29. I rise in support of this bill. I didn't support it
30. last time when they put it on the books. I think it ought
31. to be repealed. I thought it was always unconstitutional
32. and I still think so. I think it is an excellent bill and
33. I'm going to support it.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

2. Any further discussion? Senator Fawell.

3. SENATOR FAWELL:

4. Well, I...if I understand this correctly and you have
5. to stand on your head to read any bills out of the billbook,
6. this legislation was sponsored by the Chicago Crime Commission.
7. And I think...I felt at the time and still feel, that the use
8. of discovery in criminal cases is a step in the right direction.
9. I think that the Supreme Court will very shortly promulgate
10. rather extensive rules in regard to discovery on both sides
11. insofar as the criminal trial is concerned. But what this
12. law now states is that if the defense is going to have an
13. alibi as a defense in a criminal action that they don't have
14. the right to spring a surprise at the trial. Suddenly to
15. bring out that on the date of the occurrence the defendant
16. allegedly was in some other place. I think in all fairness
17. the prosecution, if...if this is a good defense, the pro-
18. secution ought to have time to look into the matter. Not
19. at the time of trial have to then ask for a continuance
20. so as to check out the alibi witnesses and things of this
21. sort. The...the day when trials are just encounters between
22. two attorneys where they try to fool and trick each other, I
23. think is gone. Now, I...I will agree this gives a bit more
24. weight to the prosecution, other steps that we are taking are...
25. are giving a great deal of help to the defense and certainly
26. his basic constitutional rights are tremendously weighted and
27. rightfully so on behalf of defense. But I see nothing wrong
28. with...with a defendant who is going to utilize an alibi as
29. his defense, having to give a notice and at least giving
30. the prosecution some opportunity to be able to be ready for
31. that type of a defense and to be able to offer counter witnesses
32. and investigate and determine. It may be that he's
33. got a solid alibi then the case can be dismissed. A lot

1. time and expense can be saved. I...I don't believe that
2. there is a real solid basis for removing what the Crime
3. Commission and many others have fought quite some time to
4. have put in. And just in a couple of years we now quietly
5. remove it from the books, I can't believe that this is a
6. rational step. I rise in opposition to the proposed legislation.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

8. Senator Sours.

9. SENATOR SOURS:

10. Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, when
11. this law presently on the books was brought into Springfield,
12. it seems to me Judge Lew Agrippa was in the State's Attorneys
13. Department then. I didn't like the law then and I think it
14. ought to be repealed. After all, Mr. President, Senators,
15. the ordinary State's Attorneys Office is equipped with
16. assistants is also equipped with the Offices of the Sheriff
17. and all of his deputies. Is also equipped with the Offices
18. of the City Police and just about every law enforcement officer
19. you can get assisting in the trial and prosecution and hoped
20. for conviction. Now, to have a defendant disclose matters of
21. alibi as Senator Partee may have suggested to me has always
22. seemed to be unconstitutional because it infringed upon his
23. rights. Certainly, if he has a right to remain mute, if he
24. has a right not even to present any testimony, he should not be
25. obligated to mention any alibi. So far as I'm concerned this
26. is good legislation, the repealer is a good repealer.

PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

1. Senator Glass.

2. SENATOR GLASS:

3. Thank you, Mr. President, Senators. SB 159, would
4. provide that Board of Directors of a corporation would
5. no longer be limited with regard to creation of a sinking
6. fund among different series of stock of the same class.
7. This is language that has been in our business corporation
8. Act, it has been removed from the corporate legislation of
9. all other States but two and has proved to be a...a difficult
10. provision to work with as far as market ability of stock.
11. It is confusing language and this amendment would...would re-
12. move the language with regard to the requirement of a sink-
13. ing fund...creation in respect of any new series of stock
14. unless a similar provision for such a fund at least as
15. beneficial...was created for all other classes of stock.
16. It passed through Executive Committee without dissenting
17. votes, I would request a favorable roll call.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

19. Any further discussion? The question is shall

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

8. Senator Fawell.

9. SENATOR FAWELL:

10. ...Mr. President, I...I believe there's one amendment
11. on this bill at the present time. I would like to have
12. unanimous consent to take this bill back to the order of
13. 2nd reading and to then Table Amendment #1 and then also
14. move for the adoption of the amendment, an amendment which
15. is on the Secretary's desk.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

17. Is there leave to bring SB 173 back to 2nd reading?

18. Leave is granted.

19. SENATOR FAWELL:

20. Now, having voted on the prevailing side then I would
21. move for reconsideration by...of the vote by which Amendment
22. #1 was adopted.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

24. Senator...Senator Fawell moves to reconsider the
25. vote by which Amendment #1 was adopted. All those in favor
26. signify by saying aye. Opposed? Amendment #1 is Tabled or
27. the vote is reconsidered, I'm sorry.

