare, and to facilitate vehicular traffic by providing convenient, safe, modern and limited access highways designed for the accommodation of the needs of the traveling public through and within the State of Illinois," not to enrich private parties through the use of its public powers; and

WHEREAS, The Toll Highway Act provides that the tolls collected by the State Toll Highway Authority are to be used "to provide for the construction, operation, regulation and maintenance of a toll highway or a system of toll highways, incorporating therein the benefits of advanced engineering skill, design, experience and safety factors, to eliminate existing traffic hazards, and to prevent automotive injuries and fatalities", not for the enrichment of private parties; and

WHEREAS, Proposals to divert the public funds and property of the State Toll Highway Authority for the enrichment of private parties violate the spirit, if not the letter, of Section 1 of Article VIII of the Illinois Constitution, which provides that "public funds, property or credit shall only be used for public purposes"; and

WHEREAS, Proposals to divert the public funds and property of the State Toll Highway Authority rightly call to mind the City of Chicago's failed experiment with privatizing its parking meters, parking garages, and the Chicago Skyway, where ever-increasing fees continue to be paid to enrich private parties while providing no continuing benefit to the public; and

WHEREAS, In 2016, the citizens of Illinois expressed their opposition to such diversions of public funds by amending their Constitution to add Section 11 to Article IX, which provides that "moneys, including bond proceeds, derived from taxes, fees, excises, or license taxes relating to registration, title, or operation or use of vehicles, or related to the use of highways, roads, streets, bridges, mass transit, intercity passenger rail, ports, airports, or to fuels used for propelling vehicles, or derived from taxes, fees, excises, or license taxes relating to any other transportation infrastructure or transportation operation, shall be expended" only for "the following: the costs of administering laws related to vehicles and transportation, including statutory refunds and adjustments provided in those laws; payment of highway obligations; costs for construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, and betterment of highways, roads, streets, bridges, mass transit, intercity passenger rail, ports, airports, or other forms of transportation; and other statutory highway purposes."; and

WHEREAS, Using the tolls paid by the citizens of Illinois for the operation and maintenance of the State toll highway system to raise money for Illinois' pension funds blatantly violates the plain meaning of Section 11 of Article IX of the Illinois Constitution; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, That we state our firm opposition to the unconstitutional diversion of the tolls collected by the State Toll Highway Authority; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we fully support the right of every Illinois citizen to enjoy the full benefit of the tolls paid to the State Toll Highway Authority in the form of improved roads and safer driving, without having any portion of those funds diverted for the enrichment of private parties; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we state our firm opposition to any sale or lease of the properties of the State toll highway system and to any redirection of any portion of the tolls paid for the operation and maintenance of the State toll highway system for the enrichment of private parties.

Senator Villivalam offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 145

WHEREAS, It is the mission of a Responsible Bidder Ordinance to serve as a "protection plan" for local governments by establishing clear objective criteria that contractors must meet to be eligible to bid on public works construction projects; and

WHEREAS, Implementing Responsible Bidder Ordinances reinforces the public's confidence in the use of taxpayer dollars by hiring only reputable contractors with a proven record of completing jobs on time and on budget; and

WHEREAS, Responsible Bidder Ordinances protect the interests of residents who depend on public bodies to assure safe, quality construction and prevent the need for additional reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, Construction is one of the fastest-growing industries in the State, and Responsible Bidder Ordinances are designed to ensure that a city, town, county, or school system only hires responsible contractors who will perform the highest quality work; and

WHEREAS, A Responsible Bidder Ordinance requires contractors to show participation in a United States Department of Labor approved apprenticeship program, which requires continuous education and results in the most trained craftsmen working on taxpayer funded projects; and

WHEREAS, Contractors are incentivized to train their workers through registered apprenticeship programs to prevent the decline in the productivity and qualifications of the construction workforce; and

WHEREAS, Communities that adopt Responsible Bidder Ordinances see an improvement in local construction standards as well as an improvement in infrastructure safety; and

WHEREAS, Responsible Bidder Ordinances drive economic development by ensuring our transportation systems are able to move goods and people through the State and provide safe, modern, and efficient infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, It is the civic duty of the State to adopt Responsible Bidder Ordinances to provide the greatest taxpayer value on construction projects by working to prevent cost overrun and abuse of taxpayer dollars; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we support local governments and municipalities that adopt Responsible Bidder Ordinances to ensure that we are utilizing the most skilled workforce in the State to rebuild our infrastructure.

