Executive Summary

The following report outlines waivers of School Code mandates that school districts, regional offices of education, or special education or vocational education cooperatives have requested since the last report, which was transmitted in September 2011. Pursuant to Section 2-3.25g of the School Code (105 ILCS

5/2-3.25g), these requests must be sent to the General Assembly for its consideration before March 1, 2012.

The report is organized by subject area and by school district, regional office, or special education or vocational education cooperative. The General Assembly may disapprove the report in whole or in part within 60 calendar days after each chamber next convenes once the report is filed. This is done by a joint resolution. If either chamber fails to reject a waiver request, then that request is deemed granted.

Section I summarizes the 73 requests received for waivers of School Code mandates for consideration by the General Assembly, which are presented alphabetically by topic area. The largest number of applications received (29 requests) seeks waivers from daily physical education. There are 15 requests for limitation of administrative costs, 11 requests for non-resident tuition, 11 requests for school inservice training, and two requests each for parent-teacher conferences and driver education fee limits. There is one request each for the use of other practice driving methods in lieu of the required six hours of behind-the-wheel instruction in a dual control car on public roadways; for publication of the district's annual statement of affairs; and for kindergarten.

Public Act 95-223, passed early in 2008, limited the number of waivers of daily physical education that could be requested by school districts and other eligible applicants to an initial, 2-year request, with the possibility of no more than two additional, 2-year renewal requests. Of the 27 waiver request renewals for physical education contained in this report, eight districts are requesting their second and final renewal.

This document also contains one other section beyond what is required under Section 2-3.25g of the School Code. Section II is a database with listings of modifications or waivers of State Board of Education rules and modifications of School Code mandates upon which the State Superintendent of Education has acted in accordance with Section 1A-4 of the School Code (105 ILCS 5/1A-4). The database also includes listings of requests that have been returned to or withdrawn by the petitioning entities. In addition, the database includes the 73 waiver requests for the General Assembly's consideration and is organized by Senate and House districts.

Complete copies of the waiver requests for the General Assembly's consideration have been made available to legislative staff.

This is the thirty-fourth report submitted pursuant to Section 2-3.25g of the School Code, which requires that the State Board of Education through agency staff compile and submit requests for waivers of School Code mandates to the General Assembly before March 1 and October 1 of each year.

Driver Education

Fee Limits

Grayslake CHSD 127 – Lake (SD 31/HD 62) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5567 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$350 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Arlington Heights THSD 214 – Cook (SD 33/HD 66) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5601 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.2) request to allow the district to charge a fee not to exceed \$350 of students who participate in driver education courses.

Behind-the-Wheel Instruction

Rock Island SD 41 – Rock Island (SD 36/HD 72) / Expiration: 2014-15 school year

WM100-5548 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-24.3) request to allow the district to use computerized simulators for 12 hours of practice driving in lieu of three hours of behind-the-wheel instruction required to be conducted in a car with dual operating controls operated on public roadways. The district states that simulators assist students to learn the mechanics of safe driving without endangering themselves or others.