28. SENATOR FAWELL:

29. Now I believe I would move to Table Amendment #1.

30. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

31. Senator Fawell now moves to Table Amendment #1. All
32. those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed? Amendment
33. #1 is now Tabled.

1. SENATOR FAWELL: .

2. And at this time, Mr. President, then I would move the
3. adoption of Amendment No. 2 which is the same as Amendment
4. No. 1. The only difference is that we're utilizing a
5. different Section of the Revenue Act to accomplish exactly
6. the same as the bill in its previous form accomplished.

7. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

8. Senator Fawell moves the adoption of Amendment No. 2.
9. All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed?
10. Amendment No. 2 is adopted. Any further amendments?
11. 3rd reading. SB 187, Senator Fawell.

12. SECRETARY:

13. SB 187.

14. (Secretary reads title of bill)

15. 3rd reading of the bill.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

17. Senator Fawell.

18. SENATOR FAWELL:

19. ...Mr. President, members of the Senate, SB 187 is
20. a very important bill, the no-fault bill proposed by the
21. Illinois State Bar Association. President William Harris
22. is not on the Floor, I am told that he is ill and he has
23. made a personal request to me to hold this bill until he
24. is able to come on the Floor. And with the permission
25. of the Chair and the Body if I could have an understanding
26. that when Senator Harris back on the Floor that we
27. might revert back to this bill. I would appreciate that.
28. There are many people who have asked that I proceed with
29. this, I do desire to proceed with it but out of...cer-
30. tainly out of respect to Senator Harris' request that we
31. delay the matter until he is able to be on the Floor, I...
32. I would make this request to the Body.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

2. Request to hold...187, we'll take that out of the
3. record and Senator Fawell will get together with
4. Senator Harris. Senator Glass, SB 197. We'll have to
5. come back to that Senator, we don't have that...back to
6. it in a few minutes. SB 200, Senator Mitchler. SB 205,
7. Senator Sours? SB 210, Senator Bell.

8. SECRETARY:

9. SB 210.

10. (Secretary reads title of bill).

11. 3rd reading of the bill.

12. SENATOR BELL:

13. Mr. President, fellow Senators, SB 210 seeks to
14. address itself to a problem that has come up during the
15. past year in the junior college system. As you probably
16. all realize junior colleges are refunded at the rate of
17. sixteen dollars and fifty cents per credit hour for
18. practically, well to my knowledge almost every course that's
19. being taught there by the State of Illinois. Somehow or
20. other, physical education was neglected from the funding
21. in the State and all that SB 210 seeks to do is redress
22. itself to this particular problem. This bill has been
23. amended and came out of the Senate Education Committee
24. with a unanimous consent. And I would request a favorable
25. roll call.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

27. Senator Bruce.

28. SENATOR BRUCE:

29. Yes...Yes, Mr. President, I rise in opposition to this
30. bill. The junior colleges in my district are presently
31. receiving sixteen dollars and fifty cents per fulltime
32. equivalent student. Physical education is a very expensive
33. program. -I don't know whether it should be or should not be

1. in their curriculum. It is not presently, there is
2. nothing in this bill that says it will be funded. We
3. are fighting this year to get seventeen dollars and
4. fifty cents per fulltime equivalent student. That is
5. not even going to keep up with their costs as they've
6. risen...every junior college district in the State. Now,
7. if there should be physical education courses offered
8. in those junior colleges, the proper approach is to go
9. to the Illinois Junior College Board, go to the Board of
10. Higher Education and then they can agree...they can submit
11. a proposal, say what kind of courses should be offered
12. and then fund those programs. I would just tell you
13. that that procedure has not been followed. This bill
14. will bankrupt my four junior colleges. It is an ex-
15. pensive procedure and the money is not in the budget.
16. I'm handling the junior college appropriation, we're
17. fighting for an additional two million dollars just to
18. keep the heads above water. Junior colleges are just
19. like our public schools they lost revenue through the
20. loss of personal property tax and to add this on in this
21. year is...is very irresponsible I'm afraid.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

23. Senator Wooten.

24. SENATOR WOOTEN:

25. Yes, Mr. President and colleagues I also rise in
26. opposition to this bill for the principal reason that our
27. junior colleges are, particularly in our urban areas, are
28. undergoing some changes...they are trying to adapt to meet
29. needs and careers. Many people come to these junior colleges
30. certainly as a case in my district to take only one or two
31. courses. The physical ed program is as Senator Bruce indicated
32. an enormously expensive one if you get into the whole panoply
33. of phys ed courses that are open from archery down to wrestling.