Senator Aquino offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 151

WHEREAS, All young people deserve to be healthy, have access to care, and thrive; and

WHEREAS, For over 35 years, school-based health centers have provided primary care in or near schools across Illinois; and

WHEREAS, There are currently 66 school-based health centers in the State of Illinois, reaching over 50,000 children and adolescents; and

WHEREAS, School-based health centers are a critical safety net program, with over 85% of users enrolled in Medicaid or uninsured; and

WHEREAS, School-based health centers provide comprehensive services, including physical exams, acute and well care visits, immunizations, behavioral health counseling, chronic disease management, vision and oral healthcare, and nutrition education; and

WHEREAS, Behavioral health providers are able to address students' trauma and chronic stress, champion substance use prevention, and provide counseling in school, where students spend the majority of their time; and

WHEREAS, School-based health centers not only improve health outcomes but also increase academic performance and reduce school dropout rates; and

WHEREAS, School-based health centers contain healthcare costs by eliminating access barriers, reducing emergency department visits, and managing chronic health conditions; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we support the 66 school-based health centers as vital providers of comprehensive healthcare for Illinois' children and adolescents; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we declare February 2019 as "School-Based Healthcare Awareness Month" and encourage all Illinoisans to join in this observance.

Senator Lightford offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 158

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois recognizes the need for clean waterways, whether a large or small body of water, whether rural, urban, or suburban in location, for public safety, for public recreation, for economic benefit, and for historical character; and

WHEREAS, The third Saturday of September is recognized globally as "International Coastal Cleanup Day" and is coordinated by the Ocean Conservancy and promoted by various like-minded Illinois partner organizations; and

WHEREAS, The coalition of Illinois Global Scholar stakeholders, acting for the benefit of students in Illinois and working to promote Public Act 099-0780, are partnering with organizations to ensure the protection, restoration, and health of Illinois waterways; and

WHEREAS, Service learning promotes effective student growth opportunities, and a statewide coordinated week of action will facilitate active citizen engagement, with a focus on active student engagement in learning and effective environmental improvement through trash collection, data collection, and data analysis; and

WHEREAS, To coordinate with the International Coastal Cleanup Day effort, partner organizations and schools across Illinois will facilitate the opportunity for student participant groups in the State to partner with other student participant groups in different countries, providing students in Illinois with the opportunity to communicate and collaborate globally and discuss and share their efforts and findings; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we declare the calendar week containing the third Saturday of September 2019 as Illinois Waterway Cleanup Week in the State of Illinois.

Senator Bush offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Assignments:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 27

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the State of Illinois asserts that the public policy of the State and the duty of each person is to provide and maintain a healthful environment for the benefit of this and future generations; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly shall provide by law for the implementation and enforcement of this public policy; and

WHEREAS, Ethylene oxide is a known carcinogen and its discharge and emission into the atmosphere in high concentrations constitutes a threat to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Illinois Environmental Protection Agency are charged with the enforcement of our federal and State environmental laws and standards to ensure pollutants or discharges from Illinois businesses do not put the health and welfare of Illinois residents and workers in jeopardy; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency completed multiple air sampling and tests around the Sterigenics facility in Willowbrook that discovered heightened levels of ethylene oxide in the air around the facility; and

WHEREAS, Following the results of those tests, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency issued a seal order preventing the use of ethylene oxide by a facility in Willowbrook on February 15, 2019; and

WHEREAS, Lake County has two facilities currently permitted to emit and discharge ethylene oxide; and

WHEREAS, No state or federal agency has yet to conduct ambient air quality or sampling tests around the Lake County facilities that emit and discharge ethylene oxide; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we urge the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to consider the serious concerns of residents of Lake County regarding the recent ethylene oxide emissions and the subsequent environmental and public health threat posed to the people of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to conduct ambient air monitoring and testing in and around the two known facilities emitting or discharging ethylene oxide in Lake County; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to take whatever actions possible to assist in the ambient air monitoring and protection of the public in regards to the environmental and health risks posed by ethylene oxide emissions in Lake County.