Limitation of Administrative Costs

Scott – Morgan CUSD 2 – Scott, Morgan (SD 47/HD 93) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5541 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. During FY 2012, the district's health insurance increased by 8 percent over the previous year. In addition, the superintendent received a 2 percent raise, mirroring the pay increases given to teachers and non-certified staff. These increased expenses caused the district's administrative costs for FY 2012 to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Dunlap CUSD 323 – Peoria (SD 37/HD 73) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5542 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In past years, the district hired part-time clerical staff to cope with increasing student enrollment. In FY 2012, a full-time clerical position was added to assist these administrators. The increased expenses necessary to cover this new position caused the district's costs for FY 2012 to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Oregon CUSD 220 – Ogle (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5544 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district plans to retain an administrator previously funded through American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) monies to review student assessment data and select curricular areas to be modified. This function remains important for increasing student achievement, and the district also intends to complete a crisis management plan created through the ARRA grant. These additional administrative expenses caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Deer Park CCSD 82 – LaSalle (SD 38/HD 76) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5547 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The superintendent also serves as transportation director and as principal. District auditors recommended shifting the portion of his salary previously allocated to the Transportation Fund to the Education Fund and to principal costs, because of recent cuts to the transportation budget. The combined effect of these money shifts caused administrative expenses for the district to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Lincoln ESD 156 – Cook (SD 17/HD 34) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5549 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The position of student services director, new in 2011, was initially budgeted for less than a full year. The district is now budgeting the position for a full year; the increase in expenses from the partial-year position has caused administrative expenses for the district to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Rhodes SD 84.5 – Cook (SD 39/HD 77) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5559 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. For the FY 2011 school year, the district employed an interim superintendent. The hiring of a full-time superintendent with paid benefits for the 2011-2012 school year caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Pope County CUSD 1 – Pope (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5561 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The district's previous superintendent resigned in June and the new superintendent began in August. Administrative costs for FY 2011 reflected only 11 months of superintendent costs, compared to the 12 full months budgeted for FY 2012. This unavoidable budget discrepancy caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Triopia CUSD 27 – Morgan (SD 49/HD 97) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5565 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. For all of FY 2010 and most of the FY 2011 school years, the district employed an interim superintendent. The hiring of a full-time superintendent with paid benefits for the 2011-2012 school year caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Hazel Crest SD 152.5 – Cook (SD 15/HD 30) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5571 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. For the FY 2011 school year, the district employed a part-time business manager, but the position became a full-time one in FY 2012. The costs of hiring a full-time administrator for the 2011-2012 school year caused the district's administrative expenses to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Hardin County CUSD 1 – Hardin (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5574-1 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In prior years, the district employed an interim superintendent at a per diem rate. The hiring of a full-time superintendent with paid benefits for the 2011-2012 school year caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

North Wamac SD 186 – Clinton (SD 54/HD 107) / Expiration: 2010-11 school year

WM100-5576 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The superintendent's salary has been allocated among three sections of the budget, with health insurance being charged to the principal category, since the superintendent also serves as the principal. With the addition of the superintendent's family to his health insurance, the resulting balance in the principal category was negative. To correct this issue, insurance charges were reallocated to the superintendent category. The

resulting increase in amount for that category caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Odell CCSD 435 – Livingston (SD 53/HD 105) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5591 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. In prior years, the district employed an administrator to act as superintendent and principal. The administrative team was restructured in FY 2011 and the district now employs two full-time administrators to cover these functions. These full-time positions caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Lincolnshire – Prairie View SD 103 – Lake (SD 30/HD 59) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5599 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. An audit of the district's budgeting for FY 2010 recommended that all revenues and expenditures be aligned with the Illinois Program Accounting Manual. As a result of these findings, several expenditures previously charged to instructional or board functions were reassigned to administrative categories. The resulting one-time increases to administrative functions caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Cahokia USD 187 – St. Clair (SD 57/HD 114) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5600 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. The two-district Cahokia Joint Agreement, formed in 1971, was dissolved by mutual consent in June of 2011. The Cahokia district continues to employ the staff from the joint agreement to provide in-house program and administrative support for students with special education needs. The increases to Cahokia's payroll from the joint agreement's dissolution caused the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Illini Central SD 189 – Mason (SD 47/HD 94) / Expiration: 2011-12 school year

WM100-5604 – Waiver of School Code (Section 17-1.5) request to allow the district to waive the limitation of administrative costs due to circumstances beyond its control. For the FY 2012 school year, the board adopted an increase of 8 percent in administrative costs. The superintendent has been given a raise similar to those given to the district's teachers, and coverage for her husband has been added to her health insurance benefits. These increases will cause the district's administrative costs to exceed the 5 percent limitation.

Kindergarten

Frankfort CCSD 157-C – Will (SD 41/HD 81) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5578 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-22.18) request to allow the district to offer only extended-day kindergarten classes, without offering a half-day option, in order to better use limited transportation resources, create smaller class loads per teacher (30 students instead of 60), and provide a more comprehensive and consistent curriculum.

