Senator Geo-Karis offered the following Senate Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Rules:

SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 444

WHEREAS, The members of the Senate of the State of Illinois are pleased to recognize the milestones of important institutions in the State; and

WHEREAS, In the late 1950s and early 1960s, child welfare professionals in Illinois were becoming increasingly concerned about children who needed care and services but were left out of the child welfare system; to consolidate efforts to study and assess further the needs of such children, "The Committee on the Left Out Child" was created and functioned under the charge of the Welfare Council of Metropolitan Chicago; the committee determined the needs of children were so great and the services to them were so fragmented that the creation of a separate Department to serve all of Illinois' children

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and their families was needed; and

WHEREAS, The "Committee on the Left Out Child" became the "Comprehensive Family and Child Welfare Committee; following the creation of the Department of Mental Health in 1961, rigorous efforts to create a separate Department for Children and Families continued even more strongly until the Department of Children and Family Services was created through legislation in 1963; and

WHEREAS, The legislation creating the Department of Children and Family Services was enacted by the 73rd General Assembly; it was approved and signed by the Governor on June 4, 1963, and became effective on January 1, 1964; the stated purpose of the act was "to create a Department of Children and Family Services to provide social services to children and their families, to operate children's institutions, and to provide certain other rehabilitative and residential services"; and

WHEREAS, Upon its inception, the Department of Children and Family Services took over responsibility for most of the non-psychiatric programs and services for children from the Department of Mental Health; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Children and Family Services has undergone a number of changes since 1964; the Child Care Act of 1969 and amendments in 1973 and 1975 included information about licensing and inspections functions that are the responsibility of the Department of Children and Family Services; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we congratulate the Department of Children and Family Services on the occasion of its 40th anniversary, and we commend the Department for its work on behalf of the children of the State of Illinois; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to Department of Children and Family Services as an expression of our esteem.

Senator Schoenberg offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Rules:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 64

WHEREAS, Yo-Yo Waterballs are inexpensive, easily accessible toys that pose a strangulation hazard and threaten to the health of children; and

WHEREAS, Yo-Yo Waterballs are banned in France, the United Kingdom, Luxembourg, Australia, Brazil, and Canada; and Germany and New Zealand have issued warnings concerning Yo-Yo Waterballs; and

WHEREAS, The New York State Consumer Protection Board has issued two warnings calling Yo-Yo Water Balls serious hazards to kids and the Massachusetts Office of Consumer Affairs & Business Regulation calls Yo-Yo Waterballs a great risk to children; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission has reported that Yo-Yo Waterballs pose a potential risk of strangulation; and

WHEREAS, Consumer Reports rated Yo-Yo Waterballs as "not acceptable" in the December 2003 issue; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission reported that as of December 5, 2003, Yo-Yo Waterballs were responsible for 262 reported health incidents, 193 of which were coded as causing "Suffocation or Strangulation"; of those 193 incidents, 52 resulted in serious breathing difficulties that rendered the child unconscious and lifeless after suffering from a lack of oxygen or broken blood vessels; and

WHEREAS, World Against Toys Causing Harm labeled Yo-Yo Waterballs as one of the "10 Worst
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Toys" of 2003; and

WHEREAS, A July 2, 2003 petition from New York's Empire State Consumer Association reported that the fluid inside the balls is toxic and flammable; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission reported that 24 children reported allergic reactions to the fluid and it caused some to have trouble breathing; and

WHEREAS, In spite of evidence concerning the danger to children caused by Yo-Yo Waterballs, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission has refused repeated attempts towards banning or recalling these dangerous toys; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we recognize the serious threat of Yo-Yo Waterballs to our children; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we urge the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission to ban the sale of Yo-Yo Waterballs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of the resolution be sent to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission and each member of the Illinois congressional delegation.

Senator Schoenberg offered the following Senate Joint Resolution, which was referred to the Committee on Rules:

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 65

WHEREAS, Securing decent, safe, accessible, and affordable housing is a part of the American Dream and a goal of Illinois citizens; and

WHEREAS, Efforts to help citizens secure affordable home ownership and rental housing opportunities are legitimate and necessary activities of both State government and the private sector, as witnessed by the many Illinois citizens who have benefited from State programs; and

WHEREAS, Affordable housing remains only a dream of thousands of citizens; and

WHEREAS, Reductions in federal housing assistance and rising housing costs have contributed to high rent burdens on senior citizens, low-income families, and others; and

WHEREAS, Access to affordable housing can be achieved through cooperative local, State, and federal efforts; and

WHEREAS, The talents of grassroots organizations, nonprofit housing professional, financial institutions, elected officials, State agencies, and others must be combined to address the immense challenge of increased affordable housing; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-THIRD GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we proclaim the week of March 14-20, 2004, as "Affordable Housing Week" in Illinois to promote appropriate activities by private and public entities aimed at providing or advocating accessible, affordable housing for all Illinois citizens.

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 989 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Heart of Illinois Regional Port District Act is amended by changing Section 115 as follows:

(70 ILCS 1807/115)

Sec. 115. Organization of the Board. As soon as possible after the appointment of 5 of the initial members, the Board shall organize for the transaction of business, select a chairperson and a temporary secretary from its own number, and adopt by-laws and regulations to govern its proceedings. The initial chairperson and successors shall be elected by the Board from time to time for the term of his or her office as a member of the Board or for the term of 3 years, whichever is shorter.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."
