WHEREAS, These women of wisdom have marched on the Chicago lakefront and the streets of Springfield as they worked tirelessly to ratify the ERA in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Many struggled to raise their children, earning only 59 cents for every dollar earned by their male counterparts; and

WHEREAS, Many of these women of wisdom are now over 100 years old and must now look to the younger generations to care for them; and

WHEREAS, They are deserving of the highest caliber of care as they live out their final years; and

WHEREAS, It is important they are not forgotten and are included in the celebration of Women's History Month; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that all women residing in skilled nursing facilities in Illinois should be honored for their lifelong service to their families and communities.