1. It requires the construction and maintenance of field
2. houses, gymnasias, all kinds of equipment. And I think
3. that students today are taking a more practical approach
4. particularly at the junior college level, they're going
5. in for courses they need, courses that they want, pursuant
6. to particular career and self development of goals. And
7. I think to mandate something like this would put a burden
8. on our junior colleges that they ought not be saddled
9. with at this point and time. Thank you.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

11. Senator Glass.

12. SENATOR GLASS:

13. Mr. President and Senators I notice in Senator Wooten's
14. discussion of this bill he mentioned sports from archery
15. down to wrestling and I would suggest to Senator Wooten that
16. I...I'm sure that he didn't mean to put them in that order
17. and that he was speaking of them alphabetically only. But
18. I would also point out to him as well as Senator Bruce that
19. this isn't going to cost anything unless the junior colleges
20. want it because if I understand the amendment we put on the
21. bill it made this optional with the junior colleges themselves
22. and that...that was what persuaded the Committee to support
23. it and I think that Senator Fawell will concur in that if I...
24. if I'm wrong I'd like to be corrected.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

26. Senator Buzbee.

27. SENATOR BUZBEE:

28. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate, I rise in
29. support of this bill. We are constantly being inundated on
30. television and so forth about the youth of the country. We're
31. losing our...our physical fitness and we're all...always being
32. asked to support the President's Council on physical fitness.
33. A very few years ago, about twelve years ago or less there

1. was a ...a big drive afoot in this country to get people
2. in better shape and I think we're going the wrong direction
3. here if we're not requiring...not letting the junior colleges
4. at least have the option of saying yes we are going to
5. offer physical education courses and they will be required
6. in our college. I think the Board of Education made a very
7. unwise decision when they deleted this requirement. And I
8. think the junior college should be given the right if they
9. decide they want to have that program, they should have it.
10. We are constantly seeing...we know in this country that obesity
11. is becoming a problem. I...I think I can talk on that sub-
12. ject pretty well and we see more and more heart attacks,
13. more problems of this sort. I think that the junior colleges
14. certainly if they want to have the right to offer these
15. courses that they should have that right.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

17. Senator Fawell.

18. SENATOR FAWELL:

19. Actually what I had in mind has been said. This...
20. there's no mandate here I think that is the important point.
21. There was quite a lot of work done in Committee in order to
22. make it clear that this was a discretionary move on the part
23. of junior college districts. And many of us have received a
24. number of letters from various junior college districts
25. that do very much want the privilege of having physical
26. education credit courses. So, no one has to do this unless
27. they wish to do so and I think that is the important point
28. to stress.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SEANTOR MOHR):

30. Senator Saperstein.

31. SENATOR SAPERSTEIN:

32. Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate,
33. no junior college has physical ed, we supported it with

1. the amendment making it optional by each junior college.

2. I urge your support.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER. (SENATOR MOHR):

4. Senator Knuppel.

5. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

6. All I can say is, boy, with all these physical culturists

7. we ought to beat the hell out of the House in that ball game

8. this year.

9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

10. Any further discussion? Senator Bruce.

11. SENATOR BRUCE:

12. I would point out the difficulty with the voluntary
13. program. In the capital expenditures portion of the
14. junior college appropriation this year some 97 million
15. dollars for capital improvement. It has been the judgement
16. of both the Junior College Board and the Board of Higher
17. Education since 1969 not to approve capital projects that
18. have a secondary non-educational function. That means that
19. all the Junior College districts mainly outside the City of
20. Chicago do not have facilities to offer...to offer physical
21. education. Now when you say that they may...what you're
22. saying is that those junior colleges that have the facilities
23. can offer it and receive reimbursement. That means to the
24. Junior Colleges that don't have the money, for example,
25. Lincoln Land here in Springfield, they're not in the projects
26. for Class 2 type buildings. They'll never be on the...
27. the way...the capital project is now funded, they'll never
28. get a gymnasium. They'll never be able to offer it. There's
29. only so many dollars, it's a good course, there's only so
30. many dollars and what you're saying to some Junior Colleges
31. who got in before 1969 if you've got the facilities you can
32. get the money. If you came in after that, if you don't have the
33. facilities you won't get the money. And it's just to my

1. junior colleges in Shawnee, Southeastern, all the ones
2. south of Route 50, none of them have the facilities.
3. It's just a question of taking money from them and giving
4. it somewhere else. It's been a policy decision of the
5. Board of Higher Education, the Illinois Junior College
6. Board, that's not the way we ought to spend the money.
7. You want to spend the money then I think you ought to say
8. let's start a special appropriation saying that if you
9. offer junior college and physical education you get
10. additional money. But don't eat into the seventeen-fifty,
11. we're having enough time running the programs now and to
12. divide that again...we're having difficulty this year
13. gentlemen, we're coming in to prorate that money not so
14. everyone gets a lesser amount, I just don't think it
15. makes good sense. It's a great program, the money's
16. not there.

17. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

18. Senator Romano. Senator Romano moves the previous
19. question. Not debatable. We'll have Senator Bell close
20. the debate.