Nonresident Tuition

Jasper County CUSD 1 – Jasper (SD 54/HD 108) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5545 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Litchfield CUSD 12 – Montgomery (SD 49/HD 98) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5554 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Nokomis CUSD 22 – Montgomery, Christian, Fayette (SD 49/HD 98) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5556 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to

allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Murphysboro CUSD 186 – Jackson (SD 58/HD 115) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5560 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Dimmick CCSD 175 – LaSalle (SD 38/HD 76) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5563 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time certified employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Virginia CUSD 64 – Cass (SD 47/HD 93) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5564-1 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Meridian CUSD 101 – Pulaski (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5573 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Norris City – Omaha – Enfield CUSD 3 – White (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5580 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Pope County CUSD 1 – Pope (SD 59/HD 118) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5581 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are full-time employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

A-C Central CUSD 262 – Cass (SD 47/HD 93) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5589 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Union Ridge SD 86 – Cook (SD 10/HD 20) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5606 – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-20.12a) request to enable the district to allow non-resident students whose parents are employees of the district to attend its schools free of charge.

Parent-Teacher Conferences

West Chicago ESD 33 – DuPage (SD 48/HD 95) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5562 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district the option of scheduling parent-teacher conferences in the evening following a full day of student attendance, followed by all-day conferences that will extend into the evening. One day following the conferences will be a nonattendance day for students, and for staff, if they have completed their conferences. The evening sessions will be counted as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required by Section 10-19.

Rock Falls ESD 13 – Whiteside (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5587-1 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(1)) request to allow the district the option of scheduling three hours of parent-teacher conferences in the evening following a full day of student attendance; three hours of parent-teacher conferences the following afternoon after students have been in attendance for three hours; and three hours of parent-teacher conferences on the third day, with no student attendance. The evening and morning sessions will be counted as one of the 176 days of pupil attendance required by Section 10-19.

Physical Education

Mt. Zion CUSD 3 – Macon, Moultrie (SD 51/HD 101) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5536 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 through 12 from daily physical education for two out of four years of high school. Students enroll in interscholastic athletic activities, cheerleading and pom-poms, swing choir and/or a variety of academic coursework in lieu of the two years of daily physical education. The district states that students' educational experiences are broadened through exposure to a range of courses. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Clinton CUSD 15 – DeWitt, Logan, Macon (SD 44/HD 87) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5537 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 5 to participate in physical education twice a week for 30 minutes each session due to inadequate facilities. Students will also be provided with 30 minutes a day of activity focused on fine and gross motor skills. Smaller classes will enable the district to provide safer and more effective instruction. The waiver, if approved, will allow more time for art, music and technology instruction.

Geneva CUSD 304 – Kane (SD 25/HD 49) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5538 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in cheerleading or the district's pompon/dance program. Excusing the students from physical education classes will enable them to have more flexibility in academic course selection. Students will participate in their chosen activity for a minimum of two hours each day, compensating for the physical activity that they would have had in physical education classes.

Rock Falls THSD 301 – Whiteside, Lee (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5539 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in cheerleading and the dance team. The district states that the number of hours per week of practice and performances for students participating in these activities more than meets the guidelines established for physical fitness activities.

County of Winnebago CUSD 320 – Winnebago (SD 34/HD 68) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5540 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 1 through 6 to participate in physical education two times a week for 30 minutes each session rather than on a daily basis. Students will participate in group activities and/or dance under the supervision of certified teachers. Students in grades 11 and 12 will also be excused from the physical education requirement if they are enrolled in six academic classes. The district states that it is increasingly difficult for students to obtain all the academic course work needed during high school.

New Lenox SD 122 – Will (SD 41/HD 81) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5550 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 3 to participate in physical education two times a week for 30 minutes each session and students in grades 4 through 6 to participate three times a week for 30 minutes each session due to inadequate facilities. Additionally, all students participate in daily physical education activities based on a district-developed "Motor Activity Guide" (30 minutes per day for students in kindergarten through grade 3 and 15 minutes per day for students in grades 4 through 6). Smaller classes will enable the district to provide safer and more effective instruction.

