So, he charged us with a responsibility that I think that we should meet. Now, you will recall that over the last several years there was a property tax study group. Senator Coulson was very active, I believe he was the chairman of it along with Representative Shea, and there is considerable spade work done in this area, as we know. There have been reports, there have been studies, one most recently just before...our Governor went out in December. I do not know the veracity of the statements that were made yesterday or previously. But, I think that we are charged with addressing ourselves to this and to that point. I talked to Representative Randolph this morning and got his agreement, and I've talked to the leadership on both sides of this Chamber, and would ask for a sus-