21. SENATOR BEEL:

22. ...Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Buzbee I...
23. I think your considerations are certainly cogent to the
24. question. However, I want to..at the possibility of being
25. redundant, emphasize the fact that this is permissive legis-
26. lation only. That it doesn't require that a Junior College
27. district do this. That it is in fact up to that particular
28. Junior College district. Secondly that the way the provisions
29. are now that it is in fact as it currently exists in this
30. State discriminatory to junior colleges wanting to have
31. State aid funded to physical education. And Ladies and
32. Gentlemen I might draw your attention back to the occurrences
33. of the previous month or so when we had our returning...

1. prisoners of war that came back from being incarcerated
2. in prisons in North and South Vietnam. Some of the
3. biggest testimony that was made by these prisoners of
4. war that allowed them to get through the situation that
5. they had to endure was the very fact that they self-imposed
6. on themselves a very rigorous regime of physical education.
7. I think that Senator Buzbee's comments in reference to this
8. are certainly excellent and I might point out to you that
9. he's a colleague of mine in the Marine Corps Reserve. I
10. happen to be in the Army Reserve. And...Good going Senator
11. Buzbee. I ask for a favorable roll call.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

13. For what purpose does Senator Newhouse arise?

14. SENATOR NEWHOUSE:

15. ...Mr. President, I...I...I want to vote on this
16. bill at the same time I'd like to ask a point of personal
17. privilege because debate has dragged out. There's a group
18. of my students behind me from Coles School in Chicago
19. and before they leave I would like to have them recognized
20. by the Senate.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

22. The question is, shall SB 210 pass? And on that
23. question the Secretary will call the roll.

24. SECRETARY:

25. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
26. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,
27. Dougherty, Fawell, Glass, Graham, Harber Hall, Kenneth
28. Hall, Hynes,

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

30. Senator Hynes.

31. SENATOR HYNES:

32. Mr. President, members of the Senate, I rise in support
33. of this bill by way of explaining my vote. We heard considerable

1. testimony in the Education Committee and I opposed the
2. bill in its original form when it mandated or required
3. the junior colleges to have a program in physical education,
4. because I did think in that situation that the cost factors
5. were unreasonable in light of our present circumstances. The
6. bill as amended simply permits a junior college district
7. in its discretion to have physical education and then says
8. that if the district so chooses to have physical education
9. the State will treat that as a reimbursable course. I
10. think this is a desirable piece of legislation. On the
11. point that was raised about facilities one of the witnesses,
12. I think, in answer to that very question in the Committee a-
13. bout the availability of facilities or whether this would
14. cause a rush in to building new gymnasiums and so on, pointed
15. out that many districts presently have physical education
16. programs without having elaborate facilities. And what
17. they do is to make use of the facilities of park districts
18. in the area...elementary and secondary schools to engage
19. in other programs that do not require elaborate physical
20. structures and there are many districts in the State
21. presently doing this. So I think the bill is desirable
22. it is not going to result in any dramatic cost increase or
23. reallocation of funds and I vote aye.

24. SECRETARY:

25. Johns, Keegan, Knuepfer, Knuppel, Kosinski, Latherow,
26. McBroom, McCarthy, Merritt, Mitchler, Howard Mohr, Don
27. Moore, Netsch, Newhouse, Nimrod, Nudelman, Ozinga, Palmer,
28. Partee, Regner, Rock, Roe, Romano, Saperstein, Savickas,
29. Schaffer, Scholl, Shapiro, Smith, Sommer, Soper, Sours,
30. Swinarski, Vadalabene, Walker, Weaver, Welsh, Wooten,
31. Mr. President.

32. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

33. Latherow, aye. Johns, no. Carroll, aye. ...

1. question, the yeas 31. The nays are 4. SB 210
2. having received the constitutional majority is declared
3. passed. Senator Fawell, we'll go back to your bill now...
4. hold it just one moment, I rise on a point of personal
5. privilege. ...these students and their sponsors from
6. Melrose Park, I especially like Senator Romano and Senator
7. Vadalabene to meet and greet the students from the 8th
8. grade from Melrose Park School and the gallery...the
9. south gallery. The director of that tour. I believe is
10. my good friend Andy Scatina, I'm sorry I can't introduce
11. everybody else. Go back to Senator Fawell, SB 173.
12. We don't have that one back yet Senator, we'll have to
13. hold that. SB 200, Senator Mitchler.

15. SB 200.

16. (Secretary reads title of bill).

17. 3rd reading of the bill.

18. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

19. Senator Mitchler.

20. SENATOR MITCHLER:

21. ...Mr. President, members of the Senate; SB 200
22. is an appropriation for a railroad overpass in North
23. Farnsworth Avenue in the Burlington Northern Railroad
24. in Aurora. This bill has been reviewed by the Senate
25. Appropriations Committee and I've spoken to several
26. to both sides of the aisle here and I would appreciate
27. a favorable roll call.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

29. Any further discussion? On that...Senator Rock.

30. SENATOR ROCK:

31. Yes, Mr. President, members of the Senate, I merely
32. wish to point out this is not in the Budget Message as
33. it was delivered to us.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR MOHR):

2. The question is, shall SB 200 pass? And on that
3. question the Secretary will call the roll.

3. Senate Resolution...
4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
5. Senator Fawell.
6. SENATOR FAWELL:
7. Will ask for all Senators be shown...this is in regard
8. to Velma Crain who is retiring and all Senators who want
9. to be shown, I think...
10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
11. Leave of the Body for all Senators to be shown as
12. co-sponsors, leave has been given, will be so shown.
13. And I have informed the parliamentarian, Senator Glass
14. and Senator Fawell, that you two will be up first to bat
15. tomorrow morning on 3rd reading. Further Resolutions?
16. SECRETARY:
17. Senate Resolution 147 by Senators Scholl, Nimrod,
18. Mohr...Howard Mohr, Newhouse, Netsch, Regner, Shapiro,
19. Clarke, Sours, Ozinga, Don Moore, Berning, Merritt, Davidson,
20. McBroom, Weaver, Knuepfer, Bell, Bartulis, Schaffer, Roe,
21. Glass, Fawell, Graham, Harber Hall, Latherow and Mitchler.
22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
23. Senator Scholl.
24. SENATOR SCHOLL:
25. Mr. President, this...what this Resolution does, it
26. congratulates the Chicago Tribune. This past week they
27. WON THE Pulitzer Prize for general local reporting...
28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
29. Congratulatory...
30. SENATOR SCHOLL:
31. What they actually did was to disclose the corrupt
32. and scandal ridden process which we've had in Chicago and
33. I ask for the suspension of the rules for the immediate

consideration of this Resolution.

1. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

2. Senator Scholl moves for the suspension of the rules
3. for the immediate consideration and all those who wish to
4. be on the Resolution are invited to be. All in favor
5. signify by saying aye...

6. SENATOR SCHOLL:

7. ...Accept. Will accept anyone.

8. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

9. Opposed? The rules are suspended. All in favor of
10. the adoption of the Resolution will signify by saying aye.
11. Opposed? The ayes have it, the Resolution is adopted.

12. SECRETARY:

13. Senate Resolution 148 by Senators Scholl, Daley,
14. Mitchler, Swinarski, Romano, Nudelman, Howard Mohr, Ozinga
15. and Glass. And it's congratulatory.

16. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

17. ...Another Resolution? Move for the suspension of the
18. rules and the immediate adoption...congratulatory. Want
19. the other Senators to be on the Resolution with you, Senator?
20. Senator Scholl. Not too long Senator, we're trying to clean up
21. the desk.

22. SENATOR SCHOLL:

23. This Resolution congratulates and gives good wishes
24. to James Jardine for forty-two years of outstanding service to
25. the City of Chicago.

26. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

27. And you want others Senators to join you in the sponsor-
28. ship of that Resolution?

29. SENATOR SCHOLL:

30. That is right.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

32. You are invited. All in favor of...all Senators will
33. be so shown. All in favor of the immediate adoption of the

1. Resolution will signify by saying aye. The ayes have it,
2. the Resolution is adopted. All except Senator Knuppel
3. who didn't want to be. Senator Rock, for what purpose
4. do you arise, Sir?

5. SENATOR ROCK:

6. I rise, Mr. President, for the purpose of making...having
7. voted on the prevailing side, I move to consider the vote by
8. which Senate Resolution...what was the number of that one,
9. that gem that commended the Tribune?

10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

11. We'll give you the number. What did you call it, Sir?

12. SENATOR ROCK:

13. I want to move to reconsider the vote by which that
14. Resolution was adopted. And I would strenuously oppose this
15. and similar future Resolutions. I think that in the event
16. that a member of the Senate has a Resolution that is in any
17. way controversial it should be so indicated and sent to the
18. proper Committee. This is in my judgement controversial.

19. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

20. I asked for a unanimous consent and if someone would
21. have raised an objection...if you vote on the...

22. SENATOR ROCK:

23. Well. The problem is Mr. Chairman...

24. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

25. I think I realize what the problem is.

26. SENATOR ROCK:

27. Well, copies were not distributed and in the ordinary
28. course of business Congratulatory Resolutions are passed as
29. a matter of course which is right. But when one of these
30. comes along that is not, in fact...congratulatory but con-
31. tains some element of controversy I think it should be in-
32. dicated. And the very least that should happen is...

33. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

1. Your motion is to reconsider, Senator Rock?

2. SENATOR ROCK:

3. Yes, Sir.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

5. Moves to reconsider the vote by which Resolution
6. commending the Tribune was adopted. All in favor will
7. signify by saying aye. Opposed? A roll call has been
8. requested. Secretary will call the roll. It takes a
9. majority of those voting. Senator Partee. Too bad we
10. have to end up the day in an argument over a Resolution.
11. Senator Partee.

12. SENATOR PARTEE:

13. Just before the vote is taken I want to make it clear
14. that opposition to this Resolution does not mean opposition
15. to the fact of congratulation of the Chicago Tribune for
16. having won the prize. The opposition comes because of some
17. very unnecessary language, very degrading kind of language,
18. and references to obliquely, of course, some people who have
19. given years of their lives and service and devotion to the
20. process of government in the City of Chicago. If the
21. Resolution had simply congratulated the Chicago Tribune, it
22. would have met with a unanimous vote on this side of the
23. aisle certainly. But the Resolution does more than that and
24. contains some language that is very, to put it mildly, offen-
25. sive. Now let me just tell you what I'm talking about., "That
26. we individually and as a Body highly commend each of them for
27. their great public service in diagnosing and making treatment
28. of the Chicago vote-fraud cancer possible, a politically mortal
29. affliction which has drained the life blood from the democratic
30. process in the City of Chicago for many years." That of
31. course is certainly a controversial phrase. It is a
32. phrase which has no business or place in this Resolution.
33. You can certainly congratulate the Chicago Tribune and

1. I would join you. But to cuffle it with this kind of
2. distasteful language is what causes the opposition.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

4. On the motion to reconsider the vote by which
5. the Resolution was adopted. The Secretary will call
6. the roll. In favor of Senator Rock's motion will vote
7. aye. Those opposed will vote no.

8. SECRETARY:

9. Bartulis, Bell, Berning, Bruce, Buzbee, Carroll,
10. Chew, Clarke, Conolly, Course, Daley, Davidson, Donnewald,
11. Dougherty, Fawell, Glass, Graham, Harber Hall, Kenneth
12. Hall, Hynes, Johns, Keegan, Knuepfer, Knuppel...

13. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

14. Senator Knuppel. For what purpose does the
15. Senator from Virginia arise?

16. SENATOR KNUPPEL:

17. ...I'm sure that I'm recorded "no" on this because
18. I'm recorded "no" on all of these. But this illustrates
19. the waste of time, the disgust with which the public of
20. the State of Illinois has to hold us in, for playing these
21. little fun and game tricks with Resolutions, even wasting
22. our time with them. This is ridiculous. First of all
23. the Chicago Tribune, I don't think they rate a Pulitzer
24. Prize on anything, you know how I feel about them. Ex-
25. cept they have given me a lot of nice publicity and the
26. more they publicize me the better I like it because my
27. people in Downstate Illinois don't like to be told what
28. to do by either the Chicago Tribune or any other Chicago
29. Newspaper. We like to think for ourselves and I don't
30. think this fun and games is doing my people in my district
31. one bit of good and I wish that some of these people would
32. wake up when they're calling these things and we cut it out
33. entirely and tend to business. I voted right in the first

1. place but I'll vote to reconsider for my friends over here.
2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
3. You made your speech and you were out of order.
4. SENATOR KNUPPEL:
5. I vote aye.
6. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
7. You voted no on the..you voted aye and the..
8. I know, you were out of order on your speech, the Secretary
9. will continue the roll.
10. SECRETARY:
11. Kosinski, Latherow, McBroom, McCarthy, Merritt,
12. Mitchler, Howard Mohr, Don Moore, Netsch, Newhouse,
13. Nimrod, Nudelman, Ozinga, Palmer, Partee, Regner, Rock,
14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
15. Senator Rock.
16. SENATOR ROCK:
17. Yes, Mr. President, explaining my vote which is aye.
18. I would just like to point out that perhaps we ought to
19. adopt a new policy. In the event somebody has a Congratulatory
20. Resolution it should pro forma be sent to the Executive
21. Committee where we could screen thse. I do not think
22. this is very funny and from now on when unanimous consent
23. is asked for by this gentleman or some others you can be
24. sure it will not be had. I vote aye.
25. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):
26. The Chair agrees with Senator Rock that leadership...
27. must arrive at a better policy for adopting and considering
28. Resolutions. I think we should address ourselves to that
29. the first part of the week. We...we must do something to
30. expedite this time consuming procedure. And you voted aye
1. on your own motion.
2. SECRETARY:
3.

1. Roe, Romano, Saperstein, Savickas, Schaffer, Scholl,

2. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

3. Senator Scholl.

4. SENATOR SCHOLL:

5. I'm a little saddened that my friend on the other
6. side of the aisle are concerned with this resolution. I
7. pointed out when...when I addressed the Senate that this
8. resolution was congratulating the Chicago Tribune for
9. exposing the corrupt scandal ridden election process. I
10. pointed that out and everybody voted for it.

