28. Mr. President and members of the Senate ... I'd like to
29. inform the members of the Senate that all bills that are pre-
30. sented have a 60 day hearing clause ... as far as the rules
31. are concerned. Now, if you, if you've presented your bills
32. they're ... sent to a Committee, ask them to be set up for
33. hearing, otherwise I know Local Government, if you don't hear

1. your bill within 60 days after they're presented, I'm ...
2. going to see that they're voted out Do Not Pass. Thank you.

3. PRESIDENT:

4. The Chair wishes to ... make an announcement. I'm sure
5. there are some of you who have learned that Senator Mohr was
6. involved in an automobile accident on his way down this morn-
7. ing. We have just checked with the Doctor who attended him.
8. He was admitted to St. Joseph's Hospital in Bloomington for
9. examination. He is reported just to have been bruised. All
10. of the X-rays were negative. It was a severe collision in-
11. volving a standing automobile on an icy highway on the West
12. side of Bloomington ... about forty-five minutes ago, he pro-
13. ceeded on his way to Springfield and he is ok, so those of
14. you who did not have this information can be disabused of
15. your concern. He is ok. He was badly bruised, but he'll be

5. SENATOR SOURS:

6. Some of the older members of this Chamber are well ac-
7. quainted with Glen D. Wally. He was one of the real char-
8. acters around the Legislature for the last 50 years. For
9. years he represented the interest of the Illinois Power Com-
10. pany. ... A ... a man of his word, a very happily married
11. man and I regret to say now, that he is almost lost without
12. his life's helpmate. Presently in the hospital, last Sat-
13. urday they sold his house at a public auction ... those of
14. you who knew Glen and I know there are some on the other
15. side who had great reverence respect for him. I feel this
16. is the kind tribute to him for all the good things he's
17. done in Springfield and for many of us sitting in the Chamber
18. and I accordingly make the proper motion Mr. President, that
19. the rules be suspended and that ... this Resolution be adopted
20. immediately.

21. PRESIDENT:

22. Senator Sours ... would you also want to put the motion
23. that all Senators join in co-sponsorship ... I certainly would
24. like to join with you in this and I know there are many of us
25. who want to join in ... in this regard.

26. SENATOR SOURS:

27. I think that would be very nice.

28. PRESIDENT:

29. Is there leave for the suspension of the rules for the
30. immediate consideration of the Resolution? All in favor of
31. the adoption, signify by arising. Senator Graham. You wish
32. to ... is ... is there further business to come before the
33. Senate? Senator Hall.

1. SENATOR HALL:

2. Mr. President and Senators, I'd just like to announce
3. that ... I've introduced a bill for the Jolliet-Marquette Tri-
4. Centennial. ... It's a appropriation bill. Now, Senator
5. Rosander handled this last year and it was passed. Now, I
6. have no way of knowing who you have appointed from that side
7. of the aisle to be on this, but I certainly would like for
8. them to have their name joined to the bill, if they so wish.

12. ... Just by way of an announcement, Mr. President, the
13. notice shows that Senate Bills 53 and 54 are to be heard this
14. afternoon in 415 in the Transportation and Public Utilities
15. Committee in A-1 of the State Office Building and I just would
16. like to point out to the membership for those that are in-
17. terested that there will be witnesses there to testify today
18. and you might want to avail yourself of their testimony be-
19. cause this involves the Chicago Transit Authority and other
20. transportational systems bill. It's of particular significance
21. I think now for the reason that a few moments ago I am told
22. that those comparable bills in the House which they spent the
23. last two days working on and amending, have now been deter-
24. mined to have been unconstitutional by a ruling of the Chair
25. there, so it now takes on an additional significance because
26. it seems that the job will have to be solved, if it is, in
27. this august Body and I would invite those of you even who are
28. not sponsors of it to be present at the hearing because I am
29. certain there will be the delineation of a great deal of very
30. meaningful information in this area.

31. PRESIDENT:
