6. 2nd reading of the bill. A Committee on Agriculture,  
7. Conservation and Ecology offers one amendment.

10. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

11. Mr. Chairman, I have two amendments the...pages are  
12. passing them out right now. The first amendment was offered  
13. in Committee and...it made some technical changes but  
14. primarily it reduced the amount so that it could be with-  
15. held from one-half to one-fourth of a cent per bushel during  
16. the first year of the existence of this enabling legislation  
17. and then provided that...reporting would not have to be  
18. oftener than quarterly...this amendment was adopted unani-  
19. mously by the Committee and I would offer it at this time.

20. PRESIDENT:

21. Is there further discussion? All in favor of the  
22. adoption of Committee Amendment No. 1, signify by saying  
23. aye. Contrary nay. The motion is carried, Amendment No. 1  
24. is adopted. Senator Knuppel.

25. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

26. The second amendment arose as a result of the hearing  
27. and the second amendment does two things. Number one...  
28. number one...it extends from six months to two years the  
29. period of time of waiting before a second referendum  
30. can be held with respect of the establishment of a market-  
31. ing board and the second part of the amendment provides that  
32. unless monies are refunded to those people under the voluntary  
33. system of refunds within either 60 or 90 days whichever

1. is longest from the time the money either is paid or the re-  
2. port is made by the elevator that the money shall thereafter  
3. draw interest at the rate of 6%. Which is the same as the  
4. provisions of the Internal Revenue Code for the State of  
5. Illinois. This insures the people who are entitled refunds  
6. who don't want to participate in the marketing...procedures  
7. of the Board, that they will get their money refunded and  
8. if it is not refunded within 60 or 90 days depending on the  
9. establishment date that they will draw interest thereafter.  
10. I offer the amendment.

17. SENATOR FAWELL:

18. ...Mr. President, and members of the Senate, this particular  
19. bill is...one of the various no fault bills which are pending  
20. here in the Illinois Legislature and...when these bills were  
21. heard in the Judiciary Committee there were several amendments  
22. which were suggested and I did indicate to the Judiciary  
23. Committee that I would have these amendments presented. Amend-  
24. ment #1 is an amendment which adds to the basic coverage which  
25. is mandated by this no fault type of insurance and...would  
26. add reasonable and necessary funeral expenses of the injured  
27. person who dies within one year of the date of the accident.  
28. And I move the adoption of Amendment #1.

29. PRESIDENT:

30. Is there further discussion? All in favor of the adoption  
31. of the amendment signify by saying aye. Contrary nay. Motion  
32. is carried, Amendment #1 is adopted. Senator Fawell.

33. SENATOR FAWELL:



1. Amendment No. 2...is an amendment which adds to the  
2. exclusion...the exclusions...as to when coverage does  
3. not pertain, set forth in Section 623 and adds this added  
4. cause for exclusion. While the injured person is under  
5. the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotics, this  
6. would be a grounds for exclusion of the mandated coverage.  
7. I would move the adoption of Amendment # 2.

8. PRESIDENT:

9. Is there further discussion? All in favor of the  
10. adoption of Amendment No. 2, signify by saying aye. Contrary  
11. nay. The motion is carried. Amendment No. 2 is adopted.  
12. Senator Fawell.

13. SENATOR FAWELL:

14. Amendment No. 3 is an Amendment that pertains to an  
15. action which the insured may take against the insurance  
16. company in the event that there is delay in making the pay-  
17. ments in the mandated coverages and it simply adds an 8%  
18. interest compensation which is given to the insured in the  
19. event he should have to bring suit against the insurance  
20. company for their late payments. I move the adoption of  
21. Amendment No. 3.

22. PRESIDENT:

23. Is there further discussion? Senator Fawell has moved  
24. the adoption of Amendment No. 3. All in favor signify by  
25. saying aye. Contrary nay. Motion carries. Amendment No. 3  
26. is adopted. Senator Fawell.

27. SENATOR FAWELL:

28. Amendment No. 4 has been requested by Pete Pappas the  
29. Administrative Consultant to the Office of Secretary of State  
30. and merely corrects an omission in...on page 5, line 23,