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

12. I want...I want to explain to Senator Scholl that
13. you are also out of order as was Senator Knuppel. This
14. motion having voted on the prevailing side and you'll
15. have an opportunity.

16. SENATOR SCHOLL:

17. I vote no.

18. SECRETARY:

19. Shapiro, Smith, Sommer, Soper, Sours, Swinarski,
20. Vadalabene, Walker, Weaver, Welsh, Wooten, Mr. President.

21. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

22. ...On this motion the yeas are 24. The nays are 25.
23. The motion to reconsider by Senator Rock therefore failed.
24. Senator Rock.

25. SENATOR ROCK:

26. I wish verification of that roll call, Senator.

27. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

28. ...Fellas, do we have to go through this again?

29. SENATOR ROCK:

30. Well, I'm sorry...yes we do.

31. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

32. The roll call of verification has been requested
33. and we will verify the roll on those voting on the affirmative

1. or the negative. The affirmative vote.

2. SENATOR ROCK:

3. The negative, Sir.

4. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

5. The negative votes.

6. SECRETARY:

7. The following voted in the negative: Bartulis,
8. Bell, Berning, Clarke, Davidson, Fawell, Glass, Graham,
9. Knuepfer, Latherow, McBroom, Merritt, Mitchler, Howard
10. Mohr, Don Moore, Nimrod, Ozinga, Regner, Roe, Schaffer,
11. Scholl, Shapiro, Sommer, Sours, Weaver.

12. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

13. The roll call has been verified. Senator Rock.

14. SENATOR ROCK:

15. I wish verification of the affirmative vote,
16. Mr. President.

17. SECRETARY:

18. The following voted in the affirmative: Bruce,
19. Buzbee, Carroll, Chew, Course, Daley, Donnewald, Dougherty,
20. Kenneth Hall, Hynes, Johns, Knuppel, Kosinski, Nudelman,
21. Palmer, Partee, Rock, Romano, Saperstein, Savickas, Smith,
22. Swinarski, Vadalabene.

23. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

24. After verification the roll is announced is therefore
25. sustained and the motion now is for the next resolution.

26. SECRETARY:

27. Senate Resolution 149 by Senator Mitchler and it's
28. congratulatory.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

30. I think the motion having...Senator Rock's motion
31. having failed the resolution is still adopted and that's
32. the next resolution, please. Senator Vadalabene are all
33. of your schools here today? For what purpose do you arise?

1. SENATOR VADALABENE:

2. On a point of personal privilege Mr. President.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

4. State your point, Senator.

5. SENATOR VADALABENE:

6. Right directly behind me in the gallery is a group
7. of students from St. Mary's School at Alton, Illinois, who
8. are being accompanied by Sister Shirley and Mrs. Blaine.
9. I wish them to stand and be recognized.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

11. Stand and be recognized by the Senate. I'd like
12. to state...what do we have now? I'd like...resolution.

13. SECRETARY:

14. Senate Resolution 149 by Senator Mitchler. Congratulatory.

15. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

16. Senator Rock, Senator Mitchler moves for leave for
17. immediate consideration... suspend the rules for immediate
18. consideration of the resolution. Does he have leave?
19. Do we have an objection?

20. SENATOR ROCK:

21. No, I...I certainly don't want...

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. Leave is granted.

24. SENATOR ROCK:

25. I understand the process very well, I wish some of
26. the...members on the other side understood it as well as
27. some of us do. I...I will not object, I'm perfectly within
28. my rights to object.

29. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

30. You are and I would like to have...we will now move
31. for the adoption of the amendment and then the Chair would
32. like to make a statement in that regard. All in favor of
33. the adoption signify by saying aye. Opposed? The resolution

1. is adopted. Now Senator Partee, Senator Rock...Senator
2. Partee, I'm going to in behalf of the President of the
3. Senate and the leadership on both sides if we might have
4. some order, please. I'm going to suggest that from now on
5. when there is a Congratulatory Resolution to be offered
6. by any member that the leadership on both sides of the
7. aisle will have a copy of that Resolution sufficiently
8. enough in advance so that we don't get ourselves in this
9. embarrassing position. I'm going to request that our
10. members if they are listening submit your copies of a
11. Resolution to leadership on both sides and we can solve
12. this problem. Now, does there happen to be any announcements
13. to be made because we're going to have A Death Resolution
14. soon. And...and just in the event that you gentlemen are
15. wondering, ladies, what the schedule is tomorrow we have
16. Committee meetings scheduled for tomorrow and there will be
17. a Session at 12 o'clock noon. We will convene the Session
18. at 12 o'clock noonk the rest of the day outside of that,
19. will be devoted to Committee meetings. Announcements from
20. the Floor? Senator Merritt.

