**SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 601**

WHEREAS, Municipalities continually struggle to maintain necessary funds for the compensation of full-time emergency responders; as such, municipalities turn to the aid of volunteers to supplement necessary services; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer emergency responders often go unappreciated for all of their long hours and incomprehensible skill sets; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer emergency responders endure hours of training in preparation of disasters and emergencies; and

WHEREAS, Emergency responders are required to become proficient in emergency medical training and numerous other skills; and

WHEREAS, These volunteer firefighters, emergency medical technicians (EMTs), divers, rescue squads, and response teams risk their lives daily to help the needs of their community; and

WHEREAS, These individuals respond to emergency calls at any moment, at any time of the day, often leaving their families and full-time jobs on a moment's notice; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer firefighters, EMTs, divers, rescue squads, and response teams risk their lives

on emergency calls and are compensated by either small stipends or no pay at all; and

WHEREAS, The contributions and sacrifices of volunteer firefighters, EMTs, divers, rescue squads, and response teams and their families often go unrecognized; and

WHEREAS, There are over 30,000 people serving throughout the State of Illinois as volunteer firefighters and EMTs; and

WHEREAS, According to the United States Fire Administration, 60% of firefighter deaths in the United States in 2011 have been volunteer servicers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we honor these volunteer emergency responders, who serve without compensation, and constantly risk their lives on a daily basis to retain the safety of their communities, by proclaiming the third Thursday in May of 2012 as Volunteer Emergency Responder Appreciation Day in the State of Illinois.

#### **SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 51**

WHEREAS, The Illinois General Assembly finds that health benefits exchanges authorized by the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act are a cost-effective way in which the State can provide individuals access to greater coverage options; and

WHEREAS, The State has, pursuant to Public Act 97-0142, established an Illinois Health Benefits Exchange Legislative Study Committee to conduct a study regarding State implementation and establishment of an Illinois Health Benefits Exchange; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Health Benefits Exchange Legislative Study Committee has been directed to report on coverage for full-time and part-time employees and their dependents and to make recommendations to the General Assembly on prospective actions; and

WHEREAS, Health benefits exchanges currently provide affordable health insurance for hundreds of thousands of Medicare eligible retirees; and

WHEREAS, Health benefits exchanges may provide similar health benefits and reduced costs for Medicare eligible former State employees currently receiving health benefits from the State of Illinois; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Illinois Health Benefits Exchange Legislative Study Committee shall study the utilization of a health benefits exchange in order to provide retiree health benefits for Medicare eligible former State employees; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Health Benefits Exchange Legislative Study Committee shall hold subject-matter hearings and shall prepare a written report to be presented to members of the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2012; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the members of the Illinois General Assembly, the Governor of the State of Illinois, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, the Director of Health and Family Services, and the Director of Central Management Services.

**SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 53**

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Energy has announced its intentions to issue a Funding Opportunity Announcement for the management and operation of an Energy Storage Hub, estimated to be funded at \$20 million per year for 5 years; Congress has appropriated \$20 million in FY 2012 to initially fund the Hub; and

WHEREAS, The Energy Storage Hub will bring together world-class research talent to focus on the grand challenges of energy storage, finding new green, cost-effective ways to store energy from renewable resources, and leverage smart grid investments; and

WHEREAS, The educational benefit for the faculty and students of Illinois universities and staff from Illinois companies will gain much from the proximity of the Hub in Illinois in developing collaborations for research in chemical technologies and materials science; and

WHEREAS, The siting of the Energy Storage Hub in Illinois will help speed the pace of innovation in this critical new industry and will position Illinois as a national leader in green energy technologies and job creation; and

WHEREAS, Scientists and engineers at Argonne National Laboratory, Northwestern University, the University of Chicago, and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, along with their partners, have already laid the conceptual groundwork for the operation for the Energy Storage Hub; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has a proven record of support for Argonne and Illinois universities for projects such as the Energy Storage Hub; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we pledge our support for Argonne National Laboratory and its bid to be the home of the Energy Storage Hub, and state our intention to provide support as necessary in order for the Hub to be located at Argonne; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we strongly encourage the United States Department of Energy to consider Argonne and the Illinois university in light of their expertise and experience with the concepts and operation of the Energy Storage Hub, which make the State of Illinois a natural fit for the location of these exciting new technologies with the potential to improve quality of life and create new jobs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to President Barack Obama and Vice President Joe Biden, Secretary Steven Chu of the U.S. Department of Energy, the members of the Illinois congressional delegation, and Governor Pat Quinn.

WHEREAS, The Far Southside communities recognized as Rosemoor and Roseland Heights have, within its boundaries, the only public bridge along the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive corridor; and

WHEREAS, On August 27, 2011, the public and its elected officials assembled to recognize the importance of this day marking the anniversary of the March on Washington (1963) and the National Democratic Nomination of U.S. Senator Barack Obama for President of the United States (2008); and

WHEREAS, In August of 2011, The City of Chicago recognized by letter the significant importance of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and supported community recommendations to dedicate the State Bridge located at 99th and 100th Streets and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive as a Memorial Bridge; and

WHEREAS, In 2011, the public raised a significant amount of money to build a statue of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in the Washington Mall; the public also held a historical event on October 16, 2011; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that we designate the bridge located at 99th and 100th Streets and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive in Rosemoor and Roseland Heights as the "Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Bridge"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation is requested to erect at suitable locations, consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate plaques or signs giving notice of the name of the "Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Bridge"; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Secretary of the Illinois Department of Transportation and the Chicago City Council.

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of this resolution a proposition to amend Article XIV of the Illinois Constitution by adding Section 5 as follows:

ARTICLE XIV

CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION

SECTION 5. CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE FOR ETHICAL STANDARDS

Amendments to Section 2 of Article XIII of this Constitution may be proposed by a petition signed by a number of electors equal to at least 8% of the total votes cast for candidates for Governor in the preceding gubernatorial election. Amendments shall be limited to subjects that establish and enforce ethical standards for candidates for or holders of office in units of local government, in school districts, or in the legislative, executive, or judicial branch of State government. A petition shall contain the text of the proposed amendment and the date of the general election at which the proposed amendment is to be submitted, shall have been signed by the petitioning electors not more than 24 months preceding that general election, and shall be filed with the State Board of Elections at least 6 months before that general

election. The procedure for determining the validity and sufficiency of a petition shall be provided by law. If the petition is valid and sufficient, the proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors at the general election and shall be adopted if approved by either three-fifths of those voting on the question or a majority of those voting in the election.

This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois Constitutional Amendment Act.

#### ARTICLE XIV CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION

##### SECTION 5. CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE FOR ETHICAL STANDARDS

Amendments to Section 2 of Article XIII of this Constitution may be proposed by a petition signed by a number of electors equal to at least 8% of the total votes cast for candidates for Governor in the preceding gubernatorial election. Amendments shall be limited to subjects that establish and enforce ethical standards, including campaign finance reform, for candidates for or holders of office in units of local government, in school districts, or in the legislative, executive, or judicial branch of State government. A petition shall contain the text of the proposed amendment and the date of the general election at which the proposed amendment is to be submitted, shall have been signed by the petitioning electors not more than 24 months preceding that general election, and shall be filed with the State Board of Elections at least 6 months before that general election. The procedure for determining the validity and sufficiency of a petition shall be provided by law. If the petition is valid and sufficient, the proposed amendment shall be submitted to the electors at the general election and shall be adopted if approved by either three-fifths of those voting on the question or a majority of those voting in the election.