Hoopston Area CUSD 11 – Vermilion (SD 53/HD 105) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5551 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement to enroll in academic classes that would benefit their postsecondary study, including high school vocational classes and dual enrollment classes offered through the local community college. Students using the waiver are encouraged to participate in a physical education program or organized extracurricular activity, and physical education courses will continue to be offered as an elective at these grade levels for students wishing to enroll.

Thornton Fractional THSD 215 – Cook (SD 17/HD 34) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5552 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grade 9 from the daily physical education requirement for enrollment in double periods of English and mathematics. The district has not met minimum state standards in core subject areas and plans academic recovery programs for freshmen and other students. Freshmen may enroll in interscholastic athletics as well as "open gym," to be offered after school. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Nashville CHSD 99 – Washington (SD 58/HD 115) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5553 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in cheerleading, and those in grades 9 and 10 for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program. In periods when students in grades 9 and 10 are not engaged in these athletic programs, they will be enrolled in daily physical education.

Wethersfield CUSD 230 – Henry, Bureau, Stark (SD 37/HD 74) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5557 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 6 to participate in physical education on an every-other-day basis for 40 minutes each session rather than daily. This schedule will allow more instructional time to be devoted to core areas for the purpose of improving student performance.

City of Chicago SD 299 – Cook (SD 3/HD 5) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5558 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement in order for these students to enroll in additional academic courses needed to meet the district's graduation requirements. The district's criteria for graduation are designed to improve student performance by providing increased attention to math and science and by adding requirements in foreign language and career education. Chicago plans to extend its school day to allow students to engage in higher-level academic classes and have opportunities for physical fitness.

Waukegan CUSD 60 – Lake (SD 30/HD 60) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5566 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 5 to participate in physical education twice a week for 30 minutes each session rather than daily. This schedule will allow the district to increase the time spent in language arts and mathematics to 90 minutes daily for each of those subject areas, leading to improved student performance and test scores. Each building has programs in place to incorporate physical activity into classroom and extracurricular activities.

Prophetstown-Lyndon-Tampico CUSD 3 – Whiteside (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5568 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 5 to participate in physical education two or three times a week for 40 minutes each session due to inadequate facilities. The district also provides dance and movement activities in music classes and structured recess, both of which incorporate the Illinois Learning Standards for Physical Development and Health. The district states that longer physical education classes held fewer times a week allow for implementation of a more effective curriculum.

Germantown Hills SD 69 – Woodford (SD 37/HD 73) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5569 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 6 through 8 to participate in physical education four days a week for 45 minutes each session. This schedule would allow students additional time for computer technology instruction. Students in grades 6 through 8 have a 30-minute daily recess, supervised by physical education teachers. Students in grade 6 have an additional 15 minutes of recess for a total of 45 minutes each day. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Panhandle CUSD 2 – Montgomery (SD 49/HD 98) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5570 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 5 to participate in physical education two to three times a week for 35 minutes each session rather than daily due to inadequate facilities. Offering more focused periods

of physical education is expected to produce enhanced learning opportunities and improved student performance in the physical education program. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Dalzell SD 98 – Bureau (SD 38/HD 76) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5575 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 8 to participate in physical education three times a week for 30 to 35 minutes each session instead of daily, in order to allow students to take part in interscholastic athletics and cheerleading. Students in kindergarten through grade 4 will have daily recess periods. The district states that its smaller classes provide a safer environment for its students and improve the quality of its physical education program. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Palatine CCSD 15 – Cook (SD 27/HD 54) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5577 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 1 through 6 to participate in physical education twice a week for 30 minutes each session rather than daily due to inadequate facilities. Students have 20 minutes of recess each day, and intramural sports are offered beginning in grades 5 and 6. The district states that this schedule offers a safer environment and improved time on task for its students.