21. SENATOR MERRITT:

22. ...Mr. President, the current Calendar is somewhat
23. incorrect in it...shows Insurance and Financial Institutions
24. tomorrow only one bill to be heard in there. That is in-
25. correct. Tomorrow's Calendar will show that all bills
26. that weren't heard today in Committee will be heard tomorrow
27. 2:15, Room 212.

28. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

29. Senator Merritt's Committee meeting tomorrow at 2:15 in
30. Room 212, it's a very important Committee meeting. Those in-
31. terested in the subject matter of that Committee will please
32. take note. Senator Mitchler.

33. SENATOR MITCHLER:

1. ...Mr. President, members of the Senate, Industry
2. and Labor will meet in Room a-1 at 2:15 p.m. sharp
3. and we have three House Bills that have been assigned to
4. that Committee and we are going to, because we're working
5. on these Senate Bills, postpone House Bill 48, House Bill
6. 268, and House Bill 313. They will be heard the next time
7. the Labor and Industry Committee meet. But we will
8. consider the Senate Bill and take action on them.
9. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

10. ...You've heard the announcement by Senator Mitchler,
11. the Chairman of the Committee on Labor and Industry. Any
12. other Senator wish to make an announcement before we
13. proceed to the consideration of a Death Resolution?
14. Senator Hynes.

15. SENATOR HYNES:

16. Mr. President, I would ask for...unanimous consent
17. of the Body to be removed as the Senate sponsor of
18. House Bill 474 and to have Senator Knuepfer added as the
19. principal sponsor.

20. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

21. Senator Hynes asks leave of the Senate to be removed
22. as sponsor of SB 474...

23. SENATOR HYNES:

24. House Bill...House Bill 474.

25. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

26. House Bill 474 and in lieu thereof, if leave is granted,
27. Senator Knuepfer...which one...Knuepfer will be added as
28. a sponsor. All in favor will signify by saying aye. Leave
29. is granted and your request has been granted. Senator
30. Mitchler, we're trying to adjourn so let's get with it,

31. SENATOR MITCHLER:

32. Yes.. Mr...Mr. Chairman, I had put on my desk this
33. morning a report from the Spanish Speaking Peoples Study

1. Commission and in glancing through here I notice that Senator
2. Karl Berning is a member of that Commission. And I was over
3. talking to him. He has this bound with this plastic material
4. here that's going to be hard for me to get into my folder...

5. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

6. We'll take that up in Executive.

7. SENATOR MITCHLER:

8. ...it's not on recycled paper or has the proper holes
9. punched in this side. I'm going to take that up with
10. Senator Karl Berning...

11. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

12. We'll consider that in Executive. We will not consider
13. the...a suspension of the rules for an immediate consideration
14. of a Death Resolution and...Ladies and Gentlemen, this
15. Resolution directs itself to a gentleman, deceased, who has
16. been a longtime friend of many of us and I think he would be
17. attentive should you be in that unfortunate circumstance and
18. I ask that we do consider it in all solemnity. Death
19. Resolution to be read by the Secretary.

20. SECRETARY:

21. Senate Resolution 150 by Senator Bruce.

22. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

23. Senator Bruce moves for suspension of the rules for
24. the immediate consideration of this Resolution. All in
25. favor will signify by saying aye. All Senators, Senator
26. Bruce indicates he would like to have as sponsors and the
27. Secretary will read the resolution. Senator Bruce do you
28. have more? Is that what you said...

29. SENATOR BRUCE:

30. Mr. President, this Resolution is a Death Resolution
31. for Representative Ben Blades and I...I'm not going to request
32. that the Secretary read it. Ben was a personal friend of mine
33. and that Resolution doesn't really say what...what many of

1. us feel. He was a House Member for five terms and many
2. of the people who are in this Body served with him. We
3. happen to be on opposite sides of the political parties
4. but I counted him as a close personal friend and in many
5. instances I found that he was probably more helpful than
6. members on my side of the aisle. He was a true gentleman
7. as a Legislator and I know he will be missed. And I hope
8. that everyone will make an attempt to attend the funeral
9. which is Saturday at 2:00 p.m. in Fairfield. Thank you.

10. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

11. Senator Schaffer.

12. SENATOR SCHAFFER:

13. I request that the Resolution be read.

14. PRESIDING OFFICER (SENATOR GRAHAM):

15. I think the sponsor of the Resolution didn't indicate
16. that it would be read. He has control of his Resolution.
17. And he requested that it not be read. I think that we could
18. all say and I've served many long years with Representative
19. Blades, despite the fact that he may have...been on the
20. opposite side of the political fence from many of us,
21. he has traveled down the road that all of us are traveling
22. and ultimately we're all going to wind up on his side and
23. all those in favor of the adoption of this Death Resolution
24. will please rise. The resolution is adopted and the Senate
25. is adjourned until 12 o'clock tomorrow morning.
