MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

A message from the House by

Mr. Rossi, Clerk:

Mr. President -- I am directed to inform the Senate that the House of Representatives has adopted the following joint resolution, in the adoption of which I am instructed to ask the concurrence of the Senate, to-wit:

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 16

WHEREAS, The members of this body would like to recognize and honor Marian Byrnes who has distinguished herself in service to her community and this State; and

WHEREAS, Marian Byrnes was born in New Albany, Indiana on November 1, 1925; she married Bruce Byrnes, Jr., a veteran of World War II, on April 20, 1946 and had four sons; David, Kevin, Alan, and Brian; and they have three grandchildren, Erin, Joshua, and Morgan; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes attended Indiana University from 1943 to 1945, where she worked part time at the RCA war plant and became a founder of the first student chapter of NAACP; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes received her Divisional M.A. in Social Sciences from the University of Chicago; this was one of the broad spectrum degrees initiated by Robert Hutchins and included, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, and Education; she worked part-time as secretary for Leo Szilard, the "Father of the Atomic Bomb"; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes became active with the civil rights movement in 1964, and participated in marches until the culminating open housing march of 25,000 to City Hall in 1966; she was also a founding member of Breadbasket Teachers, a branch of Operations Breadbasket, the predecessor of Operation PUSH; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes taught in the Chicago Public School District for 22 years, teaching primary grades, then educable mentally handicapped classes, and finally a resource room for children of all grades with learning disabilities; she was an active member of Chicago Teachers Union (CTU), serving as school delegate to the House of Delegates for 15 years and as a district supervisor in CTU's first strike; she also worked with the Concerned FTB's (full-time basis substitutes) to help them prove discrimination in the Board's process of examinations for teachers to become certified; this issue was resolved by the first strike, when the Teachers Action Caucus, of which Marian was a leader, prevailed on the CTU House of Delegates to make certification based on three years' satisfactory service a non-negotiable demand in the contract negotiations; and

WHEREAS, After retiring from the public schools in 1984, she worked for two years as an

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administrative assistant to the executive director of Protection and Advocacy, an agency which must exist in each state in order for the state to receive its federal funding for people with developmental disabilities and/or mental illness; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes became a legislative aide to State Representative Clem Balanoff from 1988 to 1991; she was chief organizer for the 32nd District Environmental Task Force, which later became the Southeast Environmental Task Force; and

WHEREAS, After retiring from the State Representative's office, she increased her amount of volunteer work; she founded the committee to Protect the Prairie, saving the Van Vliissingen Prairie from development; she was one of the founders of Citizens United to Reclaim the Environment, working to save wetlands and prevent additional landfills in region; she was one of the originators of the 32nd District Environmental Task Force and its successor group, The Southeast Environmental Task Force, leading the fight which closed the malfunctioning Waste Management toxic incinerators, limited landfills, stopped the transport of, and disposal of, unused napalm in the area, monitored pollution, and established Good Neighbor Dialogues with industry; she helped to reclaim the Calumet area Cluster Sites, Hegewisch Marsh and numerous other local wetlands and openlands for cleanup and restoration; she was founder and co-chair of the Lake Calumet Vision Committee, which continues working to restore the ecological value of the lake and its surroundings and develop a feasible plan for the region; and she continues to work with the Calumet Sustainable Growth Advisory Committee, Chicago Recycling Coalition, Calumet Heritage Partnership, Lake Calumet Ecosystem Partnership and numerous other organizations to better the region; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes has been the recipient of various awards including: the Conservation Leadership Award, Openlands Project; Protector of the Environment/Avocation, Chicago Audubon Society; Environmentalist of the Year, Earth Share of Illinois; Chicago Recycling Coalition; Citizen of the Year, South Chicago Chamber of Commerce; and the Belle Whaley Award (for community activism), Center for Neighborhood Technology; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Byrnes is looking forward to polishing the final drafts of her two unpublished books: "Stumbling Through Wonderland: Notes from a Ghetto School", based on her experiences in the Chicago public schools; and "A Country Girl's Book of Christmas", point-and-counterpoint reflections on incidents from her childhood on the farm and her adult life in the city, focusing on the Christmas season; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we honor and recognize the hard work and dedication of Marian Byrnes to better her community and this State, and we wish her well in all of her future endeavors; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Marian Byrnes as an expression of our respect and esteem.