Oregon CUSD 220 – Ogle (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5579 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 6 to participate in physical education on a less-than-daily basis due to the district's ongoing academic recovery program. Students in kindergarten through grade 2 will receive physical education three days a week for 30 minutes each session; students in grades 3 and 5 will have physical education three days a week for 45 minutes each session; and grade 4 students will take physical education four days a week, with two sessions of 35 minutes and two of 45 minutes. Students in grade 6 will receive physical education three days a week for 45-minute sessions. The district must focus on core classes in order to meet Annual Yearly Progress (AYP) standards for all its schools.

Hononegah CHSD 207 – Winnebago (SD 34/HD 68) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5582 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 10 through 12 from the daily physical education requirement for one semester for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program. Students in grades 11 and 12 also will be excused from the physical education requirement if they both pass a pre-test for fitness and enroll in five academic courses. The district notes that its decision to drop from eight to seven daily periods during the 2004-2005 school year has resulted in many students losing the opportunity to take all classes needed for college entrance or future career plans.

Round Lake CUSD 116 – Lake (SD 26/HD 52) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5583-2 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in grades 1 through 3 to participate in physical education every other day for 20 minutes each session due to inadequate facilities. Students in grades 4 and 5 will take physical education every other day for 25 minutes per session, and students in grade 6 will participate in physical education for 50 minutes every other day. In addition to class time, students in grades 1 through 3 will have two recess periods each day, and students in grades 4 and 5 will have one structured recess session each day. Students in grades 5 and 6 will also have opportunities to participate in intramural sports programs. The district states that this schedule offers the safest and most effective way for students to meet the Illinois Learning Standards for Physical Development and Health. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Lincoln-Way CHSD 210 – Will (SD 41/HD 81) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5586 – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 9 through 10 for ongoing participation in an interscholastic athletic program; to enroll in academic classes required for admission to an institution of higher learning; and to enroll in academic classes required for graduation from high school. The district states that the waiver would allow additional academic opportunities to a greater number of students, and that most students affected by the waiver would be actively involved in interscholastic athletics.

Rock Falls ESD 13 – Whiteside (SD 45/HD 90) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5587-2 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to alternate daily physical education with music and art for students in kindergarten through grade 5. Students will participate in physical education for 30 minutes each session on an every-other-day basis. They also will have 15 to 20 minutes of supervised recess each day, and access to extracurricular programs. The district states that this physical education schedule will allow it to continue to improve student performance in other academic areas.

Springfield SD 186 – Sangamon (SD 50/HD 99) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5590 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 8 to participate in physical education on less than a daily basis (in kindergarten through grade 5, twice a week for 30 minutes each session, and in grades 6 through 8, every other day all year or daily for one semester). The district lacks sufficient space to provide daily physical education for all of its students. In grades 11 and 12, students will be excused from daily physical education in order to participate in interscholastic athletics; to enroll in fine arts, foreign language and career and technical courses; or to take other courses needed to enhance their academic performance. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Quincy SD 172 – Adams (SD 47/HD 93) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5595 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 3 to participate in physical education three times a week for 30 minutes each session and students in grades 4 through 6 to participate twice a week for 40 minutes each session. Students in grades 7 through 12 will be excused from the daily physical education requirement on a case-by-case and semester-by-semester basis. Reasons for waiving the physical education requirements for students in grades 7 through 12 include: participation in interscholastic athletics (grades 9 and 10); the need for additional academic instruction; participation in driver's education (either the classroom or the behind-the-wheel segment); and participation in cheerleading and/or pom-poms. The district expects student performance in core academic areas to improve through the use of this waiver, which allows increased time to provide students the intervention services needed to eliminate academic deficiencies.

Pinckneyville CHSD 101 – Perry (SD 58/HD 115) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5596 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement to allow these students to enroll in additional courses, such as foreign language, band, music, art, technology, vocational occupations and computer applications. The waiver is being sought due to inadequate facilities.

Moline USD 40 – Rock Island (SD 36/HD 72) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5597 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through grade 5 to participate in physical education for three or four days a week for 20 to 30 minutes per session due to inadequate facilities in some of its elementary schools. The district will provide instruction in other learning areas when students are not in physical education, thus increasing their academic performance in those areas. In addition, the regular classroom teachers will lead students in movement activities in the classroom. If approved, this is the last physical education waiver the district will be permitted to request under the law.

Community High School District 117 – Lake (SD 31/HD 61) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5603 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) request to allow the district to excuse students in grades 11 and 12 from the daily physical education requirement for ongoing participation in cheerleading and the dance team (pom-poms squad). The district states that these activities are comparable in character and intensity to the interscholastic athletic activities in which juniors and seniors may participate in place of daily physical education.

Kewanee CUSD 229 – Henry (SD 37/HD 74) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5605 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) to allow the district to permit students in kindergarten through first grade to participate in physical education four times a week for 30 minutes each session; for students in grades 2 and 3 to participate in physical education four times a week for 25 minutes each session; for students in grades 4 through 6 to participate in physical education two times a week for 40 minutes each session; and for students in grades 7 and 8 to participate in

physical education three times a week for 45 minutes each session, due to inadequate facilities. Kewanee students in grades 3 through 6 did not meet Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) goals in 2010-2011. Students will spend time in various intervention programs and school improvement activities in order to improve student achievement.

Bloom THSD 206 – Cook (SD 40/HD 80) / Expiration: 2013-14 school year

WM100-5608 – Waiver of School Code (Section 27-6) to allow the district to permit students in grades 9 through 12 to take three years of physical education, with the fourth year being an optional class that can be taken as an elective. Seniors would be allowed to take additional classes in math, science, and language arts in place of physical education. The district has changed from a block schedule to a 5-period day in order to increase instructional time and address students' learning gaps. This waiver would result in increased student time spent on academic subjects.

School Improvement/Inservice Training

Paris CUSD 4 – Edgar (SD 55/HD 109) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5535 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to dismiss students three hours early on each of the first five days of the school year. The district offers a 6-hour instructional day and would accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement during the remainder of the school year to apply towards these days in order to count them among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19.

Paris-Union SD 95 – Edgar (SD 55/HD 109) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5543 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to dismiss students two hours early on each of the first five days of the school year. The district would accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement during the remainder of the school year to apply towards these days in order to count them among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19.

Aurora East USD 131 – Kane (SD 42/HD 83) / Expiration: 2014-15 school year

WM100-5546 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

West Richland CUSD 2 – Richland (SD 54/HD 108) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5572 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold four full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of eight half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Round Lake CUSD 116 – Lake (SD 26/HD 52) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5583-1 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold four full-day school improvement sessions instead of eight half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

LeRoy CUSD 2 – McLean (SD 53/HD 106) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5593 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Woodridge SD 68 – DuPage (SD 24/HD 47) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5594 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold four full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Hazel Crest SD 152.5 – Cook (SD 15/HD 30) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5598 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold three full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of six half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Lombard ESD 44 – DuPage (SD 21/HD 42) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5602 – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Decatur SD 61 – Macon (SD 51/HD 101) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5609 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold three full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of six half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Kinnikinnick CCSD 131 – Winnebago (SD 34/HD 68) / Expiration: 2016-17 school year

WM100-5612-2 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 18-8.05(F)(2)(d)(2)) request to allow the district to hold two full-day teacher inservice sessions instead of four half days, and to count the days among the 176 days of actual pupil attendance required by Section 10-19. The district will accumulate sufficient time beyond the five-clock-hour requirement to apply towards these days.

Statement of Affairs

Algonquin CSD 158 – McHenry, Kane (SD 32/HD 64) / Expiration: 2012-13 school year

WM100-5588 (renewal) – Waiver of School Code (Section 10-17) request to allow the district to not prepare and publish in the newspaper a “statement of affairs,” thus saving the district approximately \$6,000. The district will instead publish its annual financial report on the district’s website and have copies available in all district schools. The district states that the money saved through this waiver would be used for instructional purposes leading to improved student performance.
